### Vocational Agriculture Students Place In Texas Tech University Contest

LUBBOCK--A team of vocational agriculture students from Abernathy won 3 places in Texas Tech Vocational Agriculture competition Saturday (April 23) in the 50th annual Texas Tech University Vocational Agriculture Judging Contest.

Approximately 1,700 students participated in 11 competitive events held in the Agricultural Sciences departments of animal science, food technology, plant and soil science, and agricultural engineering and technology.

Six events served as elimination contests for Future Farmers of America Areas I and II. These were judging contests in livestock, dairy cattle, milk and dairy foods, poultry, meats and in agricultural mechanics skills.

Contests in cotton, wool, crops, land and range, and pasture plants were Texas Tech contests, held because of their importance to the West Texas economy.

Prof. Lev M. Hargrave of the Texas Tech agricultural education faculty was superintendent of the events.

Winners from Abernathy, included: Cotton Judging Team; Micah Blacklock, David Brightbill, and Joe Jack Connell.

This team places First in Area I. The Abernathy team was First in stapling, and Fourth in cotton grading.

First in District. Micah was the 10th high individual in the contest.

Abernathy FFA Wool Judging Team placed First in District, Second in Area I, Tenth in Texas Tech contests. Team members were Jeff Oswald, Michael Hardin, and Danny Williamson. Lynn Dudenising and Travis Hall student teachers from Texas Tech assisted with training the teams.

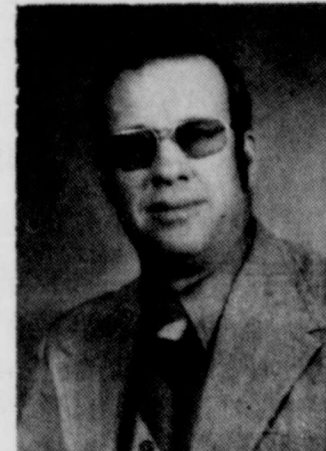
