NEWS AND COMMENTS

NEC--The race for Commissioner, Precinct 2, Hale County, the boundary of which is between here and Lakeview, will be interesting to watch. Former Homer Roberson, who was in business here a lot of years ago, has entered the race against incumbent Commissioner Lloyd Goldston. Both men are longtime residents of the Petersburg area.

NEC---Precinct 4, the northwest portion of Hale County, has three candidates, including the incumbent Jigger Wheeler. His opponents are a Plainview man and an Edmonson area resident.

NEC---Texas has had all kinds of "Cook-offs" over the years, including the much-publicized World Championship Chili Cook-off at the ghost town of Terlingua in the wilds of the Big Bend Park general area, south of Alpine. Now comes, for the first year, a "Beef Cook-off" to be held in connection with the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association convention starting March 28 in San Antonio. The "Beef Cook-off" will be sponsored by the Cowbells organization of the state. Abernathy area members of the Cowbells are urged to send in information on local participation in this event for a news story in The Review.

NEC--President Carter is haunted by the thought of the State of Pennsylvania, where two Democratic Congressmen are under fire for alleged misdeeds. Mention of that state also could make Ronald Reagan cringe. Someone, during the 1976 Republican primary campaign, talked him into the pre-convention announcement that he would choose a liberal Republican from Pennsylvania as his vice presidential running mate if he was nominated by the convention. That political ploy was Reagan's downfall. His staunch conservation supporters didn't go for that apparent "desperation" move.

NEC----"Carter Friends Linked to Gambling Venture"

says a headline over a wire service (UPI) Washington datelined story. The story alleges that two of Carter's friends had consulted a man with a 40-year criminal record about their investing in an \$85 million Atlantic City gambling casino. Carter has used property of one of the men as his (Carter's) vacation retreat on St. Simons Island, Ga. Both men, the report said, are under consideration for diplomatic post. Also, both men accompanied Carter on a flight of Air Force One to New York City last June to attend a \$1,000-a-plate fund-raising dinner of the Democratic National Committee Politics make strange bedfellows... one who indicated an interest in becoming a foreign missionary and two who are playing footsie with a known criminal.

NEC--On the local business scene: Hoppy Toler is on deals to buy a business building from Morris Stevens at 310 Main St., and the former bank building next door east, 308 Main, from Alice Hix Parsley of Lubbock. 310 Main currently is occupied by Newton Radio & TV and 308 Main currently is Newton's used TV & appliance display and storage. Newton will consolidate the contents of both buildings next door east, 305 Main, in the building were Hoppy's Outlet Store was operated. When all this is done there will be a mall effect, ranging from the west side of Struve Dry Goods to the east side of the building to be occupied by Newton at 306 Main. In addition to the open archway now between Struve Dry Goods and Hoppy's Shop, open archways will lead from Hoppy's east through buildings at 310 and 308 Main. Double doors, that will open during business hours, will connect Newton's Radio & TV clean through to the west side of Struve's Dry Goods. Reports said that Struve's Hardware will occupy the buildings at 310 Main and 308 Main. When all this is done, Abernathy will, in effect, have a mall shopping center. This report is subject to revision. I may have gotten lost somewhere in the moves.

On said date, April 1, 1978, a trustee election will be held in said school district. WHEREAS, it is necessary for this board to pass an order establishing the procedure for filing for and conducting said trustee election; THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF ABERNATHY INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1 That an election be held in said school district on April 1, 1978, for the purpose of electing to the Board of Trustees of said school district two (2) trustees, whose terms will expire in April, 1978.

2 That all requests by candidates to have their names placed upon the ballot for the above mentioned election shall be in writing and signed by the candidate and filed with the secretary of the Board of Trustees at the superintendent's office not later than 5:00 p.m. thirty (30) days prior to the date of said election.

3 That said election shall be held at the following place and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election: At Abernathy City Hall Building in Abernathy, Texas, in said school district, with Leland Phillips, Presiding Judge.

4 Mrs. Otelia Clements is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at Abernathy City Hall within the boundaries of the above named school district and said place of absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official state holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting.

5 The manner of holding said election shall be governed, as near as may be, by the Election Code of this State, and this Board of Trustees will furnish all necessary ballots and other election supplies requisite to said election.

6 The Secretary of this Board of Trustees shall forthwith issue a notice of said election by posting copies of this order at three different places within the boundaries of said school district, which posting shall be done not less than 20 days prior to the date for said election.

(2) A tax collection report that is now 98.61% complete. The enrollment report for January was 1103, which is the same as reported in December. (3) Participation in the school lunch report indicated a slight decline with 589 average daily participation. Transportation expense cost for repair - \$2170 for the wrecked bus (exclusive of body work) and the new bus invoice for \$14,871.
