OVERPASS TO CLOSE ON INTERSTATE 27

LUBBOCK---The State Department of Highways and Public Transportation announces that the contractor on Interstate 27 plans to close the Main Street Overpass in Abernathy, beginning Thursday, May 25, 1978, with the permitting to detour to the Overpass at FM 597 in South Abernathy or the 16th Street Overpass in North Abernathy.

This construction will require the approach slab to be removed and backfilling completed before reopening the overpass to traffic. This work should be completed in two days.

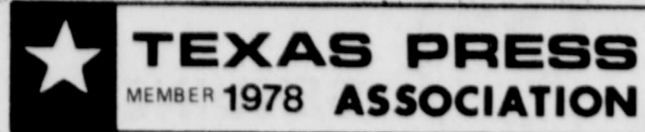

**NEWS AND COMMENTS**

...In "Miss Utah" Pageant NCC-Ronda Marie Cope, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Lavern Cope of Sandy, Utah, a suburb of Salt Lake City, will be a contestant for the title of "Miss Utah" in the four-day round of selection activities June 7 through June 10, at Orem, a suburb of Provo, Utah. I borrowed this photo from her father's billfold Monday when he stopped by the Review office. The photo was taken two years ago, and Ronda doesn't like it, but it was the only one Lavern had. Cope, who is employed by the FAA in the control tower at Salt Lake City International Airport, was en route to an advanced FAA computer school in Oklahoma City. The school ends June 7, and he will miss two days to the "Miss Utah" Contest. Also, he will miss the Junior High School Graduation program June 7, when their son, Gregory, receives his diploma. Lavern visited his brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Lynn Cope, in Ralls en route to Oklahoma City. Lynn, Lavern and their sister, Mrs. Frank Gosney of La-Puente, Calif., are former Abernathians, the children of the late Mr. and Mrs. A. Cope, who were early day residents here. Mrs. Gosney is going to Utah to see her niece in the "Miss Utah" Pageant. Lavern Cope had the nickname "Dopey" when he lived here. He was always tinkering with things electronic-related. This "tinkering" recently won for him an Achievement Award and a \$1,000 in cash in connection with his FAA work. He described to me what the award was for, but I'm not smart enough to completely understand. It seems that he designed and built a suitcase-size control unit that could be used to perform some of the functions of a control tower. The portable control unit could be used away from the main control tower under

certain emergency conditions. He also built these units for some major airports in the West and Northwest. He recently built an improved unit to replace the original one he constructed for use at Salt Lake City International Airport. This was the one that earned for him the FAA Achievement Award. Lavern Cope was shown briefly in the movie "Airport '75" which recently appeared on a TV rerun on a Lubbock station. Each time that movie runs, Lavern gets a \$100 residual check from the movie maker. In connection with his work, Cope has been in contact with former Abernathian Charles Bucks, a Continental Airlines vice president stationed at the company headquarters in Los Angeles. Also, he was in contact with his former mile-apart neighbor, Henry Clay von Struve, Jr., when Struve was in Pasadena, Calif., on the Viking Mars mission a few years ago. They were living on farms southeast of Abernathy at the time they were neighbors. Henry Clay, whose permanent home is in Littleton, Colo., is the son of Mrs. Dot Struve of Abernathy.

NCC--Noticed on a black Ford pickup parked in front of Red Attebury's Farm Store in New Deal three football stickers covering the full range of the game from high school to pro. On the bumper was a New Deal Lions sticker; on the left side of the cab's back window was a Texas Tech University sticker, and on the right side was a Dallas Cowboy sticker.

NCC--Noticed in the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal that Robert Sokoll, who was Abernathy's City Manager before going to Levelland in that capacity several years ago, now has taken the City Manager post at Paris, Texas, population 23,214. Levelland is 11,914. (Population figures from the 1978-1979 Texas Almanac.)

NCC--The news media now has two new bedfellows, attorneys and doctors. President Carter doesn't like the news fraternity, either.

**August 1 Deadline For Booster Club Scholarship**

It is time for the Antelope Booster Club to take applications to select a recipient of the Fall (1978) semester scholarship General Provisions for receiving the scholarship are as follows.

(1) The recipient shall be of good moral character and shall obey laws.  
 (2) Recipient must be a full-time student (registered for a minimum of 12 semester hours) in an accredited college or university.  
 (3) Recipient shall show qualities of academic proficiency in keeping with college education requirements.

(4) It shall be the responsibility of the recipient to request that copies of his or her grades be sent from the office of the registrar to the President of the Abernathy Boosters Club. Such information shall be passed on to the Scholarship Committee.

(5) Each approved scholarship recipient shall submit a transcript to the Scholarship Selection Committee by August 1. (for recipients desiring consideration for the fall semester) and/or December 1 (for recipients desiring consideration for spring semester.)  
 (7) Consideration for scholarship and scholarships awarded shall be based upon need.

(8) Recipient must have previously completed three (3) semesters of approved college or university work satisfactory before a scholarship can be awarded.

Those having made application previously must update their form with additional grades and other information necessary.

Congressman George Mahon received word today from the Community Service Administration of a Local Initiative Grant in the amount of \$67,703.00 to the Central Plains Community Action Program, Inc. The executive director is Mr. Robert Barnett.

The effective date is May 1, 1978. It will run for 12 months. The funds will provide for the operation of four neighborhood centers at Plainview, Abernathy, Hale Center, and Petersburg assisting disadvantaged people in such areas as health, education, jobs, and housing.

Hickey died Saturday in a Fort Worth hospital after suffering an apparent heart attack.

Hickey, vice-president of Tarrant Savings Association, was president of the Texas Christian University Alumni Association and a past president of the TCU Frog Club. He was treasurer of Ridotto Dance Club, secretary and treasurer of Moslah Temple Shrine Patrol, chairman of the American Heart Association, and a member of Moslah Temple Shrine.

He had moved to Fort Worth in 1942, where he was a member of University Christian Church and Hemphill Heights Masonic Lodge. Survivors include his wife, Marjelen, formerly of Abernathy; a son, David Fort Worth; and a daughter, Melinda of Fort Worth, both of the home; and his mother, Mrs. Virgil Hickey of Fort Worth.
