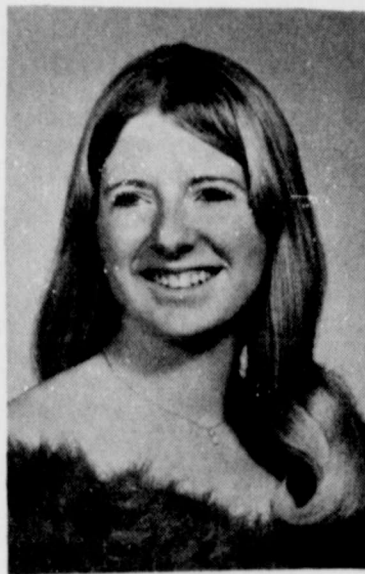

Rev. A. O. Brewer To Preach Here At First Baptist

Preaches Following 83rd Birthday

Rev. A. O. Brewer, of 711 4th Street, Abernathy, Texas, will bring the morning message at the First Baptist Church of Abernathy on Sunday, May 14, 1972. Bro. Brewer will be 83 years old on Saturday, May 13th, and his nephew-pastor, Murry L. Brewer, has asked him to once again proclaim God's message.

Bro. Brewer began preaching in 1921 when the Lilly Baptist Church in Collingsworth County licensed him to preach. He was ordained by the Bean Hill Baptist Church which was meeting in the Bean Hill School House in 1922. About a year later the Bean Hill Church and another church combined and organized the Midway Baptist Church northeast of Wellington, Texas. Bro. Brewer pastored this church for eleven years.

Bro. Brewer was then called to pastor the Riley Baptist Church, located ten miles southwest of Wellington, and was there about two years, then moved to the Sherry Baptist Church for two years and then pastored the New Hope Baptist Church, located fifteen miles northeast of Wellington for three years.

From the New Hope Church he moved to the plains of Texas and pastored four quarter-time churches around Dimmitt, Texas. These were the Cleo Baptist Church south of Dimmitt the Trio Baptist Church northwest of Dimmitt, the Y. L. Baptist Church close to Muleshoe, and the Goodland Baptist Church southwest of Muleshoe.

Bro. Brewer became pastor of the Finney Baptist Church north of Plainview, Texas, in 1940 and stayed until 1943, moving from there to the Lakewood Baptist Church northeast of Abernathy, Texas, where he pastored until his retirement in 1951.

His wife, Artie, was always the loving, helpful pastor's wife and was a great asset to his ministry. She was a very fine worker with children and played the piano in most of the churches where he was pastor. She passed away on September 12, 1970.

The First Baptist Church extends a special invitation to all who have a knowledge of Bro. A. O. Brewer to worship with us and hear this man of God as he preaches the Word on Sunday morning, May 14th, at 10:40 a. m.

School Board Meeting Report

The Board of Education of the Abernathy Independent School District met in regular session Monday, May 1, 1972, at 8:00 p. m. in the Board Room of the high school.

After approving the minutes of the previous meeting, the oath of office was given to Joe Lovelace and David Pinson for a period of three year terms as board members. The board was organized for the coming year with Mr. L. J. West as president; Billie Harrison, vice-president; Joe Lovelace, secretary. Holdover members are: Lon Carmickle, Joe Oswalt, and Bob Riley.

Items of business included (1) payment of bills, (2) studied the tax collection report which showed 97.96% of the taxes as having been collected, (3) examined budget progress report, (4) the lunchroom report, (5) school nurse report, and (6) the enrollment report which revealed a loss of 20 students during the month of April. The total enrollment in the schools now is 1,111, exclusive of Kindergarten.

The board studied insurance rates and recommended for the next three year period and noted an increase in premiums due to the Lubbock and other tornadoes in West Texas.

In other action, the board approved the following resignations: Bob Rascoe, Junior high boy's P.E. Patsy Mitchell, migrant teacher; Susan Hayes, second grade teacher; Kathy Terrazas, high school teacher. The board employed for 1972-73 school year, Mr. Mike Auld, teacher and assistant coach who is presently coaching at Frisco, Texas; he is a former player. Larry Zierlein from Fort Hays was employed as head junior high coach and teacher; he is a native of Kansas and completed his education at Fort Hays. Both men and their families will be moving to Abernathy in the last part of June or early July.

In other action, the board accepted a payment as a result of an anti-trust litigation behalf of two years ago on behalf of Texas Schools by the Attorney General of Texas and voted to enter into litigation with the state of Texas on price fixing of motor vehicles.

Discussed at length were the evaluation tax structures and building needs for the Abernathy School.

The board held a called Session Monday, May 8th to interview bonding agents for the purpose of preparing the school improvement this year. The next regularly scheduled meeting will be on June 5th, at 8:00 p. m.

All members were present at this meeting which includes: L. J. West, president; Billie Harrison, vice-president; Joe Lovelace, secretary; Lon Carmickle, Joe Oswalt, David Pinson; Bob Riley; Earl Carter, business manager, and Dr. Delwin Webb, superintendent.

Two Men Injured In Hale Center

Two separate shootings less than an hour apart early Sunday morning in Hale County left Michael Brown, 18, of Hale Center, and Francisco Perez, 27, of Abernathy, in "serious" condition Sunday night at Methodist Hospital in Lubbock.

Hale County sheriff deputies said two suspects were in custody in connection with the Brown shooting in Hale Center's east side, and would probably be charged with attempt to commit murder and carrying a prohibited weapon today.

No suspect was in custody in the Perez shooting.
