Pierce Brooks For Lieut. Governor Opposes New Taxes



Pierce Brooks, Dallas business man, has opened his campaign for Lieutenant Governor with a declaration that he is opposed to any new taxes until the State's financial affairs are put on a sound and sensible business bass and waste and extravagance are eliminated from the operatons of the State government.

Brooks declared in his opening campaign that the State is facing the worst financial crisis in its

To establish the corner at D, measure 30 feet from B and 50 feet from A. For C. measure 40 feet from D and 30 feet from A. The diagonal from C to B should be 50 feet.
