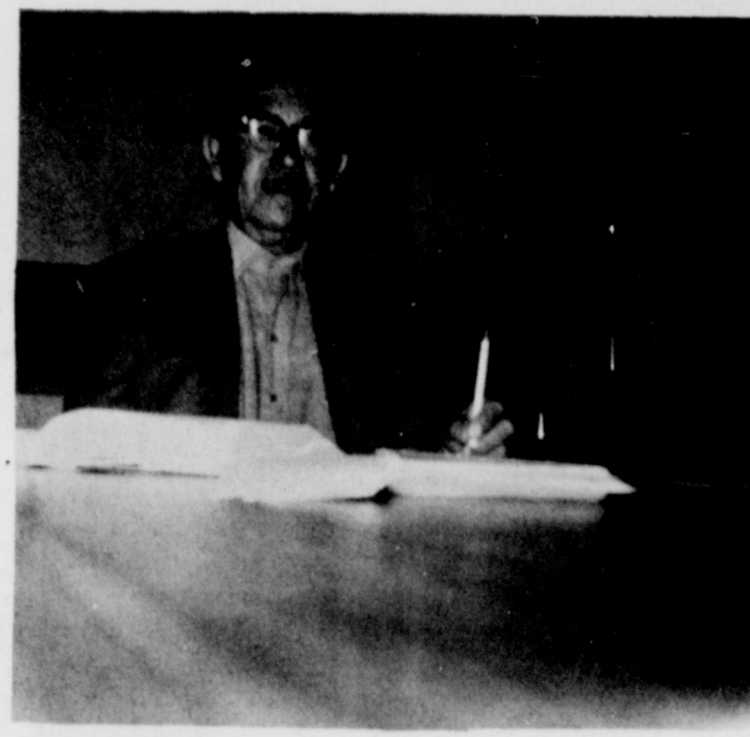


THIS PHOTO was made in the City Hall club room during the April meeting of the Sunshine Group. It shows the group during the luncheon held in connection with the meeting.
