## Street Paving Project Plans Are Announced

The Abernathy City Council met in regular session at 7:30 p.m., May 14, 1973, at City Hall.

Permission was granted to the City Manager to advertise for bids for Aerial Mosquito Spraying this summer.

The 1973 Paving Program was reviewed and City Engineer Bennett Reeves of Parkhill, Smith & Cooper was on hand to discuss various phases of the program. The present status of the program is to recontact those parties who have expressed interest in paving particular streets. The engineer has prepared unit estimates and assessment rolls which will inform each individual property owner of their total cost. Upon notification each property owner will be required to sign one of two forms which will indicate the desire of the property owner. One form will require the property owner to agree that upon the letting of a contract for the street paving program they will execute a note payable to such Contractor and a Mechanic's and Materialman's Lien Contract covering the property of the signee which will secure payment of such Note as established in the Paving Policies.

All property owners who have expressed interest in the 1973 Paving Program should be recontacted in the near future.

A Proposed Ordinance amending Ordinance 142 (Non-Resident Water Users Ordinance) was tabled pending further study.

A request from Consumers' Fuel Association to relocate certain overhead fuel storage tanks was approved by the City Council.

## 'NEW' IS THE WORD FOR SUMMER BASEBALL PROGRAM

"New" is the word for Abernathy baseball this year. Under new leadership things are taking on a new look. The parks, for instance, have been improved and reworked to the extent that there is none better in this area. The Little League park has had the bleachers repaired and painted, the mound and the diamond area have been reworked to look almost professional, the location of the scoreboard was moved to a more visual position and the concession stand was repainted as were the dugouts and backstops.

New teams were added to the Little and Pony Leagues. This makes five freshman teams (Little League) and two sophomore teams (pony).

New leagues have been formed for our 13-14 year-olds and 15-16 year-olds. In the 13-14 age ophomore league there will be eight teams from six towns. And in the 15-16 age

New uniforms will be worn by all leagues from the freshman league and up. Sponsorships for each team were sold and, thus, we were able to purchase the uniforms without using our regular expense money.

New leadership in the Midget League, along with a few new coaches, has sparked new enthusiasm and new ideas into that league. The Midget Park has also been greatly improved.

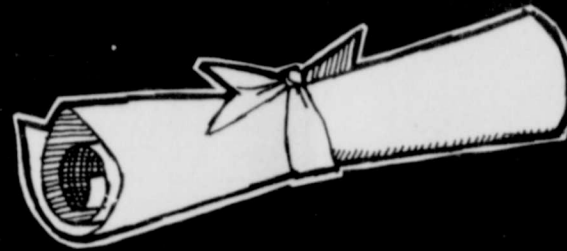

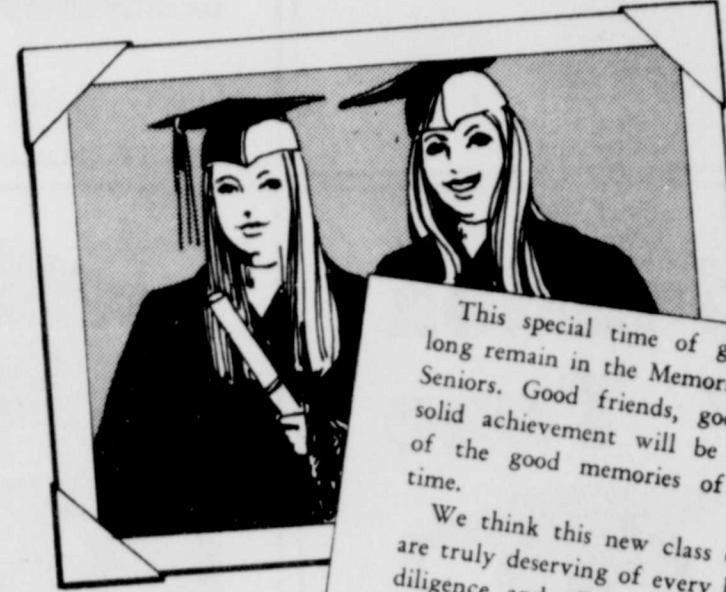

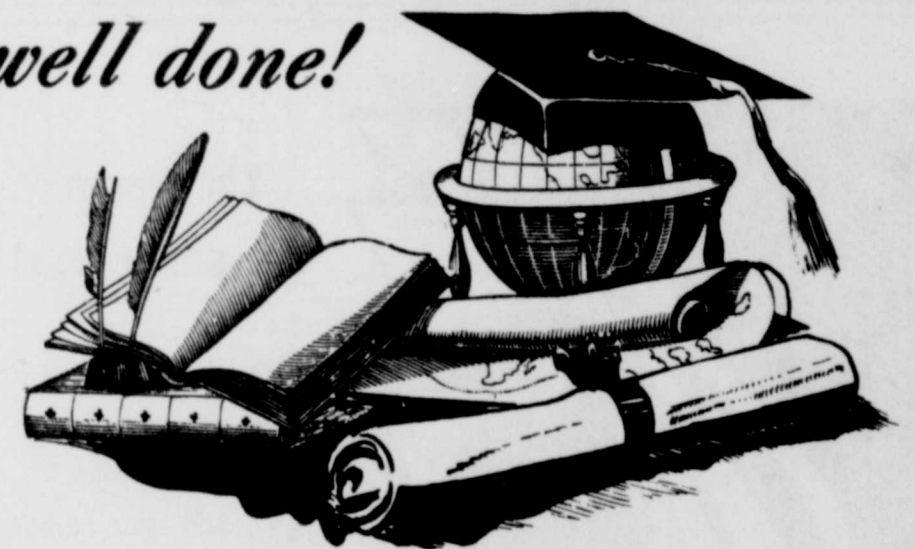

The Texas Highway Department will conduct a public hearing on June 1, 1973, at 7:30 p.m., in the Abernathy High School Auditorium for the purpose of discussing the construction of Interstate 27 from 1.5 miles north of Monroe Overpass to 0.5 miles north of north city limits of Hale Center in Lubbock and Hale Counties.

The proposed highway project will pass through the towns of New Deal, Abernathy and Hale Center.




