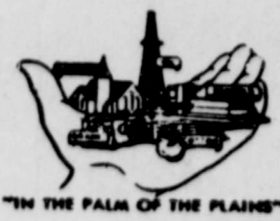

Antelopes End Football Season

TWO FLIPS 4-A Playoff Spot Goes To Lions

New Deal solved 4-A's log jam but it took two coin tosses Saturday to do so and the Lions are in the playoffs for the first time as a Class A school.

Vega will provide the opposition 7:30 p.m. Friday at Plainview.

Other playoffs include: Class AAA: Pampa vs. Hereford, 2 p.m. Saturday at Amarillo and Abilene Cooper at Wichita Falls, 2:30 p.m. Saturday.

Class AA: Littlefield vs. Roosevelt 7:30 p.m. Friday at Lovejoy Field, Lubbock; Lohmeyer vs. Alpine, 7:30 p.m. Friday at Crane; Phillips vs. Childress, 7:30 p.m. Friday at Amarillo; and Stamford vs. Eastland, 7:30 p.m. Friday at Abilene.

Class A: Plains vs. Iraan, 7:30 p.m. Saturday at Odessa.

New Mexico: Las Cruces Mayfield at Hobbs, 7:30 p.m. Friday; Las Vegas Robertson at Portales, 7:30 p.m. Friday.

Bula and Highland will clash in a six-man game at Sudan 7:30 p.m. Nov. 25 and eight-man victors Gail and Smyer will meet in Slaton Wednesday to decide on a date and site for their playoff.

New Deal, Petersburg and Crosbyton all came up tails the first flip Saturday but the Lions captured the playoff berth on the second flip. New Deal (17-3) had not been in the playoffs since 1962. And Vega (9-1) since 1967.

Hereford, (5-5), in the playoffs for the first time ever as a AAA school, had not been involved in post season play since 1968. Pampa (8-2), however, had not won district since 1950. Wichita Falls (10-0) is making its sixth consecutive appearance in the playoffs. Cooper (8-2) has been in the playoffs every odd year since 1967.

Littlefield (7-2-1) has not made an appearance in the playoffs since 1966 as a AAA team. Roosevelt (8-2) is making its initial march into post-season activities. Plains (7-3) has not been in the playoffs since 1965.

Mrs. Day was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. R.M. Hardesty, early day Abernathy residents.

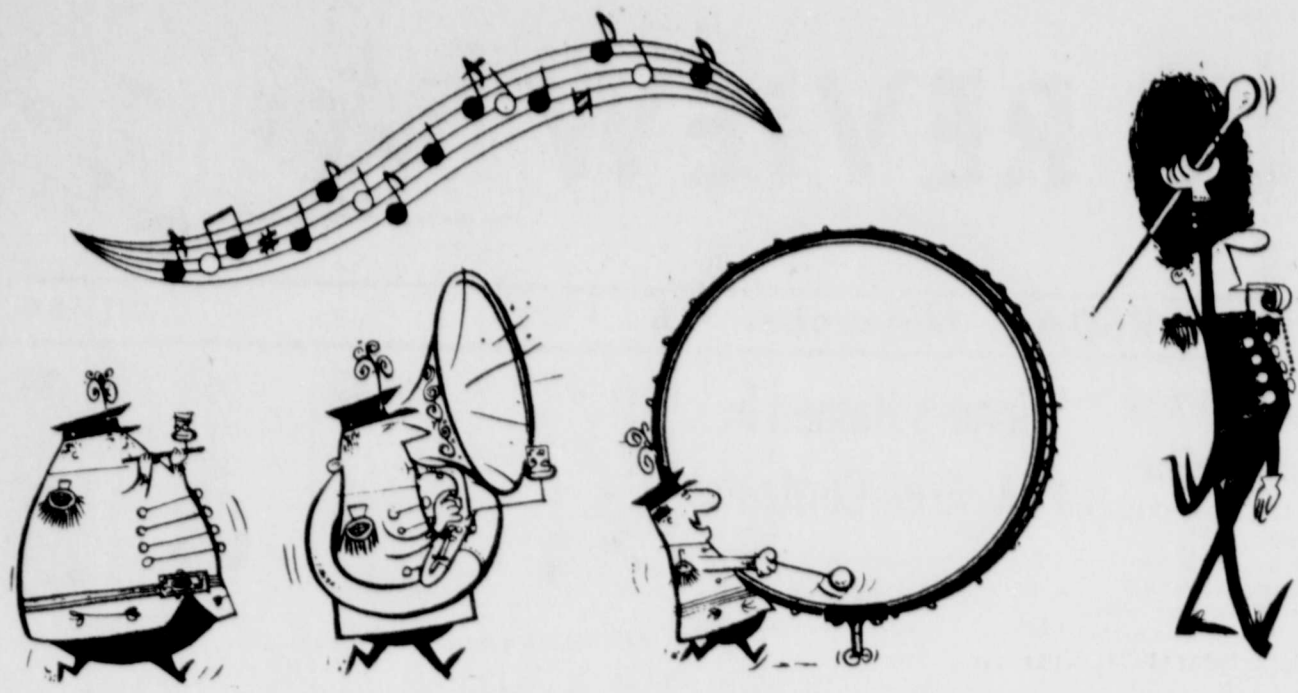

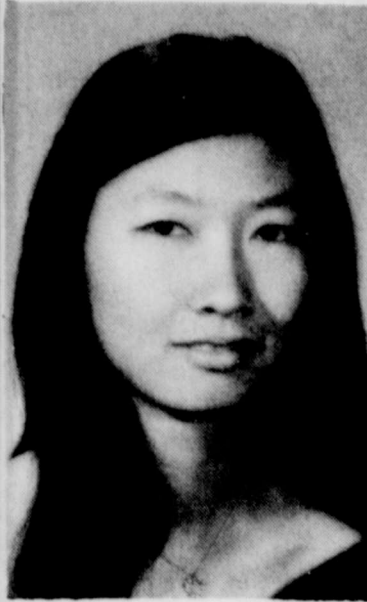

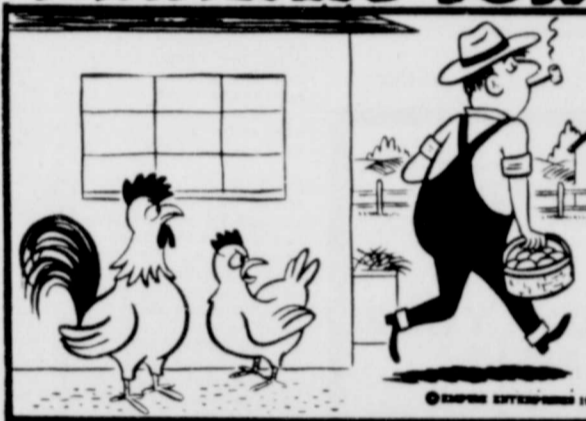
