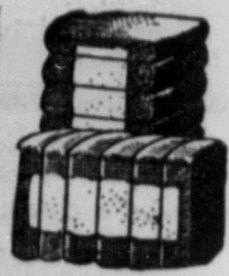

## CONSTRUCTION ON HIGHWAY NEAR CLAIREMONT FINISHED

Construction has been completed on a 5.6 mile section of U. S. Highway 389 in Kent County east of Claremont to the intersection of Texas State Highway 70.

Authorization for the construction of this project was made in 1960 under the 1961 62 Consolidated Highway Program.

Aug. 8 last year bids were taken and a contract was awarded to Younger Construction Co. of Midland. The contract for this project consisted of grading, widening structures, flexible base and two course asphalt surface treatment. The completed roadway section is 36 feet in width and consists of a 24 ft. two course asphalt surface section and 6 ft. paved shoulders. The intersections

of US 389 and State Highway 70 has been designated or channeling traffic safely and more efficiently, says Nelson Shave, senior resident engineer at Hamlin who was in charge of the project while it was under construction.

The total amount of work done by the contractor was \$231,864.00. The contractor began work Sept. 18 last year and completed the work in 116 workin days, Shave said.

### Good Management Is Important

Kent County farmers and ranchers have contributed over \$4500 to the screw worm control program, County Agent M. A. Geeslin said Thursday.

He said "Every livestock producer has a stake in this program and the success of the eradication program is to an extent dependent upon each producer practicing good live stock management."

"If you plan to ship livestock it would certainly help to inspect for any wounds, and treat and spray the animal before shipment. This would help reduce the spread of screw worms entering a clean area."

Underworld vice barons flaunt their disrespect for decency and maneuver to shield their activities behind a veneer of legal camouflage.

Words of praise for past performances would be hollow if we did not also renew our pledge to protect from all peril the sacred principle of government by law.

## SCS Program Is Popular Here

SCS District News Report  
Great Plains Conservation Program

The Great Plains Conservation program was put in operation about four years ago. Under the present law it will remain in effect until 1981.

Even though the program has been in effect for quite some time many farmers and ranchers are not aware of its benefits and advantages.

This program is designed to assist any farmer or rancher carry out all the conservation practices necessary to achieve a complete conservation plan. One main advantage to the Great Plains program is the money needed for applying

needed conservation practices is set aside when the contract is drawn up, signed and approved. This assures the farmer or rancher of having the necessary cost-share assistance available each year. This, too, means that conservation practices may be applied in a timely and orderly fashion according to a time schedule which the producer has outlined in his conservation plan.

The maximum amount that can be earned in a single contract is \$25,000.00. The minimum length of any contract is

three full calendar years. Some of the conservation practices on which cost-share is available, are brush control, livestock watering facilities, grass planting, terraces, water ways, dams for livestock water and cross fencing.

At the present time there are 29 active contracts in the Jayton work unit of the Duck Creek Soil Conservation District.

If you have not looked into the possibilities afforded under the Great Plains Conservation program then why not get

the full details on how it would apply to your conservation problems from the Soil Conservation Service personnel assisting the Duck Creek Soil Conservation District in Jayton.

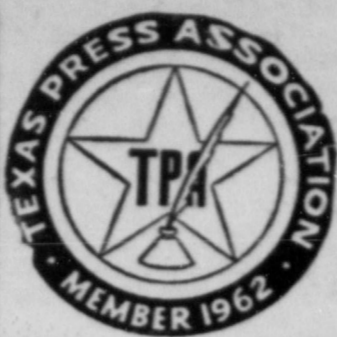
