LUBBOCK -- The date of initiation of negotiations established for Interstate Highway 27 from the Hale County Line to one mile south of F. M. 37 was December 4, 1974. Any landowner or tenant may be eligible for certain relocation assistance such as moving cost and replacement housing payments. Any occupant contemplating moving should, to insure eligibility for moving and replacement housing payments, notify the State before moving. All owner-occupants in order to be eligible for relocation benefits must sell to the State.
