Vitamin C, also called ascorbic acid is the vitamin in lemons and limes that cured and prevented scurvey in British sailors. Leadership and and nutrition has meant success or failure in ex plorations throughout history. Capt. James Cook World and conquer the Pacific Ocean, opening itto further explorations of Hawaii, New Zeala Australia and even Alosk
In the $1770^{\prime} \mathrm{s}$, seurvey was the seaman's most constant formidable enemy. Voyages of several weeks duration brought scurvey and death to mon sailors. Capt. Cook was able to sail and explore and map for 3 years without a single case of scurvey aboard his ship- a miracle in those times. A
good diet and foods high in Vitamin C prevented the disease considered unavoidable on voyages. Scurvey is a disease that affects bones and blood vessels and eventually causes death when not rreated. Capt. Cook was the first to sail for any extended length of time without a single case of curvey. British sailors came to be known as "limies" after the regular administration of lemon (called lime) juice was prescribed in the British navy in 1795 .

Vitamin C cannot be stored in the body and it helps hold body cells. It is needed because walls of blood vessels, helpo in healing of wound walls helps resist infection positle res wound adequate amount of vitamin C may be easy bruising, bleeding of gums, weakened blood vessels o

Foods high in vitamin $C$ should be eaten every day. These include citrus fruits, strawberries, cabbage, collard greens, turnips, broccoli, green peppers and tomatoes.

Today's recipe uses broccoli. Frozen vegetables may be oven-cooked if you are using your oven at moderate temperature for other food Partly defrost vegetables to separate the pieces. Spread the pieces in a greased pan with a cover Add saltand other seasonings as desired, and cov er the pan

Cook until just tender. Approximate time for most green vegetables at 350 degrees is 45 min utes. Cooking time will vary, however with size of pieces and how much they were thawed before cooking.

RICE BROCCOLI CASSEROLE

l cup rice
package broccoli
can cream of mushroom soup
I small jar of Cheez-Whiz
Saute onions and celery. Cook rice and broccoli separately. Mix the vegetables, add the soups and cheez-whiz. Place rice in a cass erole as a lining for dish. Pour vegetable mix türe over it and springle with paprika

Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes before serving. (This may be prepared a day or two ahead of time)
