Antelopes Meet Buffs Friday Night

Hearing For Hale Budget Slated

In brief activity Monday, Hale County Commissioners voted to set Sept. 25 as the date for a hearing on the 1973 budget.

The date was set at the recommendation of county auditor Larry Peckham and the action came at a regular court session.

Commissioners discussed upcoming talks with City of Plainview officials over a fire contract for 1972-73, but took no action. Judge Henry Heck said he had been in contact with several cities and counties to find out what type of arrangements are used in other areas.

Heck said he would ask for statistics from several other groups before talks with Plainview are started.

The contract between city and county expires on Sept. 30. Under the current contract, the city of Plainview provides fire protection service to Hale County areas around Plainview outside the city limits.

At issue for several years has been the amount Hale County pays the city for the service.

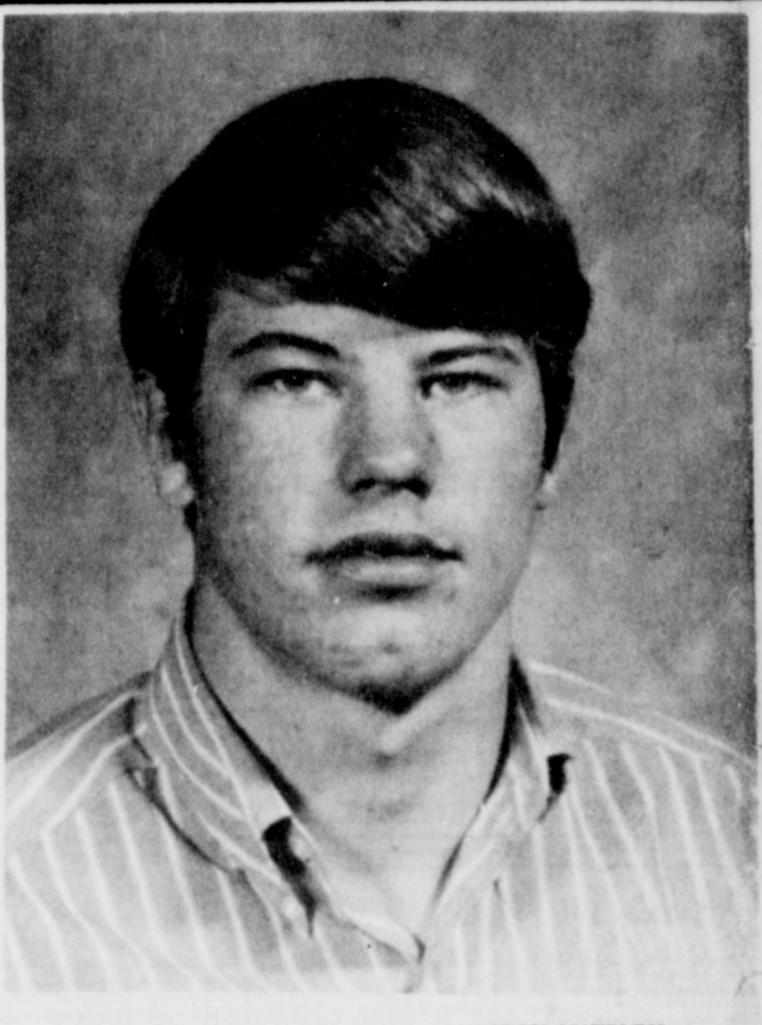
Discuss Easements

In the only other major activity of the session, commissioners met in a closed session with County Attorney Van Stovall to discuss easements for several tracts of land along Running Water Draw.

The easements are needed for work to begin on construction of a conservation and flood control project along the draw.

In the past, commissioners have discussed condemnation proceedings to complete easements needed for the project and said last year proceedings would begin near the first of 1972.

However, appraisal of land and other legal problems have delayed any further action.

Honda Co-op Education Program Report

(By Gld B. Adkisson, Director)

Classes are being organized and actual instruction is beginning in the HONDA CO-OP Comprehensive Education Program. All teachers have been employed for each of the four schools - Hale Center, Olton, New Deal, and Abernathy.

One aspect of this program that is new to all four schools is the Early Childhood Program. Through this program, any child with any type of handicap, from age three through age five, is eligible to receive help from the school. Parents of handicapped children in this age bracket are asked to contact school officials for further information.

Also new, and being offered in the Hale Center and Abernathy Schools is a work-study program for high school students. In this program, students attend school part time and work part time. This enables them to earn credits toward graduation while learning a trade. Students in these programs have been selected and the supervisors of the programs in each school are seeking places of employment for their students.

We feel that, overall, the program is getting off to a smooth start. The teachers and principals have been enthusiastic and very cooperative. As soon as time permits, an individual educational plan will be made for each student in the program. This program is a big step forward for the schools involved.

Deadline for entries in the national open contest is Sept. 20, according to chairman Benni Dunn Evans of 3601 40th St., Lubbock.

A sweetheart of the festival will be named from 8 by 10 glossy black and white photographs submitted prior to midnight Aug. 31. Photos cannot be returned.

Several hundred contestants from throughout the Southwest are expected to compete, vying for first, second and third place trophies. High point awards and team trophies also will be presented.

Group events include military corps, show corps, parade corps, dance twirl team, twirling teams, twirling duets, strutting duets and twirling trios.

Solo events scheduled include Miss West Texas Majorette, beginner fancy strutting, advanced fancy strutting, beginner basic strutting, advanced basic strutting, beginner solo, intermediate and advanced solo, boys' solo, parade majorette, two baton, flag, hoop, beginner military strutting and advanced military strutting.

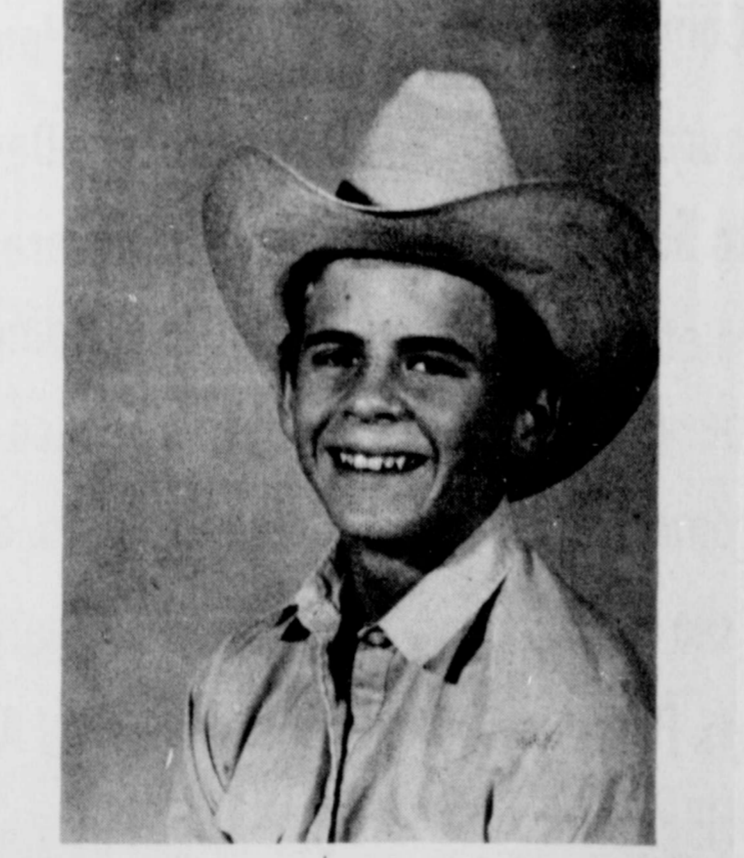
Proceeds from the game will be used for financing Shrine hospitals, the Center for treating burns, located in Galveston, and the Shrine Crippled Children's Hospital.
