N. M. was in Jayton last Saturday to test the strength of the television signal coming from channels 11 and 13 in Lubbocv.

Click is a Des Moines rancher and is a brother in law to Mrs. Pauline Hall Carmichael sister of Floyd Hall of Jayton. He became interested in television re-transmitters because ne was unfortunate enough to live 150 air miles from the rearest TV station which is in Amarillo, so he along with the rest of the community chipped in and bought a retransmitter and Click installed it. They now enjoy almost perfect re-

Floyd Hall happened to be talking to Click later when the subject came up. He said that if the people of Jayton wanted him to he would come here and test the signal, and if it were would put us up a retransmitter and guarantee to get good picture for a minimum of 10 miles from Jayton, which is as the crow fles and not road mi-

He tested the signal and he says it is plenty strong and that he guarantees that if we don't get a good picture after the equipment is installed he will take it back and it will

not cost us anything. Now, here is an explanation of the proposed equipment, to be installed here if we want it. 
