**Law Limiting Common Law Marriage Passes**

The Texas House of Representatives this week passed a bill that would prohibit the recognition of common law marriage of minors under the age of eighteen. The bill, passed overwhelmingly, was co-authored by State Representative Jim Keffer (Eastland).

"This bill will establish in law that minors can not enter into informal marriages," said Keffer. "There have been cases where criminals have been let off the hook by using common-law marriage as a defense to statutory rape."

Recent court rulings have established that girls between the ages of 13 and 17 can enter into common law marriage without parental consent.

In 1996, a 22 year old was acquitted of statutory rape on the grounds that he and the thirteen year old girl he had impregnated were married under common-law. Such a defense would be disallowed under the new legislation.

The current Legislature has four weeks left in the Regular Session, and time is running out for most bills. "Of the many bills out there, only a fraction will actually pass into law," said Keffer. "I'm glad to see a good bill such as this passed so overwhelmingly in the House." The bill will now head to the Senate and, if passed there, will be sent to the Governor for his signature.

**Grumpe's Candy Store Under New Ownership**

Joe Kirschbaum and Warren Harkins are the new owners of Grumpe's Specialties. They bought the lollipop factory, located in the 200 block of Market Street, on Thursday, May 1.

Cliff and Glenda Stringfellow, the former owners, will stay on full time for about one month to help with the operation.

The company has 15 employees and produces more than 25 million lollipops annually. These lollipops are shipped to 50 states and several foreign countries.

The Stringfellows started the company in Abilene in June 1984 and moved it to Baird in July of 1984.

The new owners report that operation at the company will remain the same. A second work shift may be added a later date.

Mr. Kirschbaum and his wife, Brenda, live in Abilene. He is a native of Colorado City. They have a son, Aaron, who is a junior at Wylie High School, and two daughters, Kara and Robin, who are attending college. He also owns Carl's Cleaners in Abilene and his wife, Brenda, teaches at Clyde School.

Mr. Harkins is chief executive officer for Pittencrieff Communications in Abilene. He and his wife, Jane, and three children, Shauna, 16, Jessica, 11, and Craig, 11, live in the Wylie School District.

Grumpe's Specialties reportedly sells 100,000 pounds of hard candies, 5,000 pounds of chocolate Easter bunnies and Santas, and two million miniature candy canes a year.

**Coach Roan's Third Lady Bears Claim Class A State Title**

The Baird Lady Bears proved they were every bit the equal Tuesday at the Morris Williams Golf Course.

With Robert Lee and Vega lurking closely entering the final round, the Lady Bears fired a clutch round of 366 to win the Class A girls state golf tournament by 16 strokes over the Lady Steers.

Baird finished with a 385-366-751 total while Robert Lee shot 387-380-767.

Baird head coach Gary Roan, who guided the Bear boys to two state titles, said this one was the sweetest of all.

"This is the best one," he said. "Everybody kind of expected the boys to win. These girls really put the hours in and worked very hard."

"They knew what it took today, and they rose to the occasion. For the three seniors, I couldn't be happier."

They included Heather Barry, Pam Mason, and Kari Roan, the head coach's daughter.

All of Baird's scores were solid, led by Mason's 89. Freshman Kyla Neal fired a 90, Barry shot a 93, Roan carded a 94 and Annie Gilliland finished with a 95.

"We all just kept our mental game strong," Kari Roan said. "The pressure was on us this morning and we responded. Now, everyone can't just talk about our boys. The girls are there, too."

The City of Baird does hereby give notice of intention to issue Tax and Waterworks and Sewer System Revenue Certificates of Obligation, Series 1997, in the maximum principal amount not to exceed \$746,000 for paying all or a portion of the City's contractual obligations for the purpose of improving and extending the City's combined Waterworks and Sewer System, and for paying legal, fiscal, and engineering

fees in connection with such project. The City proposes to provide for the payment of such Certificates of Obligation from the levy and collection of ad valorem taxes in the City as provided by law, and from a pledge of the surplus revenues of the City's combined Waterworks and Sewer System, remaining after payment of all operation and maintenance expenses thereof, and all debt service, reserve, and other requirements in connection with any of the City's revenue bonds or other obligations (now or hereafter outstanding), which are payable from all or any part of the Net Revenues of the City's combined Waterworks and Sewer System.

SECOND SUNDAY in May we do it officially, and if we're wise we honor our mothers and the mothers of our children every day of the year. Candy, flowers, gifts, cards and sweet words of appreciation. And Mother's Day observance can actually be traced back to the Civil War. This is the 83rd year, and a woman named Anna Jarvis is the person who can be credited with making it happen. Born in Grafton, W. Va. in 1864, as a little girl she heard her mother pray that women who lost their children in the Civil War would be remembered. Two years after her mother died in 1905, Miss Jarvis asked that a Mother's Day celebration be held in the Methodist Church where her mother had taught Sunday School for 20 years. An associate said of Miss Jarvis later: "She was so tied up in Mother's Day. That's all she thought about. She devoted her whole life to it." He added that the first service was pretty plain, but it grew.

Miss Jarvis' crusade led to a statewide celebration and in 1910 Gov. William E. Glasscock issued the first Mother's Day Proclamation for West Virginia. She later won introduction of a Mother's Day resolution in Congress. It passed both chambers and President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day in 1914. The Grafton church now is open only on Mother's Day and Thanksgiving Day; it's called the Mother's Day Shrine.

## Thought For The Day

### THE NAKED CRAB

At the seashore, every pool left by the retreating tide seems to have a crab in it. Little ones scuttle sideways, bigger ones lounge in deeper, safer pools.

On the beach, shells of crab lie washed up by the waves. Some are from crabs that died. Others are simply discarded, a dwelling to small for its growing occupant. That's how crabs grow bigger, you see... when their shells get too tight, they split the shell open and grow a new one.

I've never talked with a crab. But I imagine the process of splitting open a shell must be painful. I'm

sure that until they grow a new shell they feel terribly defenseless and vulnerable because that's how we humans feel when we crack open our shells.

Our shells aren't visible like the crabs. But they are there, just the same...shells formed by years of habit, shells that protect us from other people, shells that are the roles we play as parents, or children, or bosses, or employees.

Every now and then we crack our shells open and emerge into a new world, quivering and defenseless.

Teenagers do it as they become adults. No wonder they get crabby sometimes. Adults do it as they learn to quit running their kids' lives... or when they get laid off work... or when a wife or husband dies and they have to start over again, alone... when an investment fails...when a dream disappears.

In all these experiences of life, a shell is being broken, and a new vulnerable life is started.

Like a crab, the longer that shell has been growing around us, the harder it is to break open... and the more painful the breaking becomes.

Some of our shells we have worn for generations. Our Christian faith can be a shell handed down by our ancestors. Some faith shells are worth keeping. Others may have

become prisons... shells so encrusted with the barnacles or the past, so burdened with trailing weeds, so constricting, that we can no longer move when God calls us to something new.

No one looks for painful experiences, in life or in faith. To avoid pain we may prefer to stay locked into shells that no longer fit us very well, rather than risk the vulnerability of cracking them open.

But when a crab's shell becomes too thick, too protective, too tough to crack open start again, then the crab can't grow anymore. And that's when it dies.
