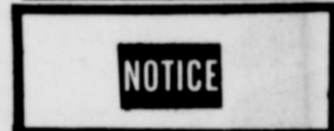

**TRAFFIC SIGNS TO CHANGE HERE**

Within the near future there will be many changes in traffic signs. **Firemen Make Run Tuesday**

A 10,000-gallon liquid petroleum storage tank ruptured and firemen were called to the scene about 2:30 p. m. Tuesday. The tank, one of three, is located northeast of the Abernathy Co-op Grain complex. The tanks belong to Abernathy Consumers Fuel Association and are used to store gasoline and other liquid petroleum products. A tank truck at the site when the rupture occurred was pulled away from the scene by a fire truck using an extra long cable to keep from having to start the tank truck engine in the heavy fumes. The firemen remained on the scene for a considerable length of time while the liquid leaked from the tank and was absorbed by the soil around the tank complex.

The Rev. Mike Struve was appointed to serve the Wesley United Methodist Church in Borger. (See the Methodist News in this paper for further information on Mike.)

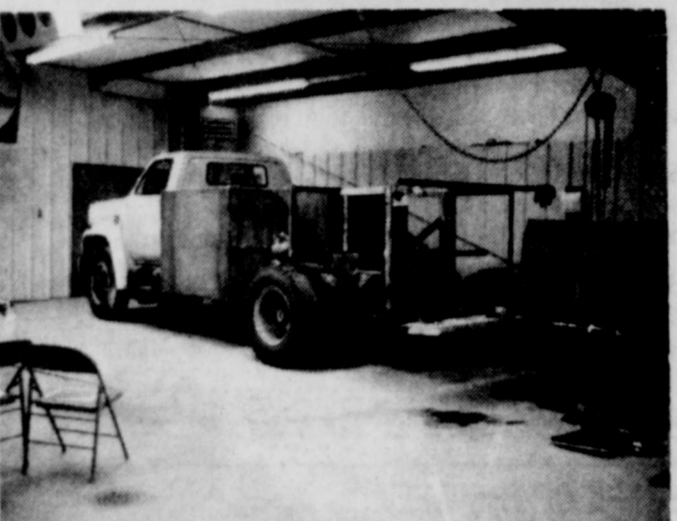

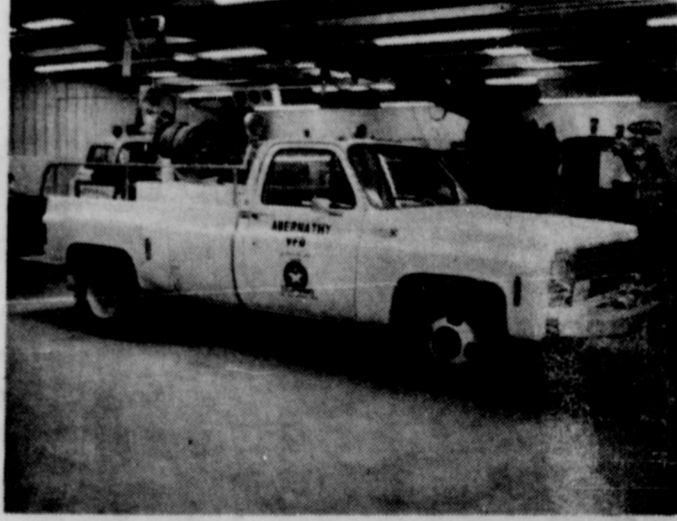
FIRE TRUCK in the making. Abernathy Volunteer Firemen are building a fire truck from the chassis up, from the cab to the rear. At the time this photo was made, a 1000-gallon water tank was being welded together. A pump will be built and connected, and the truck will be outfitted with all the other equipment to make it a servicable, efficient fire truck. When completed, this truck will be principally used for fires in the rural area and/or in town when the fire scene is too far from a fire plug. The equipment is being constructed in the fire station.


### Hale and Lubbock Counties Eligible For Drouth Relief

Congressman George Mahon was advised late today by the Federal Interagency Drought Emergency Coordinating Committee that 46 additional Texas counties have been approved for emergency drought assistance. The following 11 counties in the 19th Congressional District have

been designated: Hale, Lubbock, Gaines, Ector, Dawson, Castro, Andrews, Yukum, Palmitin, Midland, and Martin.

The designation does not mean that assistance will be available. It is necessary for applicants to qualify on an individual basis through the appropriate local agency.

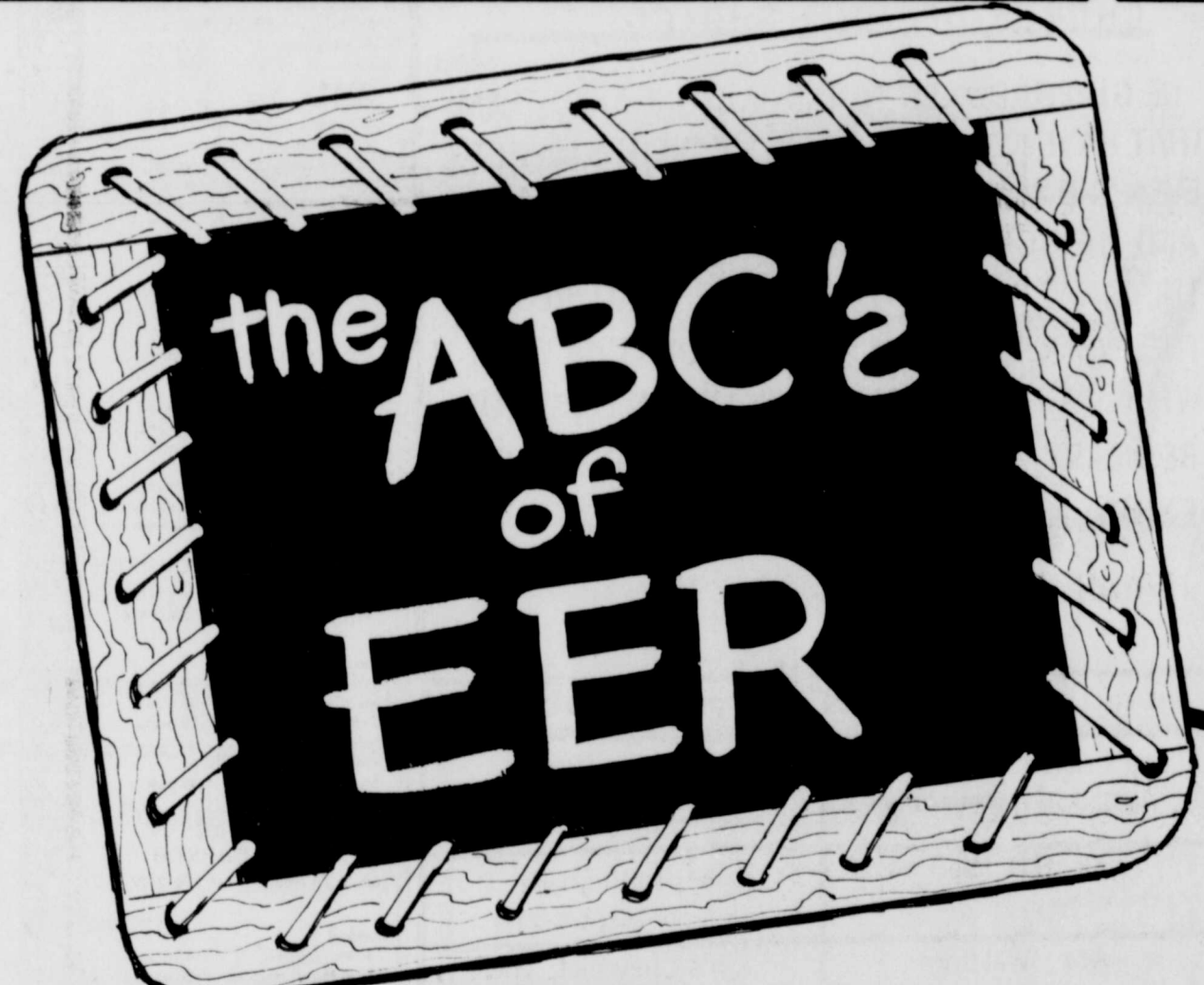

## CATTLE PRODUCERS CAN CALL TOLL-FREE HOTLINE

The Texas Beef Development Taskforce (BDT) has established a toll-free "Hotline" to answer questions about the cattle referendum.

Registration for the long-awaited Referendum is taking place June 6 - 17 at nearly 2,000 county ASCS offices across the nation. Cattle producers who wish to vote must register before the June 17 deadline. Actual voting will take place back at the ASCS offices between July 5 - 15. "Beef producers who have a question about the program can call 1-800-682-4106 weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.," says BDT Chairman J. D. Sartwelle of Sealy.

The Referendum, if approved by two-thirds of the cattle producers voting, would authorize the first nationwide self-help program for the beef industry. Using the value-added system, each cattle producer would contribute 3/10 of 1% (30¢ per \$100) of the value of each animal sold. This rate would raise \$30 million to \$40 million per year for beef research, education and promotion, says Sartwelle.
