The passing department accounted for 3 antelopes touchdowns. Ken Hendrix had 3 receptions and 1-11 yard touchdown pass. Joe Gonzales had 1 reception of 15 yards for a touchdown. Mickey Davis had 3 receptions to move out the passing.

## Open House Is Held At Jones Power Station

Approximately 50 representatives of area newspapers, radio and television stations were guests of Southwestern Public Service Company last Thursday evening at a dinner and pre-open house tour of Jones Station near Lubbock. A number of the company's executives, district officers, and local manager were also present.

The electric company's largest generating plant, located southeast of Lubbock on FM Road 3020, just west of Buffalo Springs Lake, was open to the public Saturday and Sunday, Nov. 16 and 17, to show off its second 250,000 kilowatt generating unit which was completed and put on the line in July of this year. The plant now has a total generating capability of 512,000 kilowatts.

Notables on the program prior to the guided tour included executive vice president Earl Springer, vice president George Dupree, vice president of engineering and design H. O. Hodson, and plant manager Floyd Starks.

Areas included on the tour were the boiler room, the turbine and generating area, the control room (where closed-circuit television is used to view the fire in the boilers), and the water treatment and recylent plant.

Representing Abernathy at the occasion was Dave Cavitt, local SWPS manager, and Richard Havers.

Abernathy is also well represented within the working area of the plant, as several former TUGO plant employees are now employed at Jones Station. These include Harold McCune, W.R. (Pete) Knox, Glenn Selke, Joe Du-an Smith, also employed there are George Hughes, who now resides at Slaton, and Harold Williams and Louis Stclair of Lubbock, they were formerly employed at TUGO.

## COTTON HARVEST BEGINS IN AREA

First bales of cotton from the 1974 cotton crop were delivered to area cotton gins last week. The bales were ginned free and other considerations given farmers who delivered the first bales.

Following is first-bale news in order of sequence as reported to The Review.

Tim Barton delivered two bales of cotton to Martin Gin & Fertilizer Co. Nov. 13. He had on 4,720 pounds of seed cotton that produced 1,090 pounds of lint and 1,960 pounds of seed. Ray Martin Gin & Fertilizer is located three miles north and seven miles west of Abernathy on FM 54.

Tom Johnson delivered the first bale of 1974 cotton to County Line Co-op Gins Nov. 13. He had on 2,350 pounds of seed cotton that produced 500 pounds of lint and 930 pounds of seed. The cotton ginned with a 38 micronaire count for it is 3.87.

N. M. Rogers owned the first 1974 cotton ginned at White Gold Gin in Abernathy, Nov. 15. He had on 2,400 pounds of seed cotton that produced 450 pounds of lint and 900 pounds of seed. The cotton was from an area that sustained heavy hail damage August 28.

The Waits Brothers delivered some cotton to City Gin in Abernathy Nov. 12. The total brought in by Waits Brothers for the first bale at City Gin was 1,640 pounds of seed, some picked, that produced 455 pounds of lint and 800 pounds of seed.

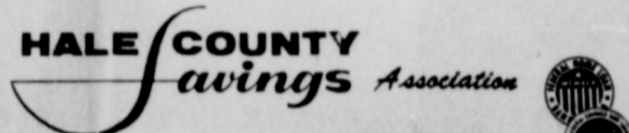

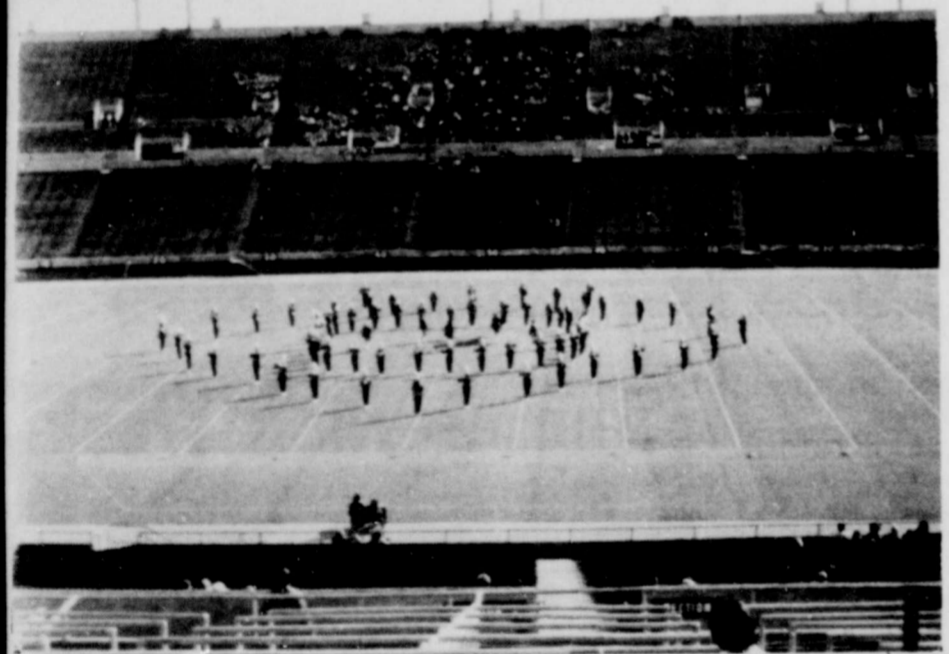
