## BAPTISTS OPENING JUBILEE REVIVAL

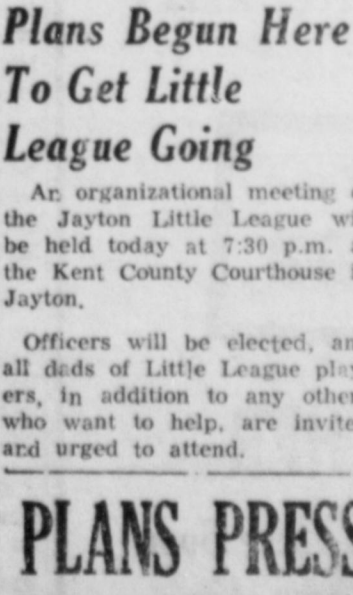
