## **County Rejects** Acre Transfer

Hale County cotton farmers balloting by mail turned down the proposed transfer of cotton acreage allotments out of the county by lease or sale.

The final officia' count of the vote showed 677 favored the proposal and 848 were opposed, said John B. Martin, ASC office supervisor.

A two-thirds majority vote in favor of the proposal was required to put it into effect.

The result of the election does not prevent cotton allotments to be acquired by Hale farmers by purchase or lease, Martin pointed out. The ASC official noted that any owner of cotton allotment in Hale probably could get as much for it by sale or lease within the county, which is permitted, as he could outside the county.






Burial was in Abernathy Cemetery under the direction of Chambers Funeral Home. Masonic graveside services were conducted.
