## **Frank Garcia Has Cotton Demonstration**

Frank Garcia has several varieties of cotton that he is growing in a result demonstration. Frankie is checking six varieties on one farm and four varieties on another place, Frank also has different soil treatments and different herbicide treatments that he will check for results.

On the Sallie MCAteer place east of Jayton, Frank is growing Paymaster 202, Rilcot Stripper Cala S, Growers Seed 71, Lankart LX571 Earlycot 32, and Lankart 57. The Paymaster, Cala S, and GSA71 variety plots are repeated in three plots. Deep broke soil treatment is being compared with chiseled land.

On the McAteer place five miles west of Jayton, Garcia is comparing Lankart 57, Deltapine SR-2, Lankart LX571, and Earlycot 32. On this field, Frank tried different rates of herbicide for weed control.

Results of these demonstrations will be reported in the Extension Service Result Demonstration Handbook, to be published at the end of the harvest season.

Garcia is a member of the Nent County Extension Program Building Committee and chairman of the Crops sub-committee.

#### Presidents & Television

The refusal of NBC and CBS to televise President Ford's tax-cut address to the people has, naturally enough, produced a negative reaction in the White House and elsewhere

That the chief executive officer of the nation, elected by the people (though not in Ford's case) cannot address taxpayers at a time of his choice about taxes or the budget, and finds himself at the mercy of network executives, is unacceptable.

It was thought by some that a recent Federal Communications Commission decision that press conferences were exempt from equal-time requirements had, to a great degree, solved this problem. But that ruling doesn't apply to speeches from the White House, according to CBS and NBC. (ABC disagreed, televised the President's recent speech.)

An NBC spokesman hinted that if the President were making an address outside the White House and requested coverage, it would be provided more readily than for a television speech from the President's office. That, the spokesman said, would be a legitimate news event, exempt from equal time requirements. A White House speech is not necessarily exempt, he said.

If the NBC executive's view is sound, the President should be able to deliver his messages to the people easily enough. Of course, a President will enjoy greater television coverage than any candidate for the job.

There is no logic for providing fully equal TV time to candidates since they are not functioning as head of state, transacting the people's business daily. That's an inevitable public relations advantage of winning the office of President, a job limited by the Constitution to two terms





## Marijuana & Sex

A respected new study finds the use of marijuana definitely suppresses the male hormone-often to the degree that the testosterone level becomes so low infertility results.

There has long been controversy over the effects of pot and in the past various studies which indicated impotence might result, or that mental processes were slowed, have been assailed as inconclusive.

The new study is respected and widely accepted. It was carried out by the Reproductive Biology Research Foundation in St. Louis and the University of California at Los Angeles. Its findings were recently reported to the newly-formed International Academy of Sex Research.

Coming at a time when apologists and users (including college professors, entertainers and others who exert considerable influence over today's youth) are claiming studies thus far are inconclusive, the study is of historic significance.

Dr. Robert Kolodny gave the St. Louis foundation report at the IASR meeting at State University of New York, Sunny Brook, N.Y. The foundation is directed by the noted sex researcher, Dr. William Masters, which 18 also significant.



#### Halloween

Halloween had its origin among the Druids centuries before the Christian era and from the Roman festival of Pomona. Later the church adopted the day as a spccial one, and the name is of Christian origin, referring to the eve of All Hallows Day.

Druid customs were so firmly entrenched that, although the Romans outlawed their observances in both Britain and Ireland during their occupation, many of the observances survive to this day. Halloween is one.

To the Druids, October 31st was the end of the year and thus the festival. The Druids also believed this was the time good souls of the dead went into animals, especially the cat. They believed punishment of the wicked could be lightened by gifts and prayers. (The 31st is also Protestant Reformation Day, dating from Martin Luther's rejection in 1517 of the church's teaching that one could buy indulgences for both the living and dead.)

In the United States the day has come to be associated with young people, who gather in goodies in trick or treat calls-a vast improvement over the mischief and destruction of former years.






