FILLING: Sweetened sliced strawberries Sift flour, sugar, baking powder and salt into mixing bowl. Drop in shortening. Add milk and extracts; beat 2 minutes at low speed

In shortening. Add milk and extracts; beat 2 minutes at low speed on electric mixer (200 strokes by hand). Add egg and lemon rind; beat 1 minute at low speed on electric mixer (100 strokes by hand). Set paper baking cups into 2-1/2" muffin pans. Fill 2/2 full. Bake in a moderate oven (375°F) 15 to 20 minutes. Cool.

Combine cold milk and vanilla in deep 1 quart bowl. Add Lucky Whip Dessert Topping Mix. Blend, then beat at high speed on electric mixer or rotary beater until topping forms soft peaks.
