Paving West 3rd Is Approved By Highway Dept.

Citizens living on West Main or Third Street, as well as citizens all over town, will be happy to know that West Main is to be curbed and paved curb to curb at an early date. The State Highway Department has approved the project and engineers will start their work immediately. This new street will be the same as Avenue D and East Main, 48 feet wide.

Wednesday night, July 5th, members of the City Council met briefly to approve the contract offered by the State Highway Department. The contract calls for the City to be responsible for installing curbing on the street, the Highway Department to pave curb to curb and maintain the street.

Alvin Hill has been working on the project for some time. Some of the curbing money is already on deposit at the bank. Property owners along the street are to pay for the curbing-just \$1.00 per front foot. That \$1.00 per foot will barely take care of the expense of laying the curbing, which will be done by City employees.

Property owners along West Main are elated over the fact. they can have a new 48 foot paved street for only \$1.00 per running foot cost to them. The payment may be made at the

As Ramsey completed another campaign swing in his whirlwind tour of the state, he reported that although the news from the Korean battlefields had overshadowed interest in politics, he was still encouraged by the pledges of support he was receiving across the state.

His most recent campaign tour carried Ramsey through a large portion of East Texas, winding up at his home town, San Augustine, where the candidate took time out to catch up on chores around his 200 acre farm. Ramsey sprayed his cattle which were bothered by flies in the July heat, and made a tour of pasture lands where the vetch had been knee high before his return home. Dallis grass had completely halted erosion in one section of the pasture.






