#### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Two Southwest Regional Shows will abide by the rules from the "Appaloosa Show and Contest Manual, The Appaloosa Horse Club, Inc., Moscow, Idaho.
- The point system for these two shows will be the 6 point system based on the number of horses in the class. No points for Grand or Reserve Champions.
- Judges will be responsible for the work off of all ties in Performance Classes.
- All horses must have registered papers, in accordance with the rules of the horse clubs involved, with the exception of the current year foals shown as un-named will carry dam's name and number. Current year foals must have registration papers by October 31, 1971, to qualify for high point awards.
- Exhibitors are notified that any act of disobedience to the judges or officials on the part of any owner, trainer, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse; and the owner shall thereby forfeit his entry fees and all other fees paid.
- Horses must enter both shows to qualify for high point awards, and his number must be on his back when he enters the show ring.
- Payback monies will be paid:  
6 or more in class, 35%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%.  
5 in the class, 40%, 30%, 20%, 10%.  
4 in the class, 50%, 30%, 20%.  
3 in the class, 60%, 40%.  
2 in the class, 100%.  
Payback monies will be paid when all checks have cleared.
- The Youth Classes will abide by the rules in the (Youth Contest Guide, Official Rules Handbook).

## From The Desk of the City Manager

Summer is surely here to stay and with it comes vacation and many fortunate ones take trips. This means their homes are at least semi-exposed to many elements most of which are at least undesirable. We have a limited number of people, but we can at least make periodic checks during patrols if we know you are gone. Why not notify our fine Police Dept. if you are going to be gone and they can check it out from time to time. It is not asking to have neighbors go in and check things for you from time to time but sure they have this information so they will have some idea about people they see in the house while you are away. Then it follows that you will want to notify them when you get back. You wouldn't want to be investigated for being in your own home late some night.

Another thing to do before you leave is to make sure that no water valves are stuck open or that no faucets are partially open all the time you are gone.

Also water pressure should not be left on the little plastic lines that feed air coolers. These lines break or pop off the lines and thousands of gallons of water can go down the drain. Water bills that are completely ridiculous result from all these things and many times are not detected upon your return. Then it is very hard to understand why you have the highest bill you have ever had when you were not even at home. We just bill according to what the meter records, so please make every effort to see that these and other precautions are taken to prevent a bad situation. We want to sell water, but only in the amount that you need it.

Other parties who should know of your vacation plans are the postman and the paperboy. An overflowing mail box and a yard filled with newspapers still rolled up are an open invitation to disaster. We are sure that no one who lives in Beautiful Abernathy would bother anything; but we sometimes have visitors who come for the express purpose of visiting those who are not here. The fact that you may have neglected to take some usual precautions is their invitation to be back during the dark of night.

Another reason for telling the Police Dept. and your neighbors some of your vacation plans, is to make it possible to locate you in case of an emergency. There are a thousand things that can happen at home or on the job that will make it very important that someone be able to locate you on short notice. It is so simple a matter. But if we must start from scratch, look up your license number and make a car alert the Dept. of Public Safety, alert all stations and sheriff units, alert each place you think you may conceivably be, then a lot of time and money is spent and we may never locate you. The best way to have a Happy Holiday type vacation is to plan equally for what you leave at home as you do for what you are going to do. Then advise others what these plans are. Bon Voyage.

Q. I will be 62 in September and want to apply for my social security. However, I babysit with my daughter's children ev-

ery day and can't come to your office. Is there any other way for me to apply?  
A. Yes, we have checked the telephone directory and find that you have a telephone. A representative will call you and complete an application to be mailed to you for your signature. Supporting evidence can be mailed in with your application.

This will be discussed during the application interview. Feel free to call our office. We are open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. daily, Monday through Friday, except national holidays. Just look in the telephone book under "Social Security," under "Medicare," or under "U. S. Government."

**Vandalism Discussed By Police**

**VANDALISM:** During the last few months in Abernathy is on the increase. The police department realizes that only a small number of people is responsible.  
One way to help prevent vandalism and malicious mischief is to prevent loitering.  
In order to prevent loitering the police department must rely upon state law V.P.C. 482a Section 3 paragraph 4. This law states that no person or persons shall congregate upon a parking lot or loiter upon a parking lot after he has been notified to leave by the owner or his agent. The police department is willing to act as agent for the owners of parking lots. Under this law it is necessary that the police be specifically instructed by the owner to keep his lot clear of loiterers. This is the way the law reads. In other words, unless the loiterers are violating a law at the time, the police dept. must have permission to control the loitering. Anyone who would like to read this may do so at the Police Dept.  
If you have a parking lot and you do not wish for people to congregate upon it, please advise the police chief in order that this law can be enforced.  
Anyone who after having been notified by the owner or his agent refuses to vacate is subject to a fine up to \$200.00

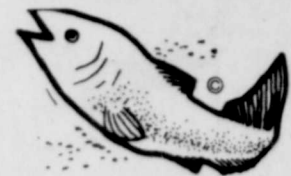

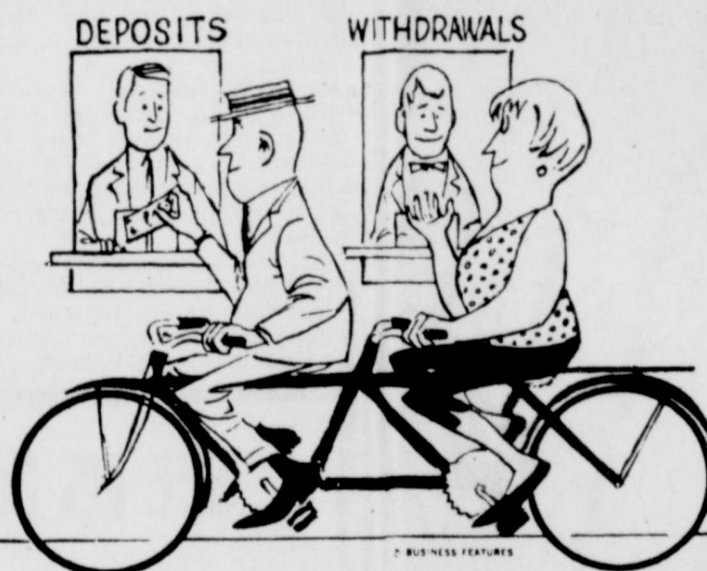

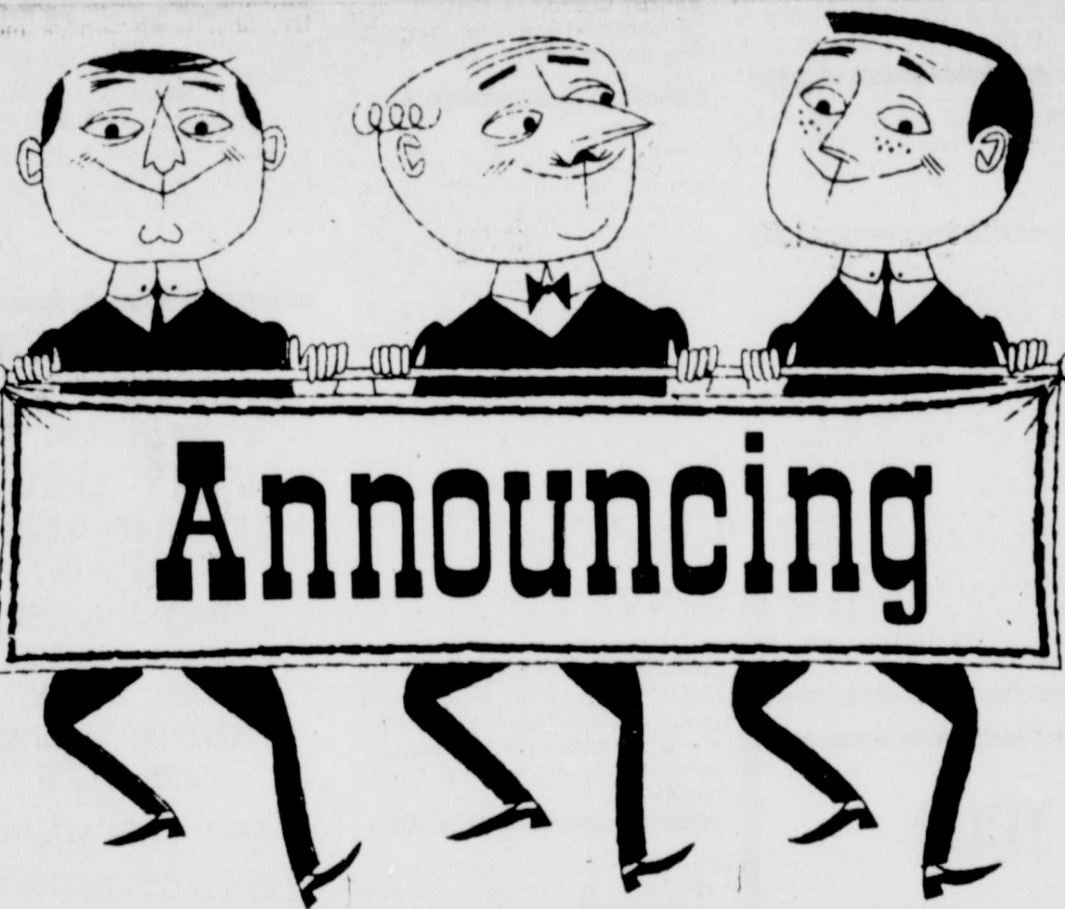
