### Three BHS Students Attend National Young Leaders Conference

Three Baird High School Junior Class students have recently returned from The National Young Leaders Conference held in Washington, D.C. The National Young Leaders Conference is a unique leadership development program for high school students who have demonstrated leadership potential and scholastic merit.

Heather Barry, Kari Roan and Marie Moore were among 350 outstanding National Scholars attending the conference from across America.

The theme of the National Young Leaders Conference is "The Leaders of Tomorrow Meeting the Leaders of Today". Throughout the six-day conference, the students interacted with key leaders and newsmakers from the three branches of government, the media and the diplomatic corps.

Highlights of the program included welcoming remarks from the Floor of the

United States House of Representative and a panel discussion with prominent journalists at the National Press Club. Scholars visited foreign embassies and received policy briefings from senior government officials.

To complement these special meetings and briefings, the students participated in a number of leadership skill building activities. In one activity, "If I Were President", students role-played the President, members of the Cabinet and representatives from Capitol Hill who responded to an international crisis involving North and South Korea. Culminating the National Young Leaders Conference was the "Mock Congress", in which Scholars assumed the roles of United States Representatives by debating, amending and voting on proposed legislation on welfare reform.

The National Young Leaders Conference is

sponsored by the Congressional Youth Leadership Council, a nonprofit, nonpartisan educational organization. Founded in 1985, the Council is committed to "fostering and inspiring young people to achieve their full leadership potential". Over 375 Members of the United States Congress join this commitment as members of the Council's Honorary Congressional Board of Advisors. Each year, only 7,000 outstanding youth nationwide may participate in the 20 sessions of the National Young Leaders Conference.

"The conference provides the opportunity for students to distinguish themselves as tomorrow's leaders," said John Hines, Council Executive Director. "Scholars not only gain knowledge and experience in the nation's capital, they leave with a sense of accomplishment and an increased ability to face the challenges of the future."

### Local Youngster Wins Big At Fort Worth Calf Scramble



Matthew Caffey of Callahan County 4-H was among eight winners at the Fort Worth Calf Scramble during the 8:00 p.m. performance of the South Western Exposition and Livestock Show Rodeo, Thursday, February 1, in Will Rogers Coliseum. Featured during each of the 30 performances of the Stock Show Rodeo, the Calf Scramble includes participants from 4-H clubs and FFA chapters from across the state.

Caffey, whose parents are James and Rita Caffey of Clyde, will be presented with a certificate valued at \$500 for successfully catching, haltering and leading a calf to the scramble judges. The sponsor for his effort will be Incredible Universe, Fort Worth.

After purchasing heifers of their choosing, winners must follow a set of Calf Scramble guidelines and return to show their heifers in the Junior Division of the 1997 South Western Exposition and

Livestock Show. In addition, they have an opportunity to share in a \$20,500 scholarship fund for use in their freshmen year in college. Scholarship selections will be based on points awarded for correspondence with the sponsors and the Stock Show Office, record keeping on each heifer, results from showing here next year, and an essay outlining future goals.

Title sponsors for this event are Mrs. Baird's Bakeries and Justin Boots. Justin awards a pair of boots to the scramblers who do not catch a calf.

"We are pleased to make this contest available to Texas youngsters with the hope they will be encouraged to continue their education in the field of agriculture," said W.R. Watt, Jr., Stock Show president/manager. He also voiced a note of "appreciation to the 240 individuals and businesses who band together to help sponsor this opportunity for our state's youth."

### Burn Ban Still In Effect in Callahan County

Callahan County Judge Bill Johnson said Tuesday that the burn ban is still in effect in the county due to the continuing extremely dry conditions. The burn ban which went into effect January 18th according to Johnson will remain in force until conditions improve with some much needed rain, then will be lifted at the next commissioners meeting.

Penalties for violating the ban can result in being charged with a Class C Misdemeanor that carries a fine of up to \$500.

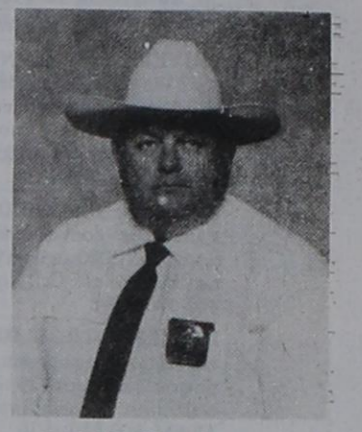
### Fire Destroys Home Near Belle Plains Sunday

tried to fight the fire before Baird Fire Department arrived. Firemen found a trailer house and three out buildings fully involved along with about eight acres of pasture grass and

brush on arrival. Firemen battled the blaze for about 35 minutes to bring it under control. A dollar amount of the total losses was not available but all the structures and contents were destroyed. One of the victims told rescue personnel a

bar-b-que pit started the surrounding grass on fire then caught the structures. All three victims, two men and one woman, were treated at a neighboring residence for smoke inhalation by medical personnel and transported to Hendrick Medical Center by ambulance.

All three victims were treated and released according to a Hendrick spokesman. Baird Volunteer Fire Department responded to the call with five trucks and eleven firemen. Also assisting at the scene were personnel from Callahan County Sheriff's Department.

Baird Firemen also assisted Eastland County Fire Departments last week with the large grass and brush fire in the northwestern edge of Eastland County which consumed around 4000 acres of pasture land and some structures. This was a two day ordeal Wednesday and Thursday. Firemen also answered a grass fire call at East 5th and Chestnut that very nearly turned into a structure fire as the grass burned around three sides of a vacant house. Cause of that fire was listed as an automobile fire that

spread to the dry grass. Quick response by our local fire department prevented greater damage to the property.



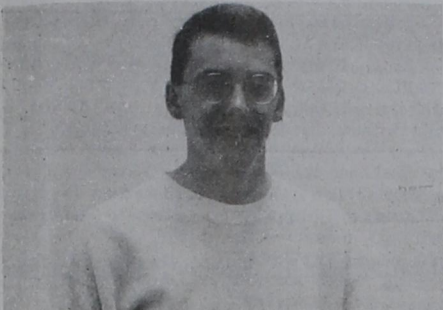

## Remember The Boys In Gray

James Edwin Watson Lane was born in 1836 at Newberry, Virginia. He came to Texas in 1880 and to Callahan County in 1898.

James married Jeanette Lane at Terrell, Texas June 1, 1897. She was born in 1861 at Ritchie County, West Virginia.

J.E.W. Lane served in the 50th Virginia Infantry Regiment, Company J. James enlisted in July, 1861 at Pulaski County, Virginia. He was in Tennessee in February, 1862; was captured at Fort Donelson. After being exchanged, he was assigned to the Department of Western Virginia and fought at Carnifax Ferry. Later the 50th served in J.M. Jones', G.C. Wharton's, and Forsberg's Brigade, Army of Northern Virginia. It participated in numerous conflicts from Chancellorsville to Cold Harbor, moved with Early to the Shenandoah Valley and fought it's last battle at Waynesborough at the battle of Gettysburg. J. was disabled and given leave of absence. Lee surrendered April 9, 1865 while he was still at home. As a matter of fact he did not surrender or return.

From July 1 until July 3, 1863, 190,000 soldiers charged, retreated, rallied and charged again in the

once quiet and unheard of fields of Gettysburg.

In three days, they commemorated in blood some of the most famous and evocative names in American military annals: Culp's Hill and Cemetery Ridge, Bloody Angle and Seminary Ridge, Pickett's Charge and finally, Lee's Retreat. In one fierce encounter that lasted for seven hours, an entire forest of oak trees decimated by more than 200 guns is still the greatest ever, fought on the American continent. And James Lane could say "I was there".

J.E.W. Lane was Treasurer of Callahan County from November 1902 to 1906.

Lane was a member of Albert Sidney Johnson Camp No. 654 of Baird.

December 28, 1912: Memorial on the death of Comrade J.E.W. Lane was read by Dr. Frazier. Captain Powell also read a memorial on the death of Comrade M.L. Wilson. These were ordered printed in the Baird Star and resolution was passed that the Camp wear their Crosses of Honor draped in mourning for thirty days.

J.E.W. Lane date of death; November 19, 1912 and was buried in Ross Cemetery, Callahan County, Texas.

## News For Veterans

**Aid & Attendance--** A Veteran on disability pension may be eligible for more monthly payment if that Veteran is confined to the home (housebound) or in need of care by another person (aid & attendance). A housebound Veteran with one dependent would receive slightly over \$1700 more per year while a Veteran on Aid & Attendance with one dependent would receive slightly over \$4600 more per year. A Veteran's widow on Aid & Attendance pension would receive an additional \$3100 over the regular Widow's annual pension.

Remember that pension is subject to reduction if there is any other income, including Social Security. For example, VA presently pays \$460 per month as Widow's pension. If the widow receives \$360 from Social Security, then VA will pay only \$100 per month.

**Cancer vs. AIDS--**A drug that normally is used to treat cancer patients also seems to prolong the survival of persons with AIDS, according to a new study by researchers at the Dallas VAMC. At a national medical meeting January 29 in Washington, D.C., Drs. Philip Keiser and Steven Rademacher reviewed the cases of 152 AIDS patients at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas, and

compared outcomes between those that had received granulocyte colony stimulating factor for prevention and treatment of a systematic bacterial infection and those who had not received the drug. They found that the patients who had received the drug lived more than twice as long as patients who had not received it. The longer survival, however, was not related to decreased incidence of the bacterial infection, the researchers noted.

**Home Care--**Now that folks are living longer, odds are you'll wind up needing to secure care for an aging friend or relative sometime soon. Today, 7% of U.S. workers care for older or ill spouses, relatives or friends, according to the Families and Work Institute. Overall, seven million people are receiving home care at a cost of \$27 billion, according to the National Association for Home Care.

Studies by the American Association for Retired Persons indicate that seniors overwhelmingly desire to stay in their homes. That desire can be outweighed by safety concerns, unless you know how to find the right person to help the older person at home. If you think someone close to you might need home care soon, start doing research now. One of the biggest

mistakes families make, experts say, is waiting until a crisis hits before seeking help.

First, contact the National Association of State Units on Aging in Washington to refer you to the agency in the state where your relative lives. Their telephone is 202/898-2578. The Eldervare Locator, funded by the U.S. Administration on Aging, also is a good free resource. Their number is 800-677-1116.

If the elderly person doesn't need much help, you may find that existing community services can cover your needs. But for complicated cases, ask for a referral to a local geriatric case manager. An elderly person who needs help with basics like getting dressed and going to the bathroom requires round the clock care. Your best bet is probably going through a home care agency.

Remember what you read in the first item of this column?? A person needing the care described in this home care item will most likely qualify for the housebound or aid & attendance benefit. Those extra payments can go a long way toward paying for the costs of home care.

A Thought--Most of us would be willing to pay as we go if we could just finish paying for where we've been!!!

### SETTING THE FACTS STRAIGHT

It is not a "fact of life" that several or all of the permanent teeth have to be lost as we grow older. Except for accidents or malformations, teeth are lost as a consequence of decay or periodontal (gum and bone) disease - conditions which can be prevented or arrested by timely and proper care. The primary cause of loss of teeth is neglect!

Drinking lots of milk does not prevent tooth decay. Milk is the richest dietary source of calcium, needed for teeth and bone building, and an excellent food. But milk cannot arrest the process of tooth decay or prevent its inception.
