A Vernon attorney, Hightower was also named to the Finance Committee, its Subcommittee on Appropriations,

and the Natural Resources Committee.

Hightower received his committee appointments Wednesday (Sept. 20) during the 4th Called Session of the 62nd Legislature. Under the new Senate Rules, Senate members may only serve on 3 committees, and the number of standing committees has been reduced from 27 to 9.

City Sales Tax Return For '72 Period Declines

AUSTIN — The City of Plainview's share of city sales taxes collected in the three months ended June 30, 1972, was \$3,000 less than the amount the city earned in the same period in 1971.

State Comptroller Robert S. Calvert sent a check for \$91,182.20 for second quarter of 1972 sales taxes, after deducting two per cent of the total levied in Plainview as the state's cost of collecting the one per cent city sales tax. In the June, 1971, quarter, the city's take was \$34,260.

State remittances to other cities in the Hale County area which have the local tax, with year - ago collections in parentheses: Abernathy, \$6,249 (\$6,716); Earth, \$2,456 (\$3,829); Floydada, \$10,164 (\$11,980); Hale Center, \$3,840 (\$3,803); Hart, \$2,679 (\$2,832); Olton, \$5,740 (\$6,049); Petersburg, \$2,570 (\$3,767); Tulia, \$18,410 (\$20,080).
