Frankie Harrison In Special Navy **Nurse Corps School**

Two students at the Methodist Hospital School of Nursing have been selected by the United States Navy to participate in the Navy Nurse Corps Candidate Program. This program is designed to provide financial assistance to qualified student nurses during their final year at diploma schools of nursing. In addition to full pay in pay grade E-3 during their final year they receive all allowances which include

free medical and dental care. The selected students are Miss Betty Hale, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bob C. Hale of Crosbyton, and Miss Frankie Harrison, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Odell Harrison of Jayton. Miss Hale attended one year at West Texas State University prior to being admitted to Methodist and Miss Harrison took her first year at Wayland Baptist College in Plainview. Both firls are presently finishing their first year at Methodist and willstart their final year this summer.

Enlistment ceremonies were held at the U. S. Naval Reserve Unit in Lubbock Friday April 17th to officially admit the future nurses to the program. The oath of enlist ment was administered by the Navy Recruiter from Dallas, Texas Lieutenant Louise Currie.

After completion of nursing school the girls will be commissioned as Ensign, Nurse Corps, U. S. Navy prior to reporting to four weeks indoctrination at Newport, R. I. They will then serve two years active duty at one of the Navy hospitals in the U. S.







If there is any vitamin | likely to be missing in a day's meals, it will most likely be thiamine, B-1. It is distributed widely, but only sparingly in many foods.

This mine promotes growth; aids in changing starches and sugars to body energy, aids digestive processes; maintains appetite; and helps keep nervous system healthy. Loss of appetite and loss of energy are early signs of a deficiency.


