



Facts About The Clean Water Amendment No. 4 on the Ballot, May 18 Voting:

Passage of Constitutional Amendment No. 4 is of the utmost importance to the future of West Texas. That's the word from Bruce Rigler, Plainview, Water, Inc., district director. Rigler called on his fellow West Texans to give strong support to the so-called "Clean Water Amendment" at the May 18 balloting.

"One of the most important aspects of the proposed amendment," Rigler said, "is raising the maximum allowable ceiling rate on water development bonds to six percent." Under current provisions, the state may pay no more than four percent interest on the bonds. This coupled with bond market trends during recent years has made some \$300 million water development bonds already authorized by voters virtually unsalable.

"Since a portion of these bond funds will be used by the state to purchase storage space in East Texas reservoirs, they will in a real sense be utilized to the future benefit of a water import program for us here in West Texas," the Hale County dairy farmer said.

In addition to the interest rate limitation, the amendment would authorize \$100 million bonds for loans to local governments to assist in defraying construction costs of sewage treatment facility construction.

"Throughout the state, cities and towns have been hard-pressed to finance needed sewage plant construction, "Rigler said. "Loans made possible through the amendment bonds along with increased financial participation from the federal government will assure construction of the needed facilities," he added.


