


REVIVAL SET AT ST. ISIDORE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Museum Planners

Mrs. Jess Wayne (Iva Jean) West and John Skaggs display the architect's drawing of the planned Llano Estacado Museum to be constructed on the Wayland campus. The two are coordinating the fund drive to raise the final \$100,000 to cover construction costs.

"The proposed \$700,000 Llano Estacado Museum and Regional Heritage Center promises to be one of the showcase projects of the Bicentennial, not only for Hale County, but also for the state of Texas," according to Dr. Gwin Morris, member of the Llano Estacado Museum Advisory Board and executive director of the American Studies Institute of the Southwest

A campaign to raise the additional \$100,000 necessary for the museum's construction was launched last week when bids for contractors exceeded

previous estimates. Endorsed by the American Revolution Bicentennial Committee of Plainview, the seventh community to be named a Texas Bicentennial

City, the museum is a joint project of the Hale County Historical Society and Wayland Baptist College to build a regional heritage center for

Hale County. When completed, the building will house office space for the Historical Society, storage and exhibit preparation space, small conference facilities, and exhibit

Scheduled for completion in early 1976, the museum will draw visitors to Hale County as part of the Bicentennial celebration, Dr. Morris said. "Among projects across the state, it will rank as one of the major projects to be completed in honor of the 200th birthday of the United States. "

Plans now are being com-

pleted for the permanent and temporary exhibits which will interpret the heritage of the United States, Texas, the Llano Estacado, and Hale County.

Among these will be special exhibits on the Plainview archeological site and its relation to early man in North America: on the Comancheros, the middlemen who carried on the lucrative trade between the Indians of the Llano and Mexico: on early Hale County pioneers such as Horatio Graves, Z. T. Max-well and E. L. Lowe, R. P. Smyth, Thornton Jones, and J. H. Wayland.





Hale County Home Is Donated To Tech

-The gift of a two-and-ahalf story home to the Ranch Headquarters was announced Monday night, Nov. 18, when more than 400 members of the Ranch Headquarters Association met at The Museum of Texas Tech University to hear a progress report and comments by western actor Dale Robertson.

The home was bequeathed to the Ranch Headquarters by the late Josephine Waddell Barton of Hale County. It was built in 1909 by Joseph James Barton, and it had been her home from the day she married Joseph's son, Jack Sneed Barton, in 1917.

When the house is moved to the Ranch Headquarters it will depict the era of the elegant home, after ranchers had built their industry to prosperity. Some ranchers who
