ABERNATHY LITTLE DRIBBLERS TEAMS TO COMPETE IN STATE TOURNAMENT

Abernathy's Minor and Senior Division All-Star girls will compete for State Little Dribblers honors next week in Dalhart as they meet Regional Champion teams from Idalou, Littlefield, Crosbyton, Seminole, Crowell and Dalhart at the state tournament, June 2-5. The local nine and ten year old All Stars took the Minor Division Regional Championship last weekend at the Regional Tournament held at Springlake-Earth, with a 43-7 win over the host team in the final round of the tourney.
