City Incumbents Seek Re-Election

Absentee Vote Ends March 30

Qualified voters who plan to be away Saturday, April 3, 1971, the day on which two school trustees, a mayor and two aldermen are to be elected in balloting at Abernathy City Hall, are urged to cast an absentee ballot.

Mrs. Orelia Clement is in charge of absentee voting at Abernathy City Hall, for city officials and for school trustees. Absentee ballot balloting began March 15, and will continue through March 30.

When you vote absentee, take along your current voter registration certificate. Mrs. Clement will have to check voter registration certificates before issuing ballots for absentee voting.

A mayor and two aldermen are to be elected by qualified voters in the City of Abernathy in balloting Saturday, April 3, from 8 a. m. to 7 p. m. in the city hall.

Terms of Mayor L. G. Deering and Aldermen Joe Chambers and Lee Echols expire this year. The following names will be on the city election ballot: FOR MAYOR: L. G. Deering, re-election; FOR ALDERMAN: (Vote For Two) Lee Echols, re-election; Joe Chambers, re-election; Raul Sepeda, re-election; Ralph Hanes, re-election; Max Martin, re-election.

Lines for write-in votes for mayor and for aldermen will be provided on the ballot.

Absentee voting will be conducted by Mrs. Orelia Clement at city hall from Monday, March 15, through March 30.

Holdover Aldermen on the City Council are J. L. Miller, Jr., Morris Stevens and Billy Shipman.

Trustees To Be Named Here April 3

Qualified voters in the Abernathy School District will vote Saturday, April 3, at Abernathy City Hall, to name two school trustees. Terms of Billie Harrison and Lon Carmickle expire this year.

The polls will open at 8 a. m. and close at 7 p. m. The following names will be on the ballot (vote for two): Billie Harrison, re-election; Lon Carmickle, re-election; Guadalupe Ramos, re-election; Willie V. Dunn, re-election; Lindell Myatt, re-election.

Lines will be provided on the ballot for write-in votes.

Direct Dialing Scheduled Here

Equipment installation is nearing completion and testing has started as preparations continue for the introduction, Sunday, April 4, of an advancement in communications for customers served by General Telephone Company of the Southwest in Abernathy, according to Sheron T. Lee, Division Manager.

On that date, the company will bring its customers the ultra modern Direct Distance Dialing, which permits the user to dial all station to station long distance calls.

This maze of complicated equipment makes the placing of long distance calls very simple. By dialing the access code, area code, if other than your own, and number, most telephones in the United States and Canada are accessible.

Immediately upon the completion of dialing, the operator will request the number from which the call is being placed. The call will then be released to equipment which will record the billing information.

With the advent of Direct Distance Dialing, operator assistance and special calls such as person-to-person, credit card and collect calls will be handled by Lubbock operators.

DDD folders have been distributed to all customers, giving complete instructions.

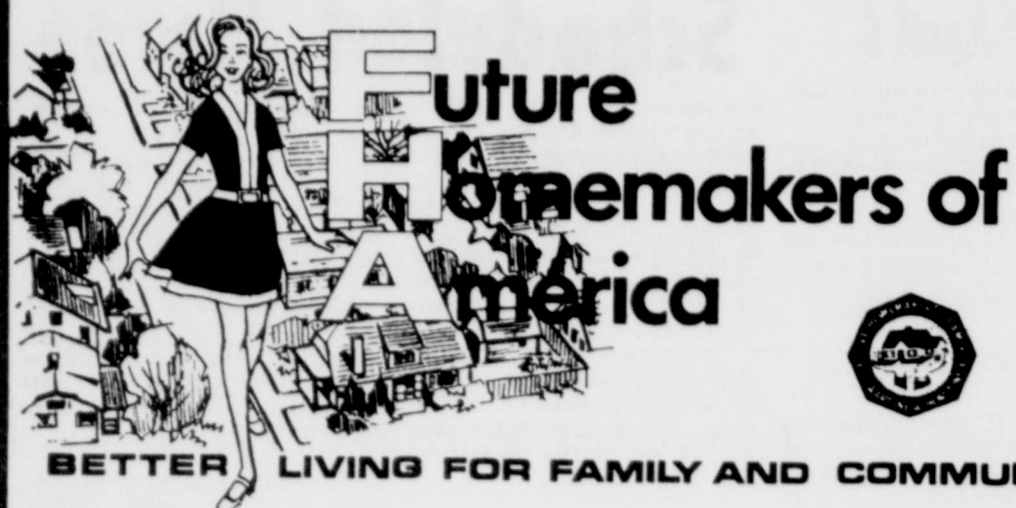

Becton And Heckville News

Mr. and Mrs. Robert Dean and family and her mother Mrs. C. L. Pitts returned to Fort Worth Monday. Mrs. Pitts had been in West Texas Hospital with bronchial pneumonia since Tuesday of last week. Robert Dean is the son of Mrs. Flora Dean. Judy and Roger Dean spent the past week with their aunt Mrs. M. A. Waters and their grandmother Mrs. Dean of Becton.

Loretta Pearson, wife of James Pearson, of 3005 35th Street, Lubbock, who was seriously injured in a two car collision at 19th and Flint Ave. in Lubbock on March 8th is out of the hospital and recovering nicely at present she is at the home of Mrs. H. Y. Pearson. Loretta is the granddaughter of Mrs. Flora Dean of Becton.

A skunk catcher has been hired by the city of Lorenzo to catch skunks in the surrounding area, as skunks have been more numerous than usual. The A. O. Smith family of the Becton community pulled into their driveway last Sunday night and were attacked by a skunk as they were leaving their car, and it tried to bite them and their dogs. The Smiths were not bitten but two of their dogs were bitten before he could kill it. Mr. Smith took the skunk into Dr. Ted R. Means, City Health Officer of Lorenzo, who had it's head removed and analyzed by a laboratory.

The report on the skunk confirmed the rabies diagnosis, and the Smith dogs were ordered destroyed. Means has warned area residents to have their pets inoculated against this disease. A veterinarian will be in Lorenzo city office March 27th and April 10th to vaccinate animals who have not received inoculations. Pet owners from surrounding areas, are invited to bring their pets into the Lorenzo City Office on these days.

Within the last few weeks there have been cases of rabies in skunks near New Deal and Abernathy, and several days ago health officials in Floydada reported a confirmed case of rabies in a skunk killed near that city. Choise Smith, health inspector with migrant Health unit in Floydada, said he sent a skunk head to Austin to be analyzed and the report confirmed rabies in the skunk killed in that area. He said "there are more skunks seen now than in several years. Smith said health officials were observing the dogs, in that county, which were exposed in that area.

Kenneth Scott laboratory director for City-County Health Unit said that a rabid skunk was killed near Abernathy, on Feb. 23rd, and another was killed on March 8th near New Deal.

Health officers in all the area where rabid skunk have been killed are urging citizens, and pet owners especially, to watch for strange looking skunks and report the sightings to health authorities or law enforcement personal immediately.

Mrs. Jerry Stanton, who underwent recent major surgery at St. Mary's Hospital is home and making a good recovery.

Mr. and Mrs. H. E. Sorrells, longtime Becton residents recently retired from farming and moved to Idalou where they purchased a home on Globe Ave. in West Idalou.

A farm sale conducted by Charles Neff Auctioneer was held Thursday March 25 to dispose of the Sorrells' farming equipment.

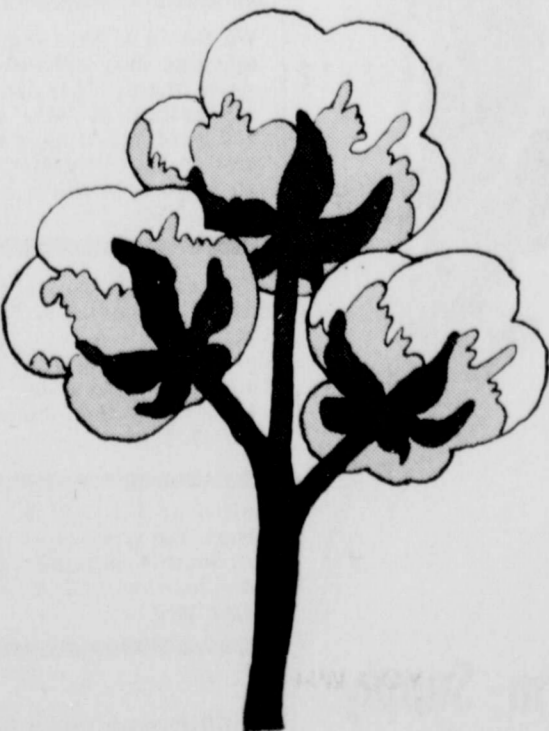

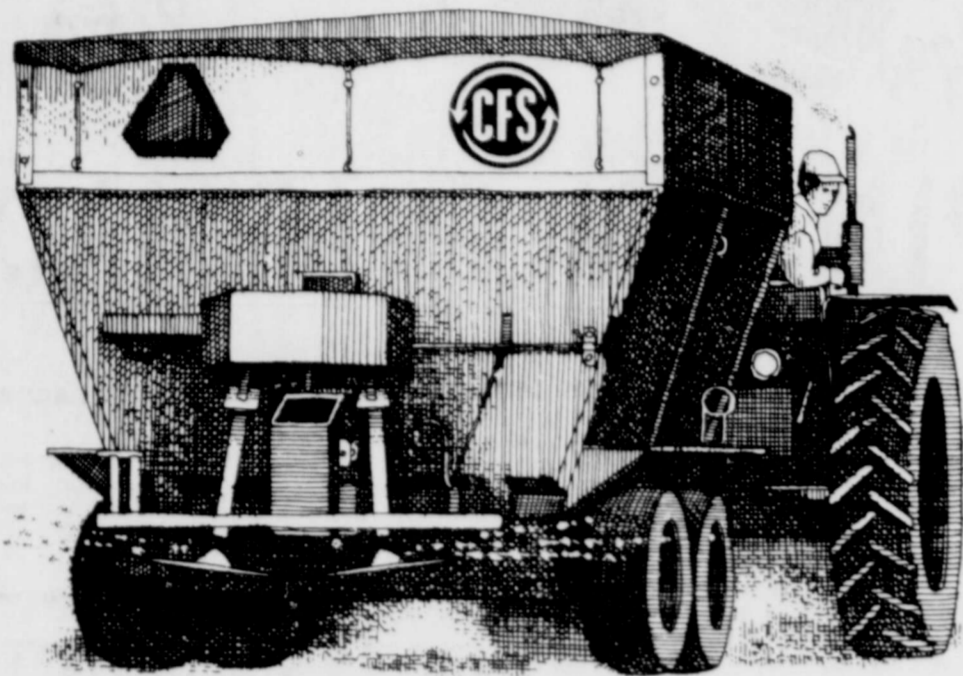

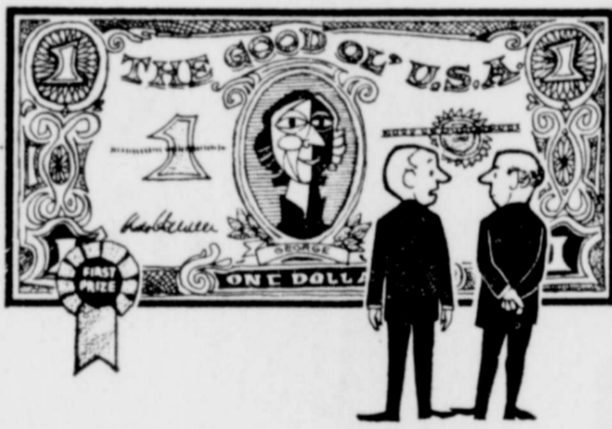
