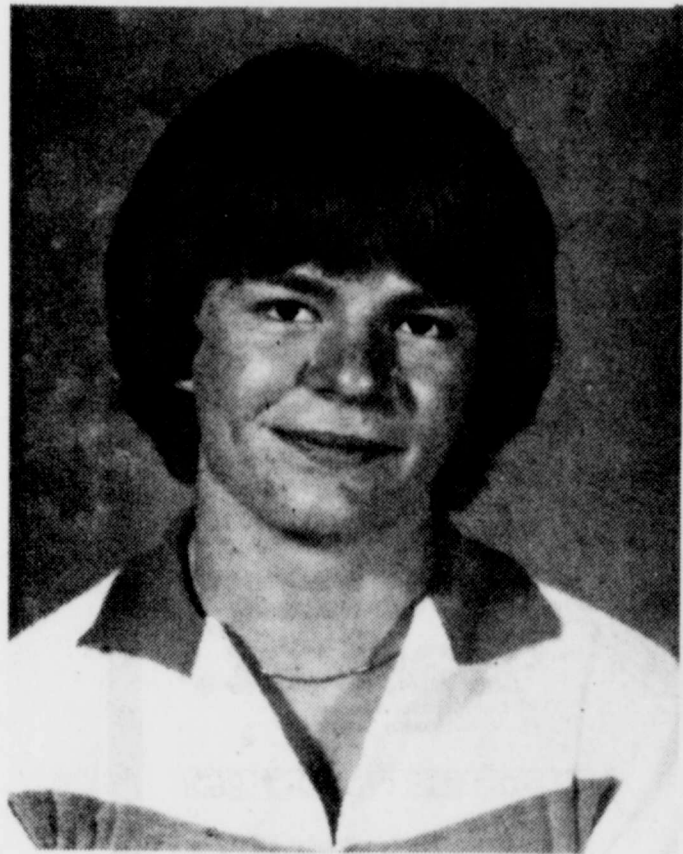
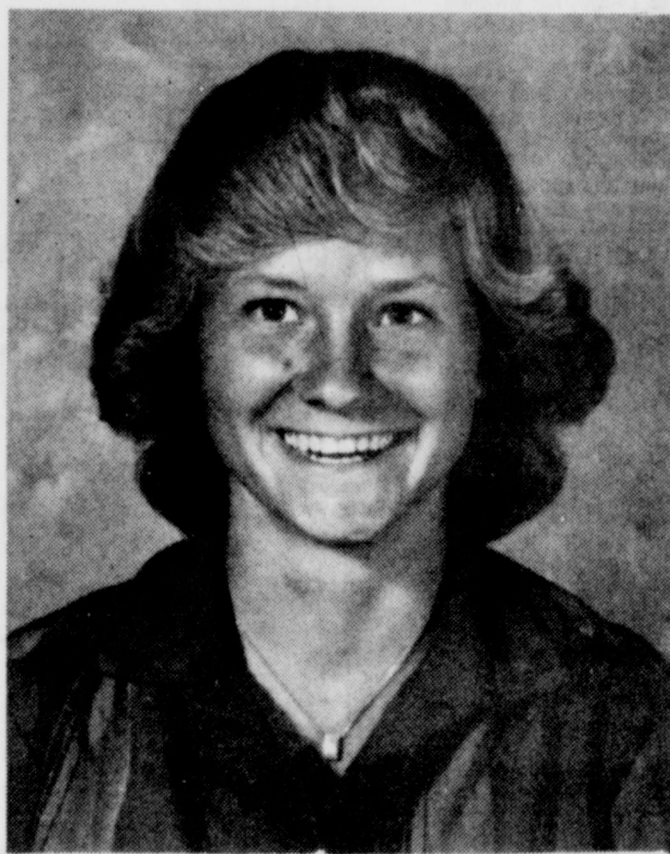




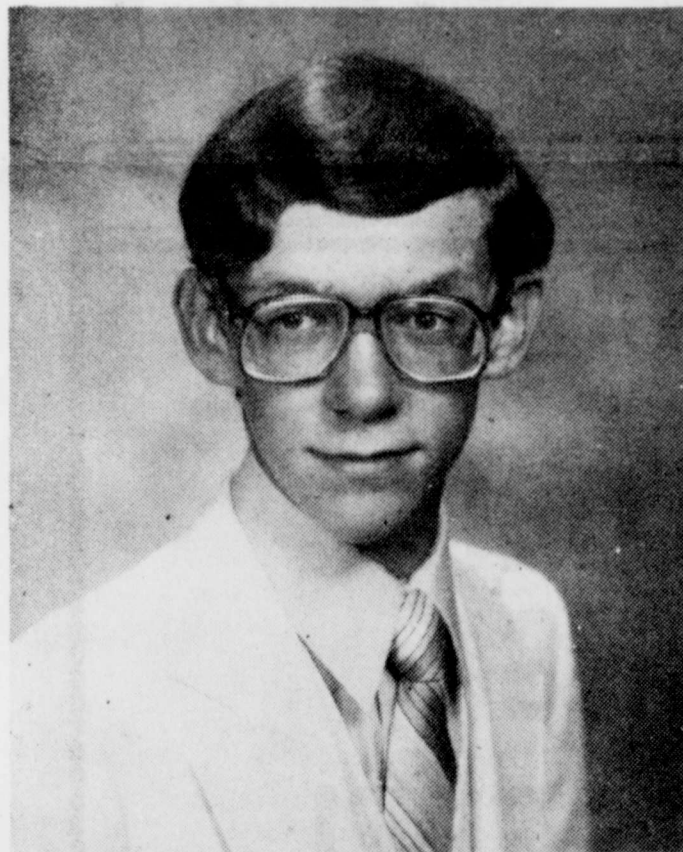

Austin is becoming a familiar place to Abernathy youth as more and more students are participating in contests at the state level.

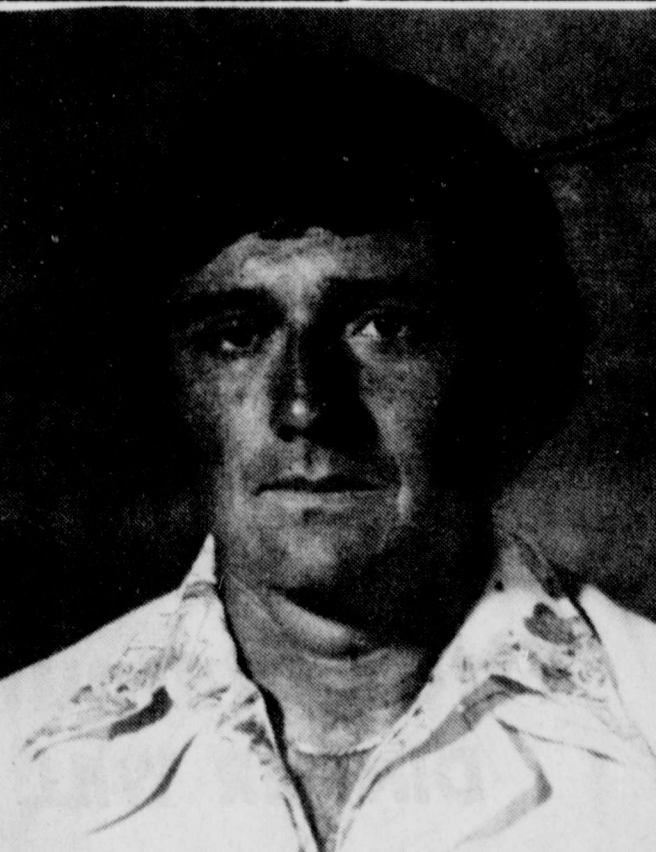

Democratic Primary Election May 3

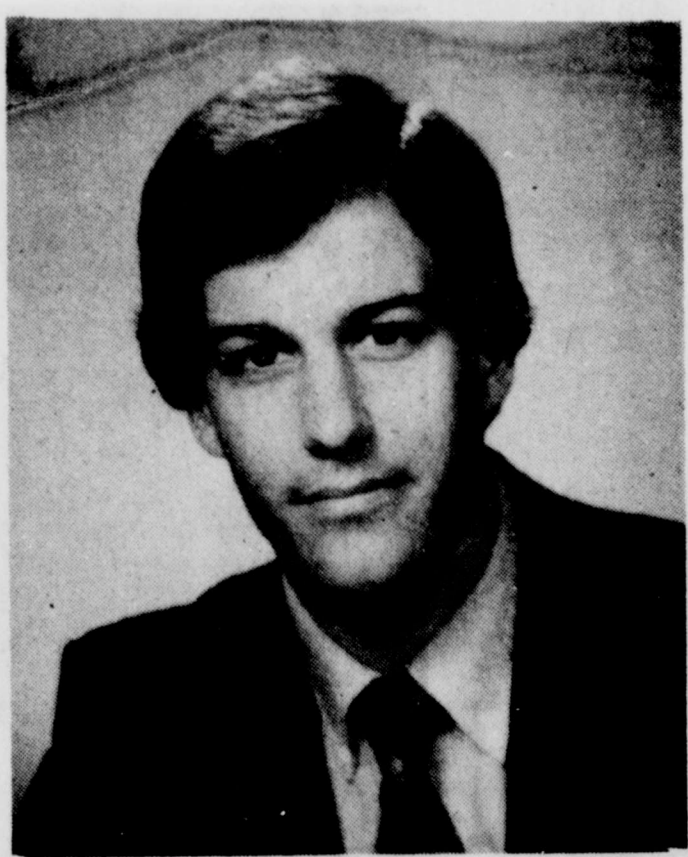

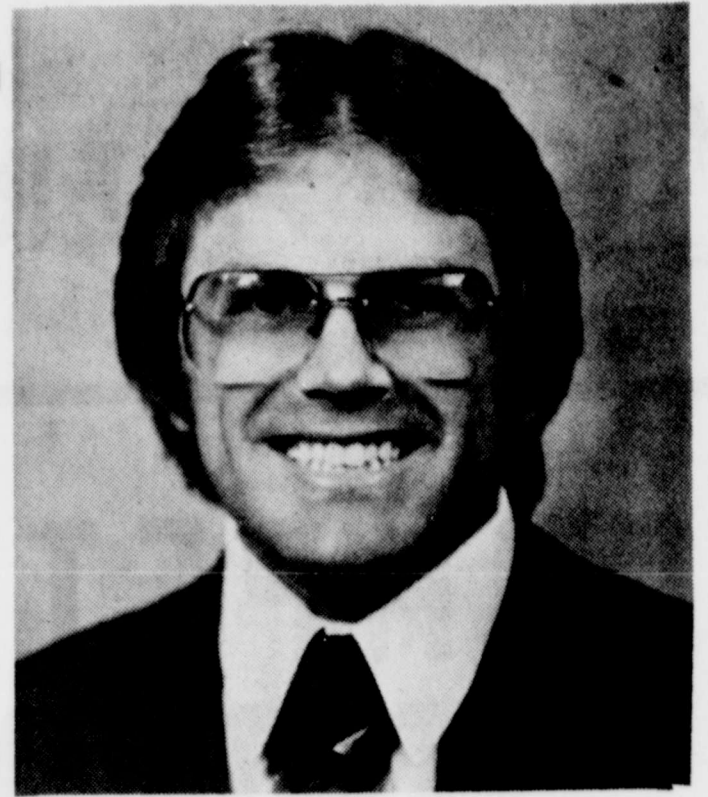
The Rogers moved to Abernathy in 1938 and have served the Nazarene Church since that time.

Great Society Has Meeting

The Great Society Extension Homemakers Association met for their regular meeting, April 14 at the Neighborhood Center. Wynon Mayes, County Extension Agent and Carolyn Moore, Assistant Representative Heart Association brought the program.

Carolyn Moore showed the latest film furnished by the heart association which proved to be very good. She reminded the group in her moments that coronary heart disease has reached epidemic proportions. One person out of two will die of heart attack. One out of five adult men has a heart attack by age 60. Number of people who died of heart disease last year was equal to the amount of people who reside in Dallas at the present.

Carolyn reminded the group that cholesterol and triglycerides both circulate in the blood, but if the amount of these lipids become excessive they contribute to a build up in the walls of the arteries.

Tri glycerides build up is caused by over eating, too much alcohol and often too much sugar. Cholesterol in the American diet is principally by animal products. She gave each woman a diet plan for keeping fit. Much stress is being put on preventative medicine due to the high cost of medical treatment.

ORDINANCE NO. 251 AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY OF ABERNATHY, TEXAS, DEFINING TERMS USED IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL FRONT YARD REQUIREMENTS, REAR YARD REQUIREMENTS AND SIDE YARD REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR A MAXIMUM RESIDENTIAL LOT COVERAGE PROVISION; PROVIDING FOR A MINIMUM LOT WIDTH AND LOT AREA PROVISION FOR RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT LOTS; PROVIDING A MINIMUM OFF STREET PARKING PROVISION FOR SINGLE FAMILY DWELLINGS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the changes indicated herein below would be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Abernathy; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF ABERNATHY

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this Ordinance:

ACCESSORY: A secondary use or building customary incidental to and located on the same lot with the main use or building, and which is reasonable, necessary and incidental to the primary use of the main building.

ADJACENT: Shall mean next to or closest to but shall not necessarily mean touching.

ALLEY: A public way which extends only secondary means of access to abutting property.

BUILDING ACCESSORY: A detached secondary building arranged and designed for a use which is clearly incidental to that of the main building. A trailer or mobile home shall never be construed to be within this definition.

BUILDING LINE, FRONT: A line located a minimum horizontal distance from a front lot line and parallel thereto, over which no part of a building shall extend, unless otherwise permitted in this Ordinance.

BUILDING LINE, SIDE: A line located a minimum horizontal distance from a side lot line, if any, and parallel thereto, over which no part of a building shall extend, unless otherwise permitted in this Ordinance.

BUILDING FRONT OF: The side of a building most nearly parallel with and adjacent to the front of the lot on which it is located.

DEVELOPMENT LOT: A parcel, or abutting parcels of land that have definite boundaries, which is improved as a single unit of use.

FRONT LOT LINE RESIDENTIAL: All lot lines contiguous with a street or avenue and which do not terminate or intersect with an alley shall be front lot lines. If all lot lines contiguous with a street terminate or intersect with an alley,

the front lot line shall be the shortest lot line contiguous with a street. Every lot must have at least one front lot line.

LOT AREA: The total horizontal area within the lot lines of a lot.

LOT LINES: The lines designated on a recorded plat as being the boundaries of a lot.

LOT WIDTH: It shall be equal to the length of the shortest front lot line.

OFF STREET PARKING SPACE: An area for the temporary storage on one (1) automobile which shall be permanently reserved for such purposes and which shall not be within or on any public street, alley or other right of way.

The parking space shall have a permanent all weather surface. An unimproved, un surfaced front yard, side yard shall never be construed to be within this definition.

REAR LOT LINE: Any lot line contiguous to an alley.

SIDE LOT LINE: Any lot line not a front or rear lot line.

YARD: An open space between a building or group of buildings and the nearest lot line.

YARD, FRONT: That yard between the front building line and the front lot line.

YARD, REAR: That yard between the rear building line and the rear lot line.

YARD, SIDE: That yard between the side building line and the side lot line.

SECTION 2. YARD REQUIREMENTS

A. FRONT YARD. The minimum front yard for all single family residential property shall be twenty-five (25) feet measured from the front lot line, or the front yard shall conform to existing buildings on the block.

Lots which front on cul-de-sac streets and which are contiguous to lots which do not front on cul-de-sac streets shall have their front yard measured from where they would normally be measured if the street did not terminate in a cul-de-sac but continued on its course. All other lots which front onto cul-de-sac streets shall have their front yard set back the same distance from the sidewalk or curb as established for those lots which front on cul-de-sac streets and which are contiguous to lots which do not front onto cul-de-sac streets.

In no event, however, shall any residence have less than a fifteen (15) foot front yard set back and in no event shall a residential garage or carport have less than a fifteen (15) foot set back.

B. REAR YARD. The minimum rear yard shall be fifteen (15) feet except that a one (1) story wing or extension may be built to within five (5) feet of the rear lot line. Storage buildings may also be built to within five (5) feet of the rear lot line.

C. SIDE YARD. There shall be a minimum side yard of five (5) feet on each side of any structure, except that on corner lots the minimum side yard adjacent to the street shall be ten (10) feet. Provided further that in no case shall a garage or carport fronting onto a street be within fifteen (15) feet of the street property line.

SECTION 3. LOT COVERAGE

The combined area of all buildings shall not exceed forty-five (45) percent of the total lot area; except that porches and permitted accessory buildings may cover an additional five (5) percent.

SECTION 4. MINIMUM LOT WIDTH AND LOT AREA FOR DEVELOPMENT PURPOSES

LOT WIDTH. The minimum width of any development lot for a single family residence shall be fifty (50) feet.

LOT AREA. The minimum area of any development lot for a single family residence shall be five thousand (5,000) square feet.

SECTION 5. OFF STREET PARKING REQUIRED FOR SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENCES

The minimum number of off street parking spaces required for single family dwellings shall be two (2) spaces.

SECTION 6. PENALTY CLAUSE

The City of Abernathy shall not furnish utilities or City services to any person (2) failing to comply with the provisions of this Ordinance. This penalty clause shall apply only to buildings constructed and/or moved into the City five (5) days or thereafter passage and publication of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. SAVINGS CLAUSE
