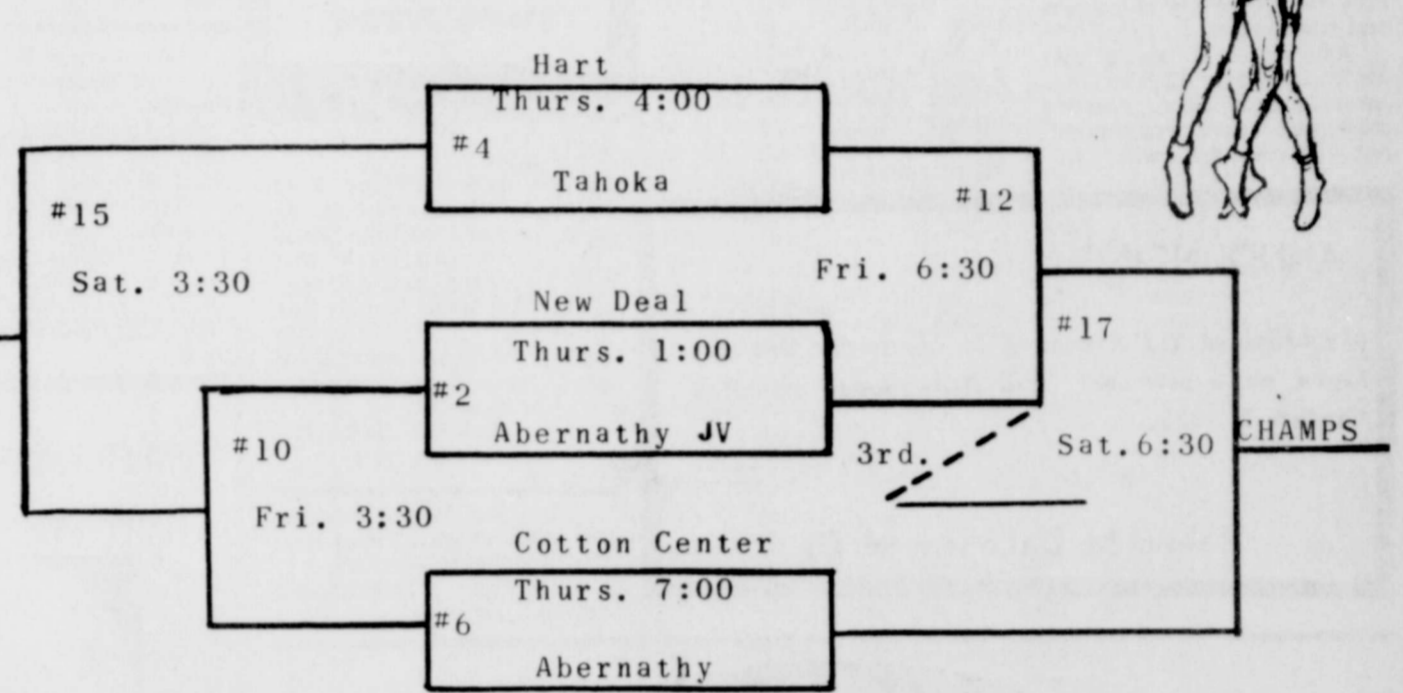
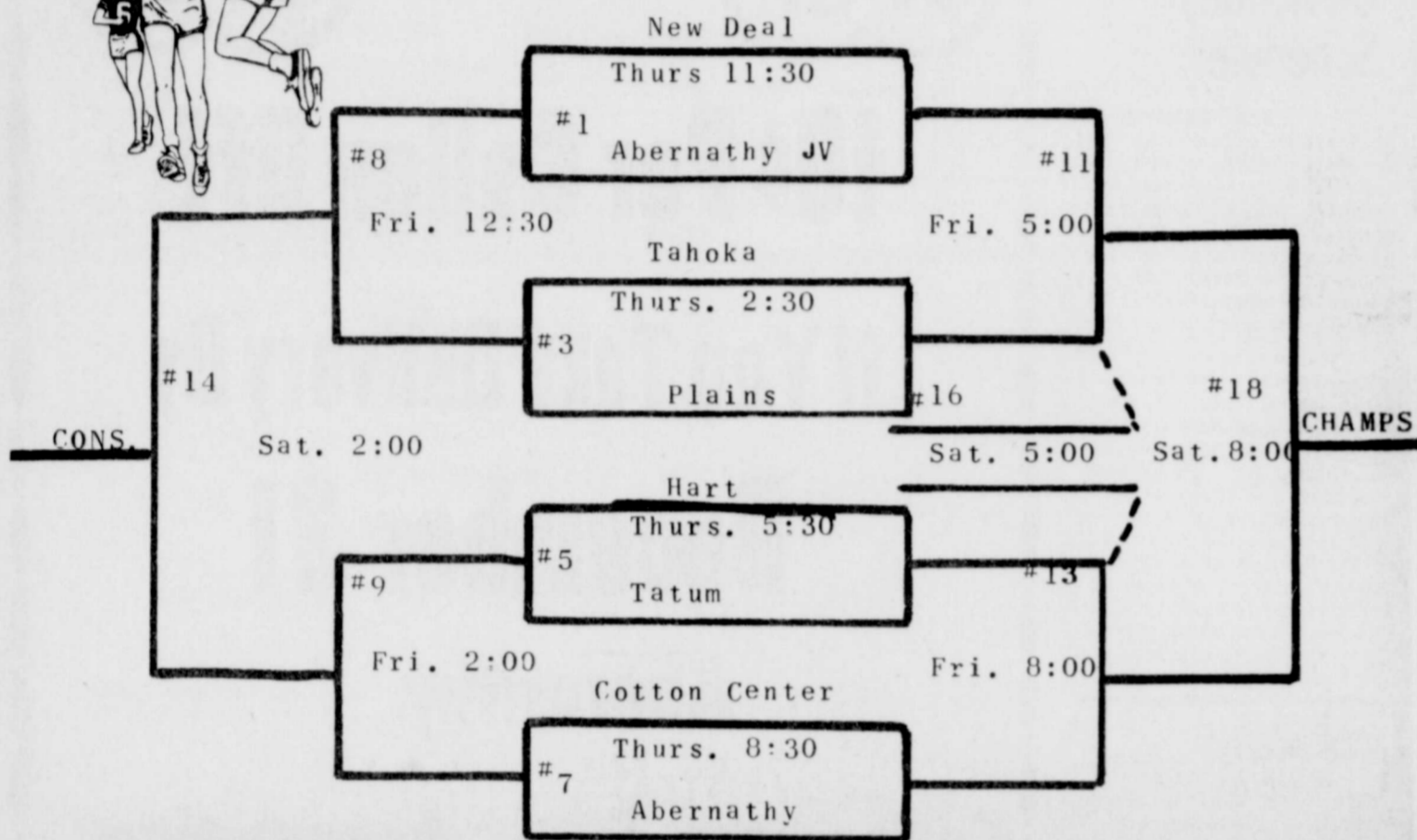

**CALLED MEETING ALSO IS HELD**

November 27, 1972

Bids for the construction of the underground Junior High School and academic center will be opened December 21, 1972, at 4:00 p.m. in room 117 of the High School. The date was set by the Board of Education in a special meeting November 27. Before setting the date, Mr. Brasher, Mr. McKay, and Mr. Whiteley, architects, oriented the board on all phases of the proposed building program including structural, electrical, and mechanical specifications. At the same meeting bids were also opened and the purchase made of a pick-up truck for the agriculture department. The low bid was awarded to Don's Chevrolet of Abemathy. Meeting in regular session on December 4, the board

heard reports on tax collection (84.9%), budget programs, enrollment, health, and lunchroom.

Action items on the agenda included the requisition of one new 60 passenger bus for the 1973 school year, charging for Junior High athletic events beginning in 1973, and the purchase of new basketball backboards for the Junior High gymnasium.

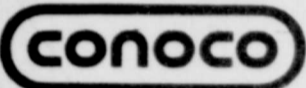
