

By Roberta E. Stanaland Simply using a small ruler can help the shopper determine several important characteristics about

The knit's stability is important. Moderately stretchy and very stretchy knits require more care in construction, including scrupulous stay-stitching where the sewer doesn't want the seams to stretch. Stability can be determined by gripping the knit fabric and ruler in your left hand, four inches from the raw edge. Next, stretch the fabric toward the right and measure how much it stretches. If the stretch is no more than half an inch, the fabric is stable; up to 1 1/4 inches means it's moderately stretchy; and more than 1 1/4 inches means the fabric is very stretchy.
