## Welcome to the Celebration Here Saturday



### Plans Announced

**INDEPENDENCE DAY JULY 3**  
 Long hours of planning and preparation will culminate this Saturday when we reel off the first of what is hoped will be many successful Independence Day Celebrations. Every facet of the City has been represented in this endeavor. If hard work and dedication to a cause will insure a project success then this one is bound to be an outstanding spectacular.

Posters are up all over the area that list the events and times that they will happen. It will be an all day affair starting at 9:30 in the morning and ending after the Talent show at night. Events have been properly spaced to allow for a generous amount of visiting and relaxing the grounds around the City Square (the one with the City Hall and the Post Office on it). Relatives and friends from throughout the area are sure to find this to be the type of celebration that they wish their hometown could present.

The parade is shaping up as outstanding part of the kickoff. The ping-pong balls that will be dropped from planes at 10:30 and 1:00 p.m. are sure to draw a crowd. One word of caution on this event; there will be Boy Scouts on top of the business houses down town who will throw off any balls that land there, so no one will be allowed to climb up during the drop. Be sure to bring all ping-pong balls you recover to the talent show that night so you can redeem any prize that you might win.

Baldrige Sound Truck will set the tempo with patriotic music prior to the Parade which starts in front of the Junior High School at 10:00 a.m. The Flag Ceremony is always an impressive sight that brings back pleasant memories to most of us. The Boy Scouts will be selling plane rides @ .01 per pound all day. A bus will take riders to the Airport. The Girl Scouts are bringing forth all their favorite Pie and Cake recipes in anticipation of some heated bidding for their wares. The good men of the Fire Department will serve up Smokey's Famous Bar B Cue and all the trimmings in generous portions from 11:30 till 1:00. The Little Leaguers will serve Ice Tea and Cokes for a small additional cost. At 12:30 sharp the "dried" will suddenly become the "wets" as the "Ducking Board" starts a long series of "Splash Downs" that will

test the skill of the local rowers and delight the viewers. At 1:30 a new feature not previously announced had been added. The Fire Department men will give a foaming and hose spraying demonstration. It has been rumored to be a fact by usually unreliable sources that an old fashioned water hose splashing contest is sure to result. If the present heat continues there will be a couple Volunteers for this event.

Then the Scene shifts to the Abernathy Riding Club Arena for the Barrel Races and other demonstrations of riding skill. One point must be emphasized about this event. Students who will be in High School next September cannot accept any prizes for winning this sport. They will be ineligible for all future Interscholastic League events for the duration of their School years if they do. Therefore no prizes will be awarded for this age group. Winners in the Pee Wee group for Fifth graders and below, the Junior group for Sixth through Eighth Graders and the Senior group for all who have graduated through 21 years old, all will be given 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place trophies. Gate admission to the races will be .50¢ will be charged all contestants. Riding Club members will have concessions available. Bring your own shade.

All great events must have a fitting and proper climax and the Talent Show at the High School Auditorium is sure to fill this bill. Some highly entertaining surprises have been scheduled and the word is that LBD Jerry may make his local acting debut along with a goodly number of other local gentry to "beef up the action, to coin a fitting phrase for some. All participants in this portion of the program may accept trophies or prizes since this is not an athletic event. The entry of certain well known character guarantees that this will not be athletic in any way. Trophies that are to be presented to the many different events will be displayed and identified at various businesses about the City. All interested parties are urged to view them between now and Saturday. Mark this date July 3rd on your Calendar. You are sure to meet all your friends in Abernathy.

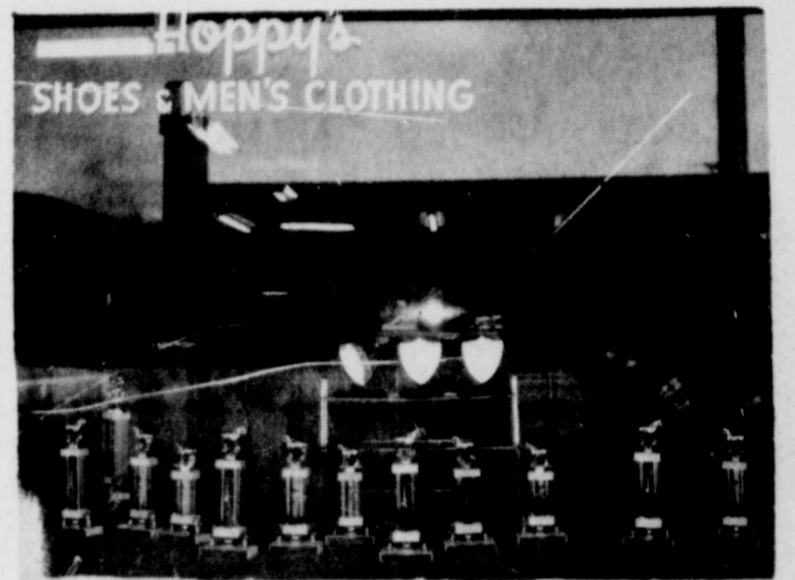

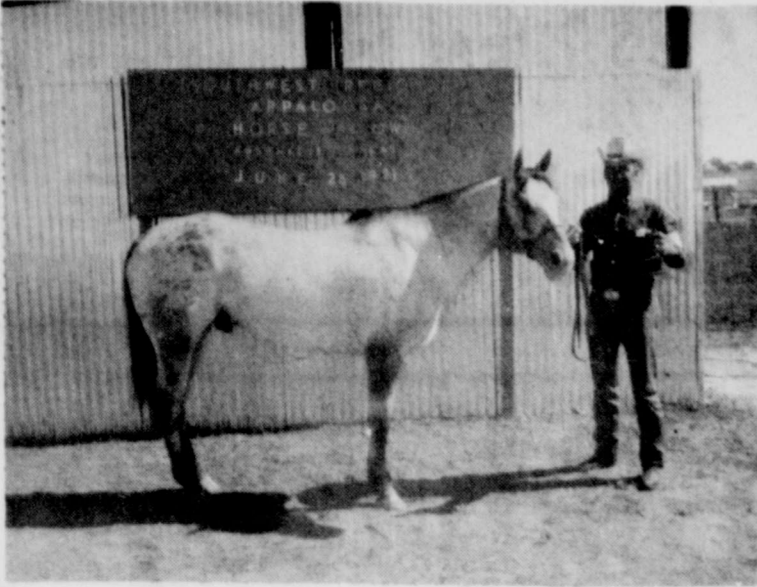
### Antelope Band Plans Rehearsal

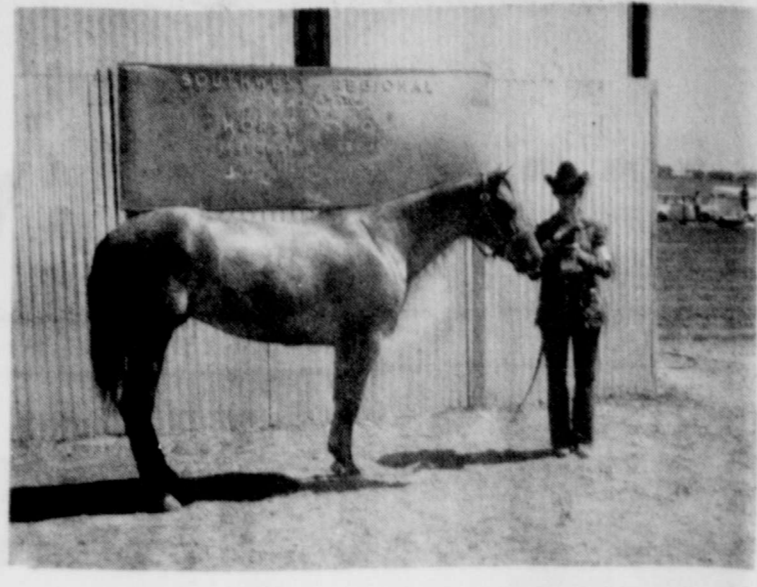
### Wilkes Covers Local Events

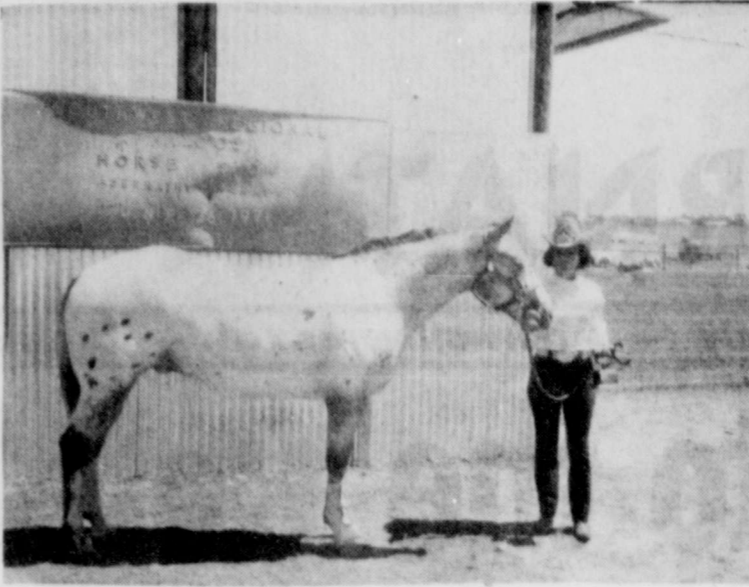

## Horse Show Winners Are Announced

The Southwest Regional Appaloosa Horse Show, sponsored by the Abemathy Riding Club, was held in Abemathy on Saturday, June 26. The new riding club arena, located west of the football field on sixth street, was used for the first time during the show.

Show Chairman Conny Chance had this to say following the show, "We had a good class A show. Everybody was cooperative."

Judge for the days events was Russel Moore of Madill, Oklahoma, J. D. Vineyard was ring steward and Virgil Wade served as official show photographer. Filling the announcers position was Cleve Littlepage of Tahoka.

The show was divided into three classes, halter, performance, and the youth class. In the halter class, the horses in the mares, stallions and gelding classes were led into the arena on a halter. Horses were then led around to be viewed by the judge. Barrel racing, stake racing, western pleasure, cutting and reining were among the events in the performance class. Youth, ranging in age from 12 and under up to 17, competed in a combination of both halter and performance class events in the youth class.

Champion winners of the halter class events are as follows. A horse named "Avispi Yagui" and owned by Lee Brasfield of the L.L.B. Ranch in Marquez, Texas was selected as Grand Champion Stallion. Reserve Champion Stallion, "Comanche Double", was owned by L.R. Iker of Fritch, Texas. "Sleepy Starlight" also owned by Lee Brasfield of Marquez, was placed as Grand Champion Mare. Reserve Champion, "Rabs Tico Lady" is owned by Mildred Mathery of Kermit. Mary Goble's "Gold Flash" of Abemathy was selected as Grand Champion Gelding. Reserve Gelding was "Fay Sand" owned by Bob Spain of College Station.

Performance class winners are as follows. "Sleepy Starlight", Champion Mare, also took Grand Champion honors in the Western Pleasure event. Barrel racing class winner was "Frosty Comanche" owned by John Woods of Midland. W.E. Hunter of Kermit owns the stake race winner, "Frosty Leo". 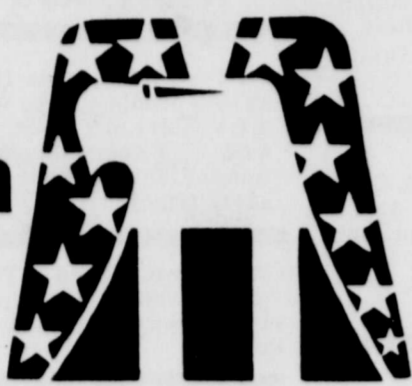

### Cub Scout News

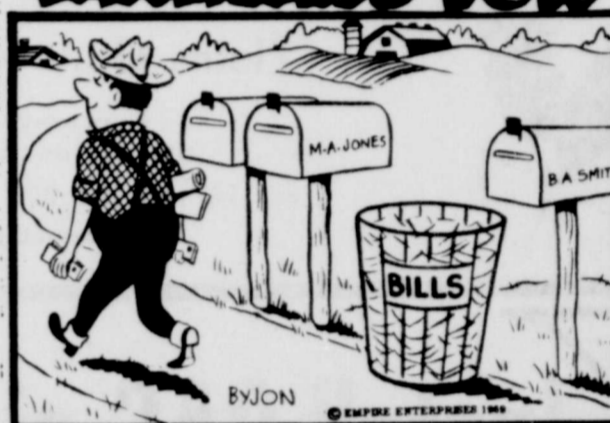

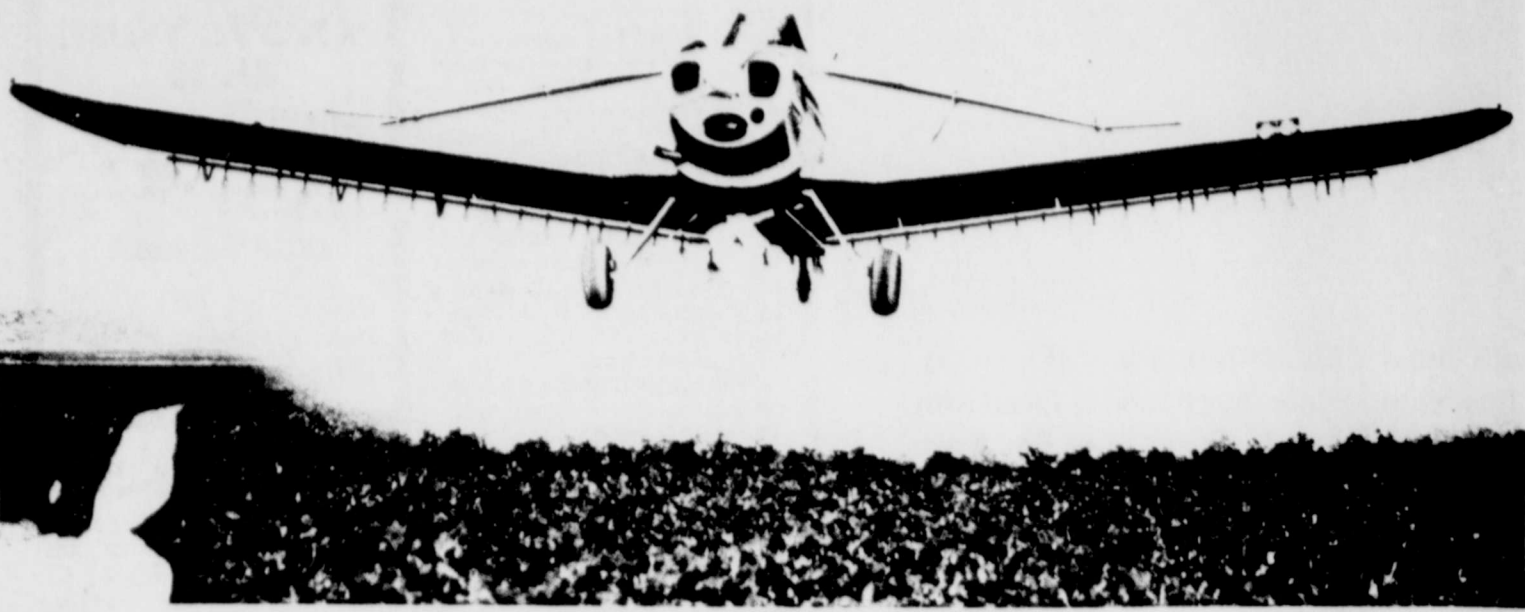
