Lions Treated To Pilot Training Presentation

(By Jacquelyn Smyers) Abernathy Lions got a look at the pilot training program at Reese Air Force Base January 29, courtesy of guest speaker Lieutenant Colonel Donald W. Neff. Col. Neff, 39, is the Operations Officer, 54th Flying Training Squadron, 64th Flying Training Wing at Reese

He treated the Lions to a slide presentation showing 'rainees' daily life at Reese from 4:30 AM to 9 PM and the planes they fly. He also pointed out that the young men spend three times as much time on academic study as on flying.

He is a graduate of the U.S Air Force Academy, Class of '63 and, has a Bachelor of Science degree in Engineering Administration. He received pilot training at Vance AFB, Oklahoma, then remained at Vance as a T-38 instructor pilot until 1968. He underwent F- 100 training at Luke AFB, Arizona before going to Southeast Asia as a F-100 pilot at Phan Rang Air Base and Offensive Duty Officer at Tan Son Nhut Air Base.

In 1970, he returned to the Air Force Academy as Air Officer, commanding until 1972. He then entered Southern Methodist University in Dallas and earned his Masters in Engineering Administration in 1973. He was the F-111 Systems Program Officer at Wright Patterson AFB, Ohio until 1975 and in 1976 became the Program Manager, Avipport,F- 16 program at Wright Patterson.In 1977 he attended the Armed Forces Staff College in Norfolk.Virginia and arrived at Reese AFB as a T-38 Instructor pilot in July, 1977. HS Seniors To Rural Routes Visit W. T. S. U. Not So Easy

Rural mail carriers expect to deal with more than their share of snow and leet and freezing rain. but OIC Lonnie Awtrey today reminded customers in the Abernathy area that his carriers will need some assistance during winter

Rural (and highway contract route) carriers will make every reasonable effort to serve as many customers as possible during severe winter weather, but OIC Awtrey said carriers are not expected to leave their vehicles and provide service on foot when roads, entire blocks, or other large portions of their routes are impassable.

"Rural (and contract carriers) are expected to leave their vehicles to serve Council members temporarily blocked individual boxes where there is no risk of personal injury or unusual physical exertion." Awtrey said, "but not when access to several mailboxes along a continuous segment of a route is blocked. Awtrey said his office

keeps in close contact with traffic and weather advisories to determine if delivery should be suspended particular day, and with highway department officials to make sure public roads are passable and in good repair. We need everyone's ooperation in keeping approaches to boxes clear of snow and any other obstuc-'ions." Awtrey said." so we can avoid cutting anyone's maildelivery even temporarily.



The Abernathy Post Office is using the Susan B. Anthony dollar coin when window clerks are making change, OIC Lonnie Awtrey announced today.

Nationaliy, the Postal Service is supporting the efforts of the Treasury Department, the postmaster said, because "widespread use of these dollar coins could be of great benefit to both our window clerks as well as our customers. They are easier to handle at the counter, and they can be mechanically sorted and counted.

We will use the dollar coin in making change, unless a customer prefers not to accept them," the postmaster said.

The Susan B. Anthony dollar coin, introduced last July, was designed to be convenient and easy to handle in cash transactions. Over 600 million of the new dollars were produced in Fiscal Year 1979 by the Bureau of the Mint. Approximately 300 million have been released to Federal Reserve banks for distribution to commercial banks.







AUSTIN-The surge of condominium construction and conversion of apartment units into condominium units across the nation has raised many questions in the minds of potential buyers. Although Texas has a

statute entitled The Condominium Act on its books, it was enacted in 1963, well before the condominium "craze" began. Because the statute is 16 years old and because of the unanswered questions, I have asked the House Committee on Business and Industry to study the existing statutes and regulations pertaining to condominium housing. The study is to compare such Texas provisions with laws in other states to determine the need for revision. In addition, the committee is to consider the need for building standards for condominium housing and other related matters. A condominium unit may be a high-rise apartment, a

townhouse or a row of attached houses. Each unit is part of a larger, jointly owned property. Thus, the condominium buyer purchases two kinds of property. First, he buys an individual dwelling unit to which he has sole title. Second, he owns joint title to the land upon which his unit rests as well as parts of the condominium intended for the use of all the owners, such as the parking
