Sherri, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dene Bridges, is a junior. She started her band career playing flute but qualified for the percussion section. She was in the Antelope Band Color Guard two years and was a member of a drum ensemble which won a First Division in UIL competition her freshman year.

This is her first year to be a twirler but in UIL competition she won a second division rating last year and a first division rating this year which qualified her for state competition. She studied twirling one year with Jan Henson and Kym Thompson.

She has been in Future Homemakers of America two years and was recently elected FHA historian for the coming school year.

Sherri also sings and for five or six years was in The Singing Disciples, a child group which performed and recorded religious music. She sang at the Lubbock Arts Festival at Lubbock Civic Center this past spring.

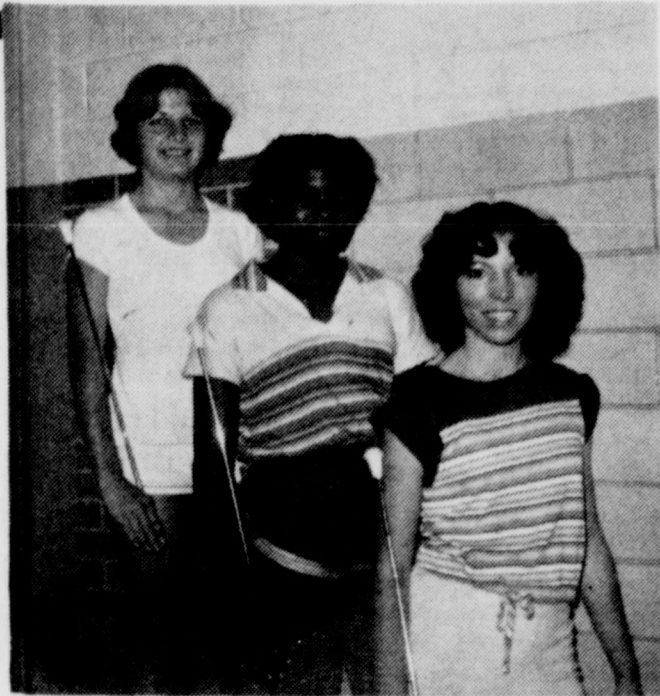

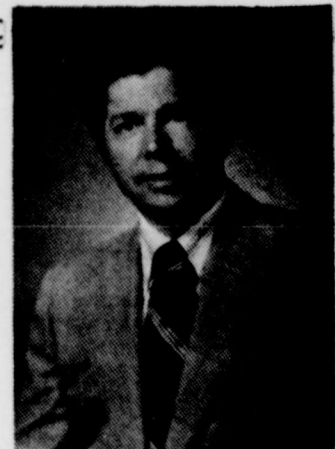

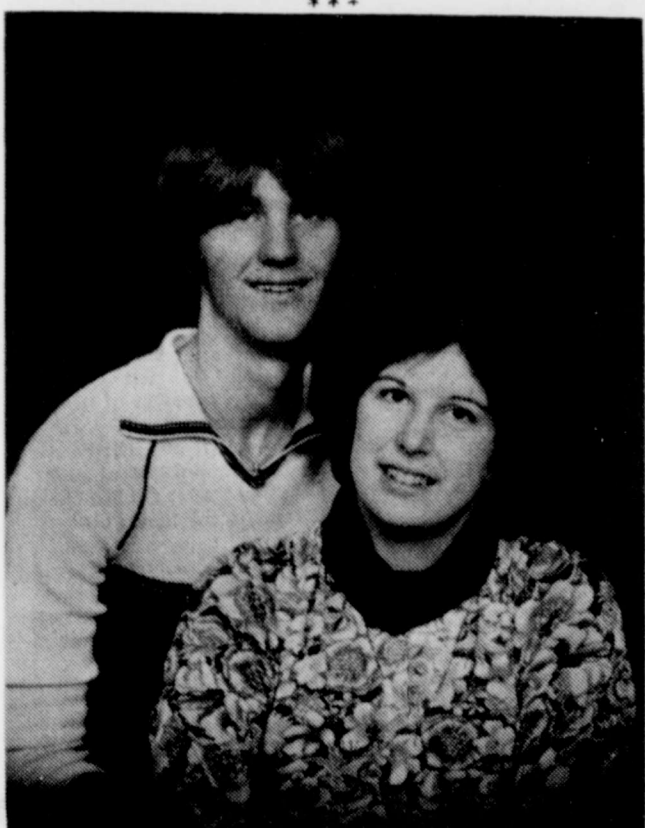

Mrs. Reeder was a former teacher in Abernathy School System.

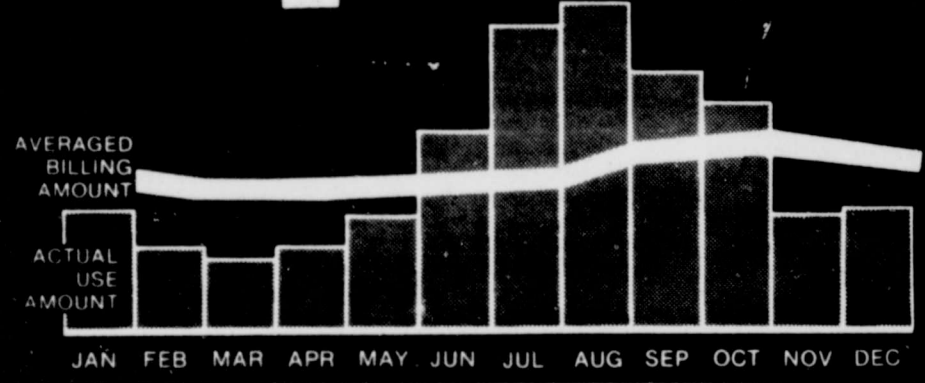
Mrs. Harkey's Sister Dies

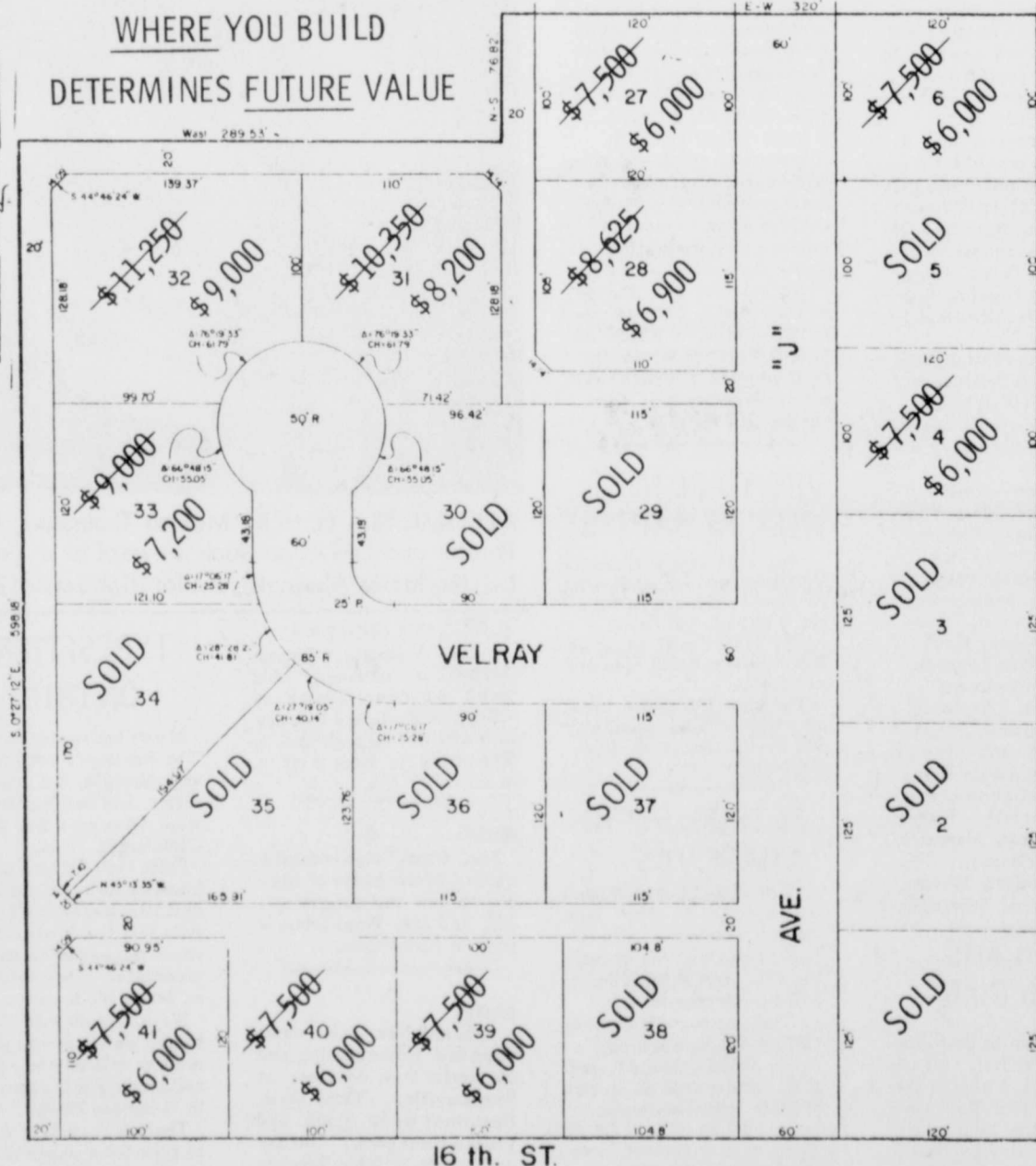
