We would hope that each church family attending the evening meal would bring two dishes.

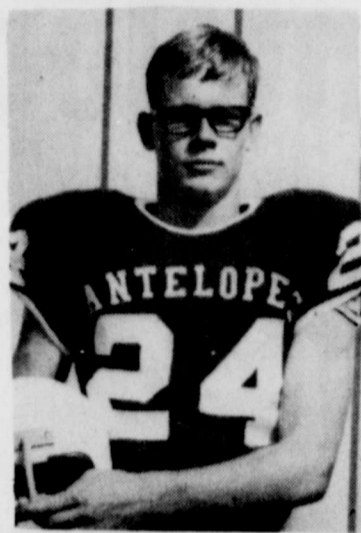

LOSE TO FLOYDADA

The Abernathy Antelopes closed out the 1970 football season last Friday night, losing to the powerful Floydada Whirlwinds, 17-0.

This was the first time this year the Lopes failed to score, but it was also the lowest point production for the undefeated Winds this season.

Playing in cold, misty weather all night, the Lopes fumbled the opening kick-off and the Winds needed only three plays to take a 7-0 lead. The aroused Lopes came right back and moved the ball for four first downs before giving up the ball. Playing inspired defense the Lopes held the Winds, forcing them to punt three different times in the first half.

Fumbles, pass interceptions, and a tough Floydada defense stopped each Antelope threat and the half ended with the Whirlwinds scored 10 more points and the Lopes could never mount a serious scoring threat.

The Antelopes ended the season with a 6-4 record, bettering their worst record for the past three years. With only seven seniors graduating the Lopes will return experienced players at each position next year. Coach Nickerson commented "We will certainly miss these seven players because they were dedicated and fine football players, but our juniors and sophomores all showed great improvement this year, especially our sophomore, and we know they will continue with the same attitude as shown by our seniors this year."

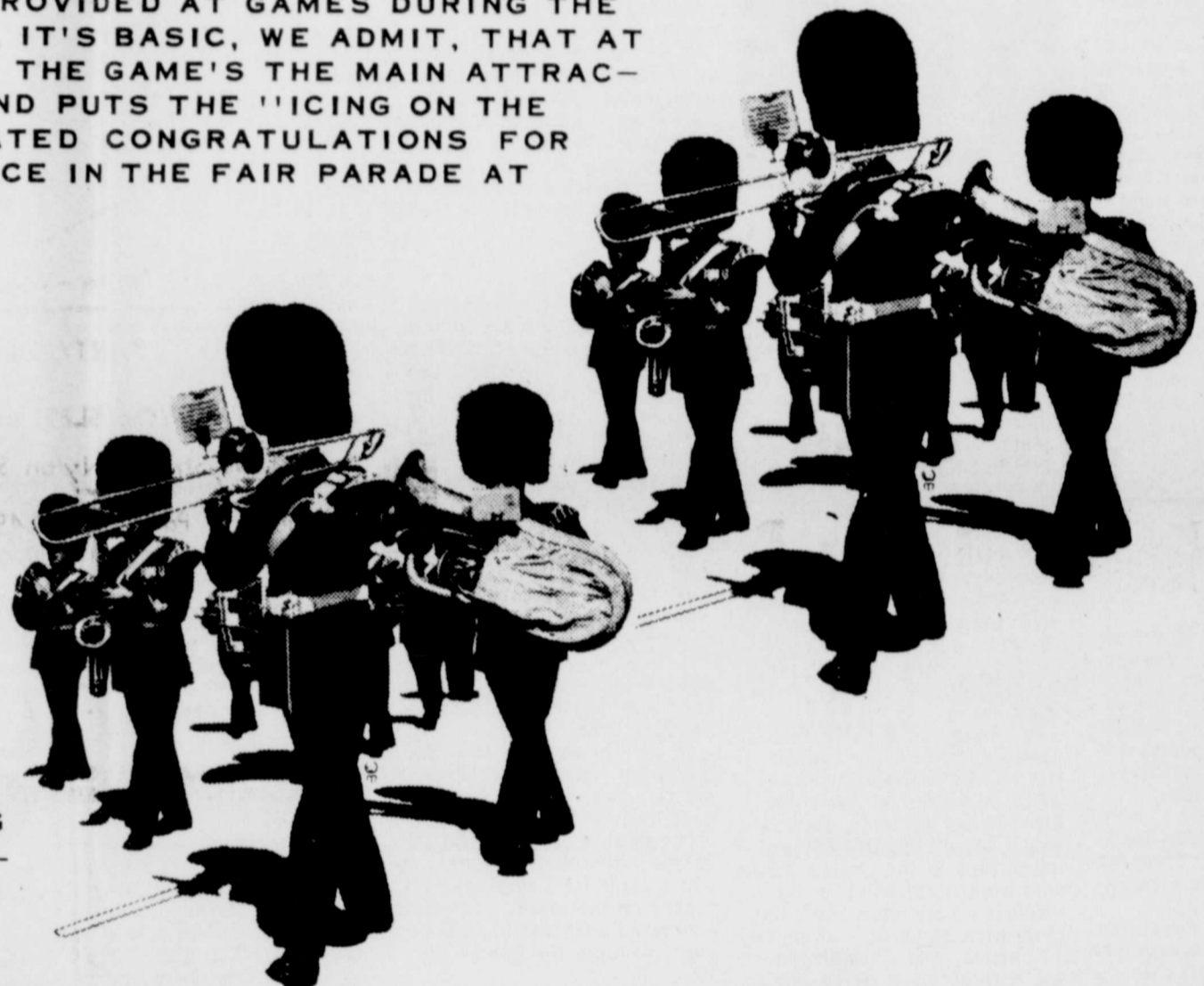
