she received a BA from West Texas State University and did graduate work at the University of Illinois. While in Lincoln she also taught school. Mrs. Strickland is musically talented. She plays the piano and organ.

He attended Central Bible College, Springfield, Mo., one year and last year went to Texas Tech. Ronald, 19, attended WTSU the 1969-70 term and now is serving with the Marine Corps, stationed in San Diego. He is a graduate of Abernathy High School. Their twins, Loran and Lelan, are three years old.

NAZARENE NEWS NOTES

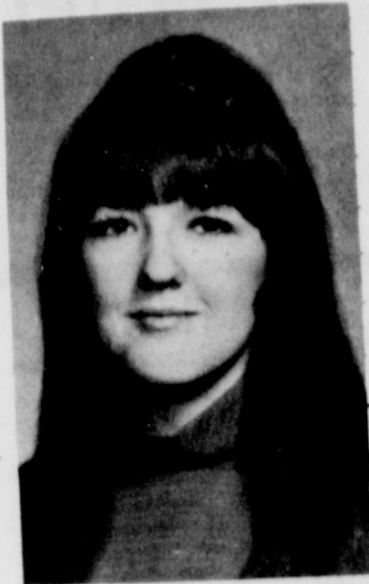
Editor's Note: The following is from the Abernathy First Church of the Nazarene Newsletter, issued Nov. 24, by Pastor Louis Schaal.

Thanksgiving, November's foremost holiday, was first held on July 30, 1623. It wasn't until 1789 that George Washington issued the proclamation for a general day of thanks in November... and that was for one year only!

For many years there was no regular Thanksgiving; the various states celebrated individually. Finally, in 1863, President Lincoln's proclamation that the last Thursday in November be set aside as a day of Thanksgiving took hold, and each year afterward, for 75 years, the President of the United States issued a similar proclamation.

Then during the years 1939-1941, President Roosevelt issued the proclamation a week early to lengthen the shopping days before Christmas. In 1941, however, Congress ruled that the last Thursday be observed in the future, and Thanksgiving became a legal holiday.

Today, nearly 350 years later we still observe this day of prayer. On this Thanksgiving let us give thanks for the many blessings we have and pray for peace everywhere.
