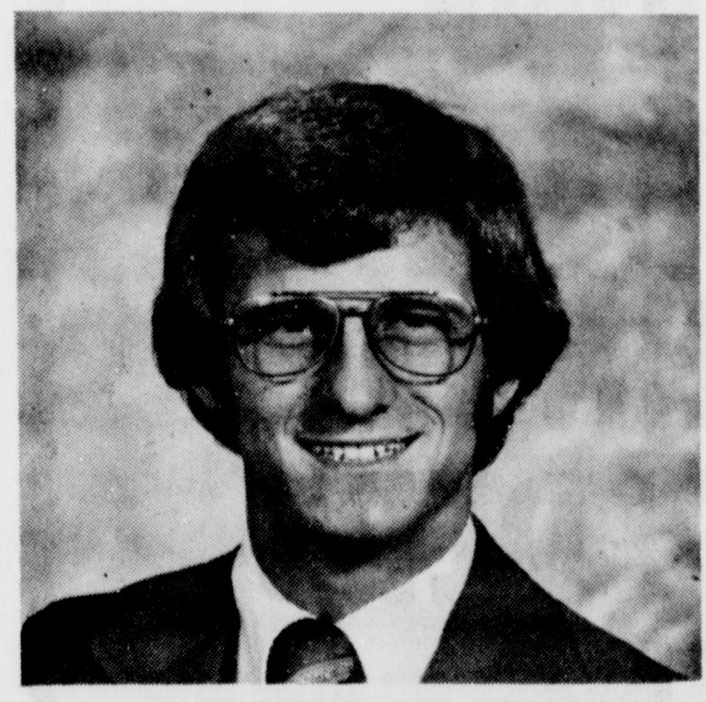

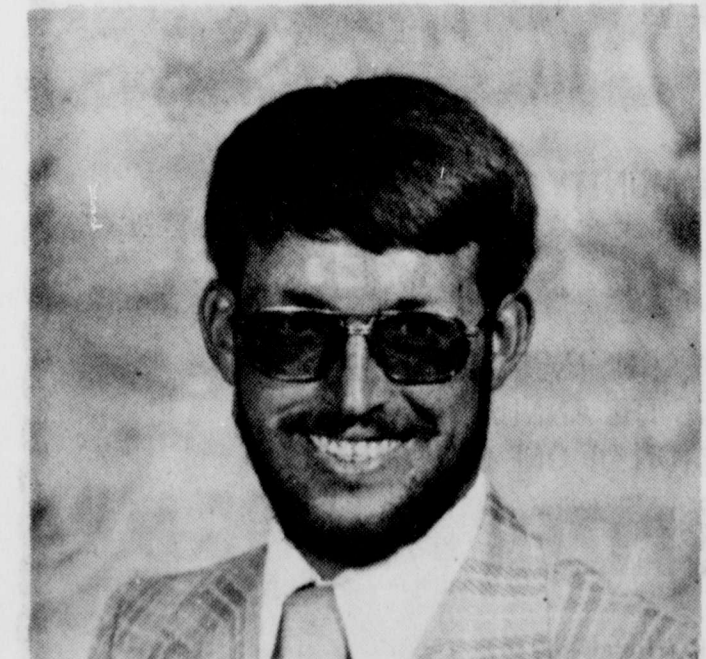

We went out to Cedar Creek Lake to Milton's brother's place, southeast of Dallas, where the men fished a few days. We stopped in downtown Dallas and made a tour of the beautifully landscaped and constructed area of the Thanksgiving Square set aside for quiet moments. The purpose of the square is to create "an international shrine to the spirit

of Thanksgiving". The square is surrounded by a 4 foot wall. After entering the gate you descend 15 ft. below the street level to the main part of the plaza, the meditation garden. In this area you find a 110 foot reflecting pool and three waterfalls that help muffle street noises from above. We stopped to rest beside the rush of sparkling water universally a symbol of vitality, cleansing and purification. There is a 40 foot bell tower. Daily the bells of Thanksgiving ring out the importance of gratitude in our lives. The bells are heard during the noon hour weekdays and each half hour on weekends. We were there on Saturday, the bells rang beautifully every 30 minutes. The focus of the square is a 90 foot high spiral "Chapel of Thanks", whose exterior masks the beauty of the stained glass structure in the project it is said to be the first spiral structure of its kind to be built in more than 1,200 years. The chapel is a place of quiet reverence for all people, and expresses our highest religious hopes. The chapel will hold 80 people. It is used for private meditation and one day a week there is reading from the scripture during the noon hour. The stained glass ceiling draws attention upward as the "heavens declare the

glory of God". No activity is more important than a quiet time. The Exhibition Room proclaims three truths of gratitude: "We love God, God loves us, We serve God singing". Gratitude is the purest moral energy we have. Thanksgiving Square is a lovely oasis of the spirit a testimony to the grace of gratitude for all that we have received and all that we have to give. It is a place you do not want to miss in downtown Dallas. It was opened in May, 1977. I had wanted to go there ever since I read about it. "O Father may the flame of Thanksgiving never go out in the altar of our lives."

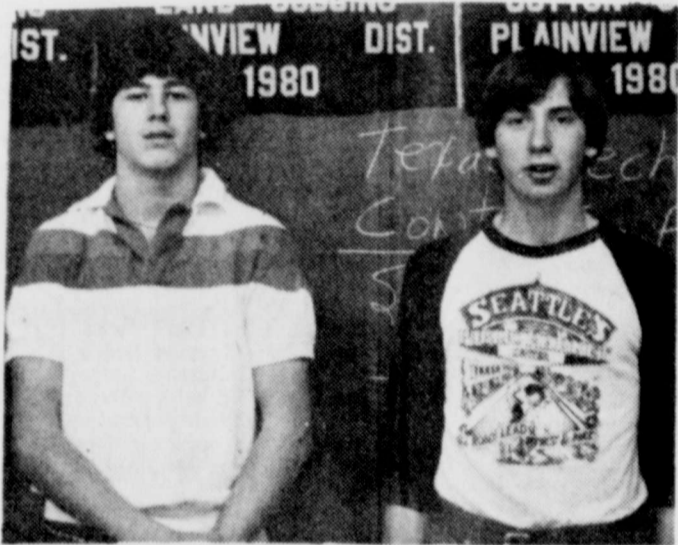

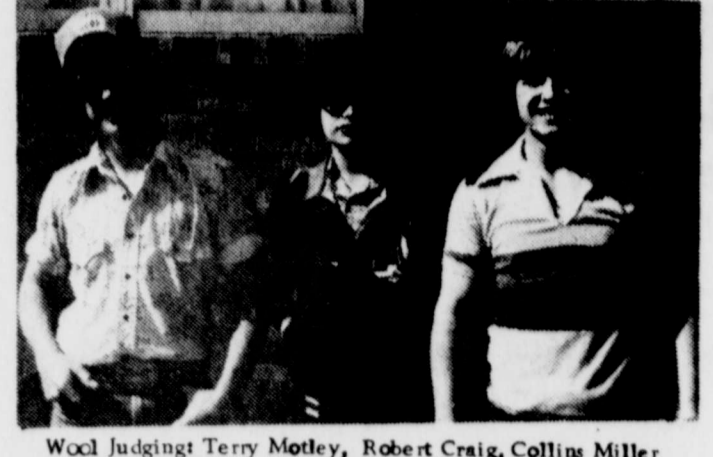
The Wool Team was 1st in district, 3rd in the area. There is no state competition in wool judging.



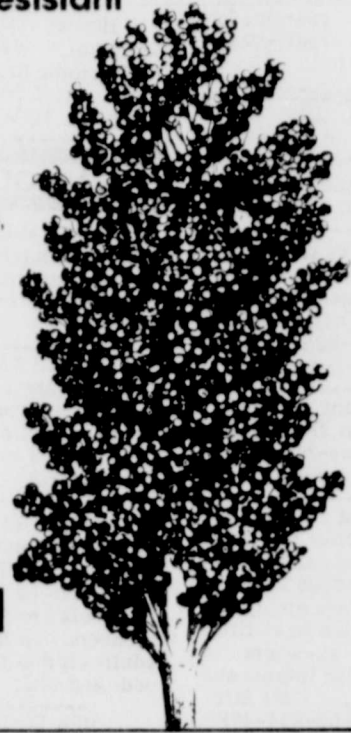
