**BEEF CATTLE PRICE OUTLOOK**

---Beef cattle prices have dropped the past several weeks due to the consumer resistance to high retail beef prices, weakness in the commodity futures market, increases in beef supplies, and the psychological effect of the government's announcement of increased allowable beef imports for the year. A livestock marketing specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service foresees limited recovery in beef cattle prices during the third quarter of the year due to high meat supplies. However, prices should improve during the fourth quarter as the supply situation improves.

**4-H'ers To Compete At Trap, Skeet Shoot**

4-H youth from throughout Texas are expected to compete in the State 4-H Trap and Skeet Shoot, Aug. 11-12, at the National Gun Club at San Antonio. There will be both junior and senior competition on an individual and team basis. 4-H'ers may compete in trap or skeet shooting or both. There will also be a fun shoot for 4-H adult leaders, notes a fisheries specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

**EGG PLANT CASSEROLE**

3/4 cup thinly sliced onion  
1 small clove garlic  
1/3 cup olive oil  
3 green peppers, sliced in thin strips  
3 cups peeled, seeded and diced eggplant  
2 1/2 cups fresh tomatoes, peeled and seeded and diced  
salt and pepper

Saute onion and garlic in olive oil until brown (barley) remove and combine in layers in a casserole with other ingredients, adding salt and pepper, to each layer.
