Local Girls In Foods Event At Texas Tech
All the District II contestants in the annual District 4-H Food Show will display their favorite foods as "Foods for Special Occasions," which is the theme for the show. The date for the occasion will be April 8, with the judging entries beginning at 10:30 a.m., and the awards assembly starting at 2:30 p.m. in the University Center Ballroom at Texas Tech University. The contestants will be judged on their nutritional knowledge, place setting, daily menu, and record book. The awards are sponsored by ConAgra, the Gladiola Flour Company. This company also gives a \$500 scholarship to the high point senior individuals in each of the four food groups at the State Food Show.

All counties within the district will send four juniors and four seniors to the District contest. They will be entered in each of the four food groups: meat, milk, bread and cereal, and fruit and vegetable.

After the District Contest, senior winners from each food group will attend the State 4-H Food Show, which will be held at Texas A & M University during the summer. The juniors will not go to a state contest.

The junior winners from Hale County are as follows: Meat, Cheryl Rogers of Abernathy; Milk, Sharon Shumacher of Plainview; Bread and Cereal, Kerri McClendon of Abernathy; and Fruit and Vegetable, Melody Marshall of Hale Center. The senior winners are: Milk, Debbie Dulan of Plainview; Bread and Cereal, Kathe McClendon of Abernathy; Fruit and Vegetable, Denese Rhodes of Abernathy; and Meat, Rebecca Weil of Hale Center. All these girls will represent Hale County at the District II 4-H Food Show.

Voters Return Incumbents To City Council

Three Aldermen were re-elected to Abernathy City Council in light voting Saturday. Only 130 ballots were marked that day. Sixteen absentee ballots had been filed prior to the election.

Re-elected to Alderman positions on the City Council were M. S. (Morris) Stevens, with 116 votes; J. L. Miller, Jr., 112 votes; Billy F. Shipman, 104 votes.

Three others on the ballot received votes as follows: 42 for Hugh Hill, 33 for Henry Gean Nunn, and 31 for Ralph Hanes.

There were no write-in votes cast in the city election.

The school trustee and city elections were conducted by Ed Crow, election judge, Henry Struve, Mrs. Ed Crow, Mrs. O. F. Rea, Mrs. Arno Struve, Mrs. John Hale and Mrs. Harold McCune.

Trustees Re-elected

David Pinson, with 151 votes, and Joe B. Lovelace, with 144 votes, were re-elected members of the Abernathy School Board of Education in the annual trustee election held Saturday. In light balloting, only 143 persons voted Saturday in the school election. Eighteen absentee ballots were cast prior to the Saturday election.

The names of the two incumbents listed above were the only ones on the ballot. There were several write-in votes.

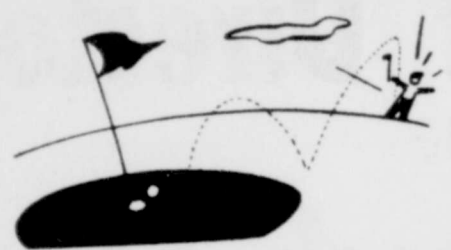

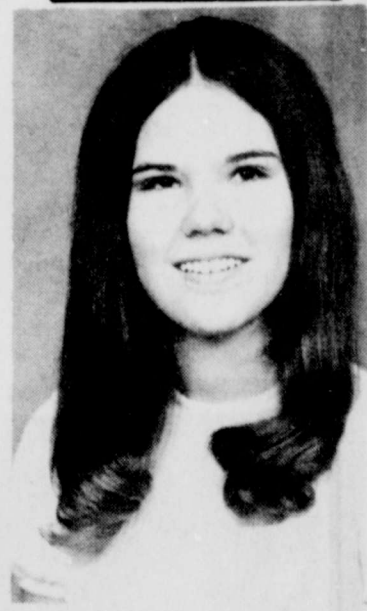

They are to be married June 3, 1972, in the First Church of the Nazarene in Lubbock.

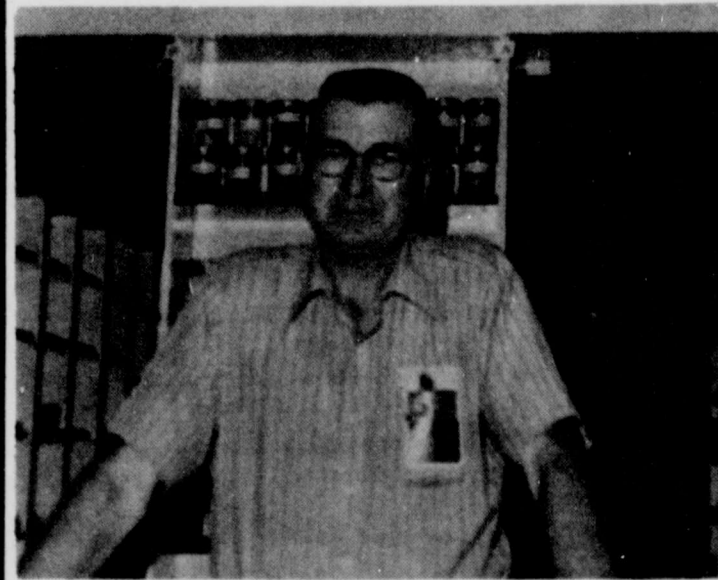
