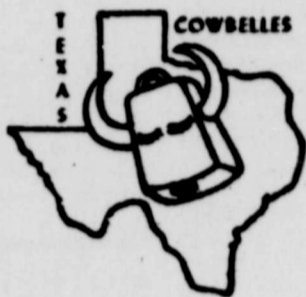

Academic Center May Be Showplace For Educators

The Abernathy Academic Center has been nominated as a possible participant in the 1975 state-wide network of demonstration schools. The invitation was presented and accepted by the board of education at its regular meeting on June 3rd. If selected, the school would be visited by many educators throughout the state to see innovative projects in action. From approximately 5,000 schools, only 50 invitations are extended each year.

An action item of the board included the acceptance of 32 student transfers from adjoining school districts for 1974-75 school year. Regular reports included budget progress report, tax report showing 98.64% of taxes collected and enrollment report and health report. On the luncheon report, it was revealed that the luncheon operated without a deficit for the third consecutive year. It was pointed out that due to a lack of commodities a study will have to be made to determine luncheon prices for 1974-75.

Resignations were accepted from Bill and Donajean Caffey, Pat and Beverly Love and Jerry Bartley. Employed for the 1974-75 school year were: Delbert Dearing, Jr. High coach; Kay Dearing, elementary teacher; and Donna Beights, speech therapy.

Also discussed were summer repairs including the building of a new press box and remodeling of two rooms in the intermediate building into a vocational education for the handicapped area. This new program will train students in commercial cooking and sewing operations.

ATTEND YOUTH CONFERENCE

CROP DISEASE AND INSECT CLINIC SET

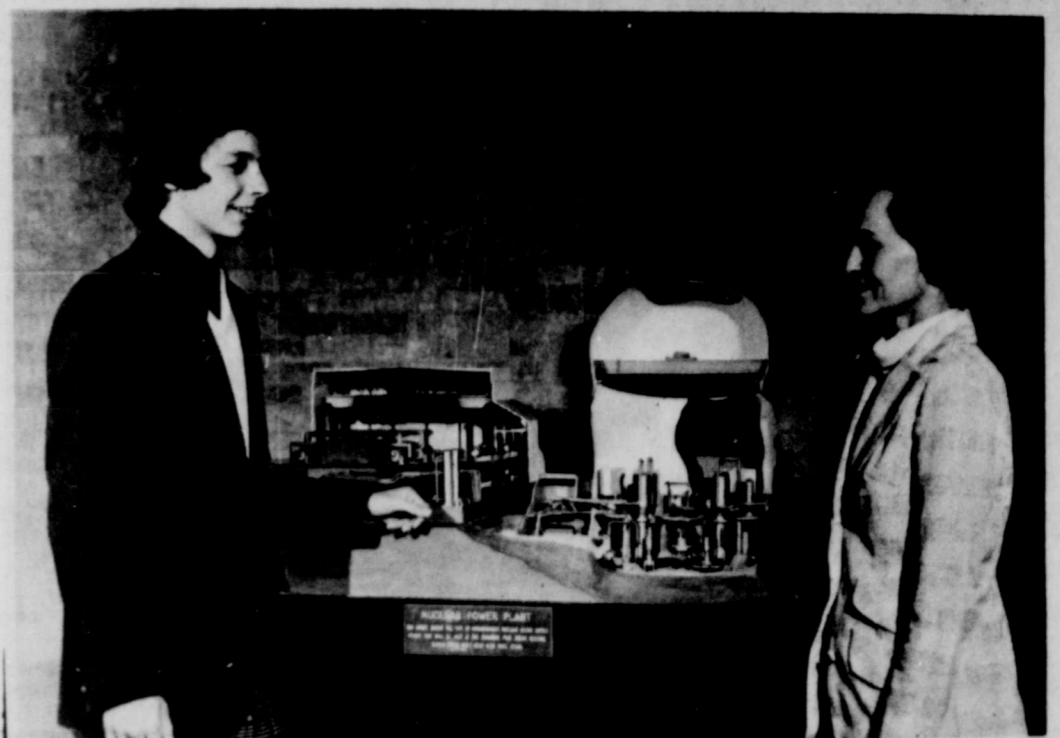
