The board passed a resolution urging the Southwest Conference to reject sponsorship of conference athletic events by the alcoholic beverage industry. More than 150 schools were asked to pass similar resolutions.

Dr. Webb said the movement started in the Dallas area with people responsible for high school athletics who think it's a bad idea to let college sports be so closely identified with alcoholic beverages as are professional sports.

The brewing industry has sponsored Southwest Conference sports events on TV for two years. Before that, the contests were sponsored by Exxon and an insurance corporation.

The text of the resolution follows.

RESOLUTION
 BE IT RESOLVED, That the Abernathy School Board of Trustees go on record this 7th day of January, 1980, as being unalterably opposed to the sponsorship of Southwest Athletic Conference events by the alcohol beverage interests. It is further resolved that the Abernathy School Board of Trustees do all within their power, as an organization and as individuals, to protect the public school student in general, and the public school athlete in particular, from the glamorization of the drug alcohol by means of amateur athletics.

AND FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED, Because of the urgency of the problem, individual members of the Abernathy School Board of Trustees will attempt to place this matter on the agenda of the next regular meeting of organizations interested in the welfare of children and youth.

N&C-A West Coast firm that specializes in restoring old hotels has bought the 1912-constructed Adolphus Hotel at Commerce and Akard in downtown Dallas. It will close down Feb. 3. When the Adolphus reopens in 1981 it will be a "super-luxury" hotel according to the new owners. Now with 770 rooms, the completely renovated and remodeled Adolphus will have 550 large rooms. The new owners plan to restore the facade of the original building that St. Louis brewer Adolphus Busch constructed in 1912. Additions made in 1916 and 1952 to the original hotel "cloud the beauty" of Busch's French-renaissance-style structure. With this turn of events, the Adolphus will fare better than its neighbor, The Baker Hotel, on the south side of Commerce and east side of Akard. The Baker will be demolished to make way for a new office building.
