Tabulations early Wednesday morning indicated that Jimmy Carter will be the next president of the United States, with still some votes yet to be tabulated.

Hale County picked Carter by 5,580 to 5,397 for Ford, while Lubbock County's incomplete county showed Ford leading by 32,702 to 22,338.

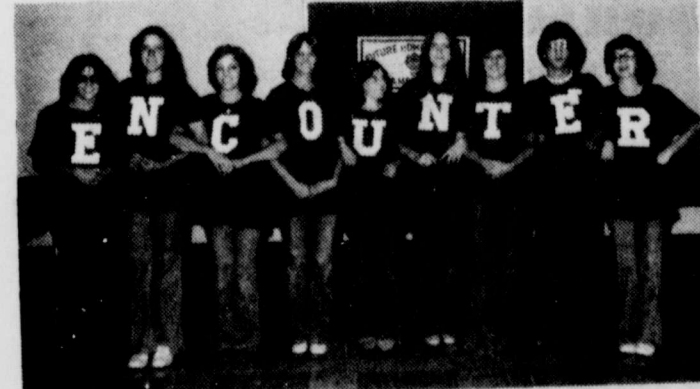

OCTOBER SNOWFALL BREAKS AREA RECORDS SINCE 1911

The snow we received here last week was the most ever recorded in October since the weather bureau began keeping records in 1911.

A report from Dorothy Deering shows we received 1 1/2" of moisture from Oct. 29, and if it all had stayed on the ground and not melted so fast would probably have had 10 to 12 inches of snow.

ANTELOPES "SLIP" TO 0-2 IN CONFERENCE RACE WITH MUDDY 14-0 LOSS TO FLOYDADA WHIRLWINDS

The Floydada Whirlwinds managed to whip up enough of a breeze Saturday night to defeat the Antelopes 14-0.

The contest regularly scheduled for Friday night had to be played Saturday due to poor weather condition. The one day delay and wet field seemed to effect the performances of both teams.

After a couple of costly penalties by the Lopes with 5:59 left in the 1st quarter, Floydada scored their first TD of the night on a 10 yard pass. Extra point was good. The score read 7-0.

Lee McCune saved another Whirlwind TD late in the second quarter, when he intercepted a pass on the 5 yard line. The half ended on a sluggish note 7-0.

II HALF

The third quarter saw Floydada score its second TD of the contest on a 75 yard run from scrimmage, extra point was good and the Winds led 14-0 with 9:10 left in the quarter.

The Antelopes got a few breaks late in the third quarter but were unable to turn them into points.

The Antelope defense came alive midway through the fourth quarter, coming up with a fumble recovery on the 37 yard line giving the offense good field position. The Lopes moved the ball to the 2 yard line, where Roddy Shipman pass was intercepted in the end zone, spoiling the threat.

The Lopes had one other opportunity late in the game,

but Floydada had other idea and picked off their second interception of the night on the 1 yard line.

Neither team could develop any type of threatening moves, and the game ended 14-0 in favor of Floydada.

BILLY CARTER VISITS IN ABERNATHY

Billy Carter, younger brother of Democratic Presidential Candidate Jimmy Carter, paid a brief visit to Abernathy on Thursday, October 28.

After arriving at the Lubbock Regional Airport and stopping by New Deal, Carter and his party were met by Mayor Pete Thompson in Abernathy.

They had lunch at Graham's Restaurant where they met informally with a group of approximately 50 residents of the Abernathy area. Mayor Thompson introduced Billy Carter to the gathering and invited them to address questions to him on the campaign issues. Carter assured everyone that he was not "the Carter brother who never told a lie" and that he was a farmer and not a speech-maker. During the question and answer session the following questions were brought up.

Q. What is Jimmy Carter's position on gun control legislation?

A. He favors gun control laws, for handguns, pistols, the Saturday Night Specials, not your rifles and shotguns.

Q. Does Jimmy Carter have anyone in mind for Secretary of Agriculture?

A. I don't know who will be the next Secretary of Agriculture, but it will be a farmer and not a college professor.

Q. What is Jimmy Carter's position on medical services?

A. I don't know for sure, but he did talk to a group of doctors recently and they did not like what he said, so it was bound to be good.

Q. Does Jimmy Carter favor repealing laws in some states which allows the open shop?

A. Jimmy has said he will sign the bill if it is passed by Congress, but he does not favor repeal of right to work laws.

Q. Does Jimmy Carter favor importation of water into West Texas?

A. Jimmy Carter is aware of water problems over the nation and Frank Moore is his advisor on this areas water problems.

Q. Why is Chavez of the United Farm Workers backing Jimmy Carter?

A. Because he thinks Jimmy is the lesser of two evils.

Q. Does Jimmy Carter favor breaking up the major oil companies?

A. Yes, in order to keep the big companies from putting the small independent service stations out of business.

Carter predicted his brother would be elected president on November 2. After visiting with some of the local Carter supporters he returned to Lubbock where he met with Young Democrats at a reception on the Texas Tech Campus, and attended a barbeque at the Plains Co-op Oil Mill on Thursday night.
