Beth Trolinder, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leon Trolinder, represented the Plainview District as Sweetheart, and was runner up for the area.






This is the main fire truck that is used to fight fires in town. It can be augmented

by the rural fire truck and two fire trucks mounted on pickup chassis.




FAST RESPONSE ----Shown above and below are two pickup-type trucks with fire fighting equipment that travel faster than the main trucks and can offer quicker

#### Tax Exempts Are Allowed On Tax-Free Sale A Year AUSTIN --- Comptroller





Using the valueadded system, each cattle producer would contribute 3/10 of 1% (30¢ per \$100) of the value of each animal sold. This rate would raise \$30 million to \$40 million per year for beef research, education and promotion, says Sartwelle.


