er.

Then Mr. Lutrick gave a
short history of his school
days. His family came here
in 1891 from Henderson Co.
and brought their doggies
with them. It wasn't long
before there were enough
children to have a school in
the community. The first
school was in a dugout. One
day they were having classes
and a rattlesnake crawled
out across the floor. He didn't
say what they did, but if I
had been there I would have
got out of there in a hurry

and yelling at a table across

she yelled and he left it, but
some time when she wasn't
looking Blanch Coggin slip-
ped it off her plate and Eliza-

while Blanch covered the pie
with a napkin. Mr. Knox got
so tickled he could hear him
laughing too. The Brewsters

LUBBOCK -- The date of
initiation of negotiations es-
tablished for Interstate High-
way 27 from the Hale County
Line to one mile south of F.
M. 37 was December 4, 1974.
Any landowner or tenant may
be eligible for certain re-
location assistance such as
moving cost and replacement
housing payments. Any oc-
cupant contemplating mov-
ing should, to insure eligi-
bility for moving and replace-
ment housing payments, notify
the State before moving.
All owner-occupants in order
to be eligible for relocation
benefits must sell to the State.
A brochure describing the re-
location assistance program
can be obtained from the
Texas Highway Department
District Office located at 601
Slaton Road, P. O. Box 771,
Lubbock, Texas 79408. No
person shall be displaced un-
less, and until adequate re-
placement housing is avail-
able.
