WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Dr. Henry Kissinger has given members of congress assurances that no commitment has been made to assist in rebuilding damages inflicted on North Vietnam. He is, however, going to Hanoi in the next few days and there is no doubt this will be the principal subject of discussion,

In the months ahead this will become a major issue in the congress.

Although this policy may not directly contradict President Nixon's general statement in his second inauguration, he brought into focus the question of cutting America's massive overseas burden in a changing world. As a matter of fact, in the president's first inauguration he indicated his determination to ease our military expenses by ending our role as the "global policeman,"

There is a beginning, aside from ending our presence in South Vietnam, of cutting back on the costly commitments in a number of places. At the present time we are parties to agreements which commit us to help defend 45 countries all over the world.

In what is known as the "Rio Treaty" we are pledged to help defend any one of 20 nations which ask for help. These are countries from Mexico to the tip of South America.

Another prominent factor is the rift in the communist world between Russia and Red China, It is thought that if hostilities in South east Asia extricate us from that areathere will be good chance of reducing American forces overseas far below the 600,000 men now in uniform. As it is now, these operations represent an outflow averaging about three billion dollars

> a year, aside from Vietnam. Our government has major military bases is the Azores, Canada, Belgium, Germany, Greece, Greenland, Iceland, Italy, Japan, the Philippines, South Korea, Spain, Turkey, England, Bermuda, Guantanamo in Cuba, and hundreds of similar installations overseas.

> Even with our mission ended in Southeast Asia, it is difficult to see how our military cost can be greatly reduced in the current year. The cost of military personnel, increased to encourage a voluntary service without draft, will be higher, even with a greatly reduced number in uniform. The need for refurbishing our material dissipated in Vietnam should be an absolute requirement. There is no assurance that threats around the world will not continue and to let our defenses down could be suidicidal. At the same time, we can not take care of the whole world, and this is generally the n e w policy. Neither can we condone the idea that we can live apart from the rest of the worl

> But it is time for us to retrench and to shift a major part of the burden to those for whom 1 we have made it possible to defend themselves.

It is a good question as to why we should feel obligated to spend massive sums of money to restore the communist aggressor nation of North Vietnam.

West Texas Vegetable **Conference Set**

LUBBOCK -- Vegetable genetics, potato breeding a n d herbicide residue effects on vegetables are among the popular topics to b e presented at the annual West Texas Vegetable Conference here February

The one-day meeting, kicking off a t 8:30 a.m. at the South Plains Electric Cooperative, will feature some of the top vegetable experts in the nation, acexperts in the nation, according to Dr. Roland R o b erts, area vegetable specialist with the Texas Agricultural ExtensionService in Lubbock.

The conference is expected to draw a record crowd of West Texas vegetable growers, seedsmen, chemical supplymen, machinery suppliers and representatives of several agricultural related organizations and institutions, including Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas Tech University, and the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station.

scientist at the University of California (Davis), specializing in vegetable nutritional requirements. He has studied soil fertility requirements of potatoes, and will address his remarks to that subject.

Dr. Robert Johansen,a vegetable geneticist and breeder at North Dakota State University in Fargo, developed the Norgold russet potato which is widely used on the Plains and the leading reset type potatointhe western United States.

Other speaker, Roberts says, will describe research progress and results of experiments and demonstrations in vegetables in West Texas.

The Right To Die

The American Hospital Association, the nation's leading hospital association, recently adopted a bill of rights after a three-year study in which four consumer representatives

Some of the major points of the declaration include the right of a patient to die gracefully, if he or she prefers that to temporary life-prolonging expedients, the right to complete medical information concerning one's condition, full explanation of bills, continuity of care, consultation prior to any experimentation, the right to privacy and to pertinent information about other institutions treating one's condition, etc.

The AHA expects its 7,000 member institutions to adopt the new twelve-point bill of rights though this might be optimistic in view of the fact that AHA will not withdraw accreditation from hospitals which do not.



Do mountains have anything to do with rainfall? What role do they play in controlling precipitation in the United States?

Mountains have a definite effect on cloud movement and rainfall. In the United States the really high mountains near the West Coast are a major influence on the weather. In this case they block moist, maritime air, or drain the moisture out of it as it moves east causing the dry regions in the western areas.

The United States is favored with four sources of moist maritime air which brings rain and produces necessary vegetation. From the Pacific, air masses move in from the northwest and southwest. In the Atlantic. air masses enter from northeast and southeast.

Only from the polar regions, via Canada, and from Mexico (in summer) do we get dry air masses over the United States.
