Nutrition is turning the

food you eat into parts of you. It is the vitamins, minerals, proteins, carbohydrates, and fats that all work together to make YOU. You are skin, muscles, and hair made up of millions of cells. Underneath these are bones holding you up, also made of cells. Food we eat is changed to nutrients to make strong cells and bodies, to give us good health. By eating a wide selection of foods everyday, you are reasonably cer-, tain of getting the essential nutrients needed to run your body. Each day we should eat foods from the four basic food groups: Meat, Fish, and Poultry; dark green and leafy vegetables; bread and cereals and milk.

February will be Vitamin C month. Vitamins are "helpers". They help your body make better use of other food nutrients as they help convert foods into energy and aid in the development of healthy body tissies. Each individual's personal need for vitamins will vary according to his physical condition. Those sick and injured, pregnant women, children, and those on a special diet will have special vitamin requirements. Teenagers and elderly persons are more likely to be short on vitamins than others.

Some vitamins can be stored in the body if more than is needed daily is eaten. These are fat soluble vitamins -- Vitamins A, D, E, and K. In cooking they dissolve in fat such as oleomargarine but not in water. Other vitamins cannot be stored and must be obtained daily. These water soluble vitamins are C and the B Vitamins. They dissolve in water during cooking and are lost when the water is

poured out. Vitamin C, also called ascorbic acid, is the vitamin in lemons and limes that cured and prevented scurvy in British sailors. Citrus fruits--oranges, grapefruit, lemons, limes, tangerinesare excellent sources of Vite min C. Other good sources include dark green leafy vegetables, strawberries, cantaloupes, broccoli, collards, green peppers, red cabbage, tomatoes and turnip greens.

4 County Accidents Checked By The Patrol

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated four accidents on rural highways in Kent County durthe month of December, according to Sergeant Frank Jircik, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area

These crashes resulted in one person killed, six persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$15,675.00.

What will the decade of the 1970's be traffic wise in Texas? Here are some facts that could give you an idea. There were 25,000 persons killed during the 1960's. IF the past and present trend continues the 1970's will be another record decade.

The Sergeant reminded all motor vehicle owners that still have their inspection stickers on the lower right-hand side of their windshields that April 15 is the deadline for having the new stickers placed on the lower left-hand side of their windshields. Only about 16 percent of the registered vehicles in this county has been inspected.

1970 Feed Grain Program

The 1970 feed grain program will be very similar to the 1969 program. The diversion payment rates will be based on 40% of the total price support rate whereas it was 45% in 1969.

Notices of yield and feed grain bases will be available in the near future. It appears that yields will be larger than they were in 1969. The signup period for Wheat, Feed Grain and Cotton will be the period starting February 2 and ending March 20th.

No advance payments will be made this year. Any questions concerning the operation of these programs should be directed to the local ASCS Office in Jayton.

Some Facts On Foods

Have you noticed the letters BHT and BHA listed as preservatives in some foods? The letters refer to butylated hydroxytoluene and butylated hydroxyanisole.

These chemicals allow you to buy fresh tasting foods. They are preservatives and antioxidants for fats and oils in the foods you buy. Neither is harmful to health.

A Company must prove to the Food and Drug Administration that a Chemical is safe for human use before they add it to any food, says Jimmie Kay Ullom, Extension foods and nutrition specialist.

About 15 years ago, manufacturers of BHT and BHA submitted to the FDA results of their experiments during which animals were fed substantial amounts of chemicals without any harmful effects.

As a result, FDA allowed its use in food. Food fats usually contain both BHA and BHT in equal amount.

West Texas Utilities Co. Employees Set Safety Record

A new all-time safety record was set on December 31 when the employees of West Texas Utilities Company completed the year without a lost-time accident.

During the twelve-month period WTU's 1040 employees worked a total of 2, 221, 674 man hours.

During its long history of providing electric service to

customers in West Texas, never before has such a record been achieved. Several times during the past 10 years the perfect record was almost reached. In 1960 only two

lost-time accidents were recorded. Three were charged to the Company's record in 1963; four in 1964; and only two in 1967. Since 1957 only 57 lost-time accidents have

been recorded in the 10-year period.

Last September the WTU employees received special recognition when they were presented the Safety Achieve-

ment Award by the Bureau of Safety. This came after they had worked more than 2,000-000 man-hours without a losttime accident. The last recorded was in October, 1968. The record now reads: fourteen months without a lost-time accident.






