Mr. Jennings died at 9 p. m. Monday in Hi-Plains Hospital, Hale Center. He had been in ill health, suffering a heart condition, for the past few years.

Jennings, a native of Fisher County, came to the South Plains in 1945. He had lived at Abernathy since 1948. He was chief maintenance man for New Deal schools for seven years, and then had the same position with Abernathy schools for seven years.

Survivors include his wife, Nannie; two daughters, Mrs. Frances Kennedy of Lubbock and Mrs. Dorothy Coaly of Jay, Okla.; one brother, Elbert of Olney; one sister, Mrs. C. W. Johnson of Alvin; seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

SCHOOL BOARD NOTES

The Board of Education met in regular session February 1 at 7:00 p. m. in the board room. Those in attendance were: L. J. West, president; Billie Harrison, vice president; Joe Lovelace, secretary; Lon Carmickle; Joe Oswalt; David Pinson; Bob Riley; Dr. Delwin Webb, superintendent; and Earl Carter, business manager.

Bills of the previous month were presented and approved for payment. In other reports the tax collections revealed 97.09% of the taxes have been collected. Budget progress report for 5/12 of the school year was presented and accepted. The current enrollment for the fifth month of the year showed 1,140 students enrolled which is exactly the same as last year. The average daily participation in the lunchroom for the month of January was 741.

The Board officially recognized March 1-5 as Texas Public School Week. The night to be designated for open house has not been set but will be announced at a later date. During open house all rooms and departments will be open and teachers will be in their respective rooms to welcome the parents and visitors to show the work of the students in all of their classes.

In other action, the Board discussed at length an experimental schools project written under the guidelines of the United States Office of Education.

Also discussed was the policy on the use of dangerous drugs and narcotics as passed by the Board in regular session March 3,

1969. The complete policy is as follows:

Any student known to have a dangerous drug or narcotic drug in his possession or known to be under the influence thereof (influence including hallucinatory materials) while in school or while participating in a school-sponsored function, after due notice to the violator and after hearing before the Board of Education is found guilty, the student shall be expelled for the balance of the semester and no credit be given to the student for the semester.

Further, any student who shall have been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony for the possession, use, or sale of a dangerous drug or narcotic drug (hallucinatory materials included when possession indicates imminent danger) while outside the school, will be expelled by the Board of Education for the current semester and no credit will be given to the student for the semester.

In other action of the Board it was stated that the wearing of coordinated pants suits by female teachers was not in violation of the school policy on teacher dress and grooming which briefly is that

teachers are expected to groom and dress in a manner that is acceptable to this community.

The Board called for the official trustee election to be held Saturday, April 3, in the City Hall and a complete notice of this official action is elsewhere in this paper.

The next regular meeting of the Board will be March 1.

TANE SPEAKERS AT CHURCHES HERE SUNDAY

Subjects of many sermons Sunday will be alcohol abuse and drug abuse. Speakers from Texas Alcohol Narcotics Education (TANE) will occupy pulpits in three churches in Abernathy on Sunday February 7, 1971. They are The Baptist Mission, Rev. Jose Rodriguez, Pastor; Northside Baptist Church, Rev. Hollis G. Shewmake, Pastor and First Baptist Church, Rev. Murry Brewer, Pastor.

"Problems of alcohol and drug abuse are growing daily. It is going to be up to the people who care, to do something about these problems," said Rev. Albert F. Tucker, TANE Executive Director. "We find people who care in Texas' churches," he said.

TANE's purpose is to prevent, through education, problems that arise from use of alcohol, narcotics, and other dangerous drugs.

"We do not speak in local churches with the idea of reaching drunks and dope addicts, but to report to the people on the problems and what is being done about them," Rev. Tucker said.

A non-profit, educational organization, TANE has been in existence since 1935. Programs include the speakers bureaus, made up of more than 150 men; public school assembly programs; publishing; production of audio visual aids; legislative information service; research; a free film lending library; an annual school on alcohol and narcotics education, sponsored jointly by TANE and Baylor University, held each February in Waco, and public information service.

TANE's books and film strips have been distributed throughout the United States and the English-speaking world. Some have been translated into other languages, for use in South America and the Far East.

MAXWELL'S MARCHES PUBLISHED

Dr. Everett Maxwell, director of the Royal Blue Band and professor of music education at Lubbock Christian College, has received notice from Southern Music Company of San Antonio, a firm that distributes nationwide, that they have accepted three of his compositions for publication. All three are band marches and are titled: "Roadrunner", "Satellite" and "March Differente".

"March Differente" has been performed by the LCC Royal Blue Band, the Texas Tech band and the Summer Municipal Band of Lubbock under the direction of Leean Killion. "Roadrunner" was conceived in September of 1969 for the LCC band and was played on its fall tour that year. "Satellite" was written for the Abernathy High School band in 1968 and was used as its warm-up march in the spring contest that year under the title "Windward Ho." Maxwell was director at Abernathy from 1960 through 1969.

The publisher said, "We want to do the "Roadrunner" as a quickstep march, "Satellite" as a concert march for our junior high band series and "March Differente" as a full size concert march.

Dr. Maxwell now has seventeen published marches. Some of the most popular are: "Sounding Brass", "Proudly We Play", "Ojo de Aguila" (Eagle Eye) and "Wall of Brass".

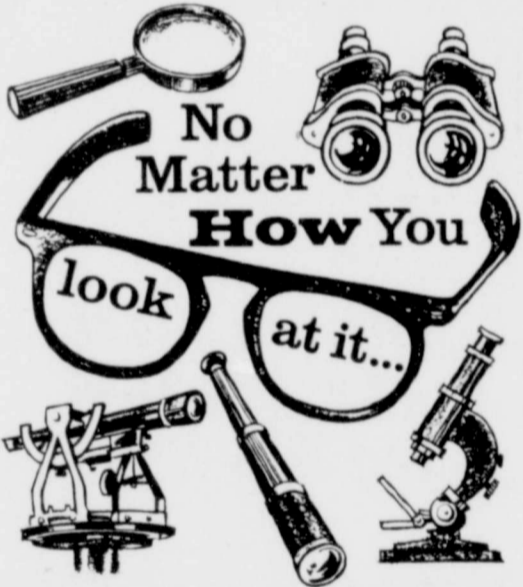

Rep. Wayne Files Measure On LSD

AUSTIN — Rep. Ralph Wayne of Plainview has filed a bill for introduction which would increase the penalty for possession of LSD to a prison term of two to 10 years.

The present penalty for possession of LSD and of most other dangerous drugs is imprisonment of 30 days to one year on the first offense (or a fine of up to \$3,000), and a two- to 10-year prison term for subsequent offenses.

Rep. Wayne also filed a bill which would exempt from sales taxes the leasing of motion-picture films to television stations.
