The time of 3:23, run under sunny, humid skies on the black cinder track at the University proved to be the 3rd fastest time in the nation that year. First went to Baytown's national record setters (time 3:17); second to Fort Worth's North Side, Abernathy's 3rd in the nation was the South Plains greatest quartet in history at that time. Although Abernathy is comparatively small school, no other state in the nation produced a high school mile relay team any better than Coach Royal James's foursome of Roy "Sonny" Sons,

 Her weavings are decorative wall hangings made from various wool yarns coming from such countries as New Zealand, Belgium, Uruguay and Ireland. She leans toward the earth colors in her work, but has recently completed some pieces in blue tones. Regie enjoys using accessories such as feathers, bells, and driftwood to enhance her designs.  
 Regie builds her own frames for her hangings out of redwood. She has even used a bicycle wheel for a frame.  
 Regie became interested in weaving two years ago when she attended a weaving course at the

Ranching Heritage Center at the Museum at Texas Tech. During her studies, she learned how to buy a fleece and dye it using natural vegetables dyes. Learning to card the wool, hand spinning the wool and transferring the yarn to a loom was also a feature of her course.  
 Influential to Regie's interest in weaving is Romero Reyna of Lubbock. Mr. Reyna designed the weaving presently hanging at the Lubbock Civic Center.  
 Regie has given talks to hobby clubs and a sorority. She is a lifetime resident of Abernathy and is married to Johnny Knight. They have two sons, Jared and Jeremy.  
 Regie stresses that weaving began for her as just another hobby, but soon became a possible career choice.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES, OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES, OR AMENDMENTS THERE-TO, THAT CONFLICT WITH THE TERMS OR CONDITIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE AND ENACTING IN LIEU THEREOF A NEW ORDINANCE REGULATING PLUMBING WORK IN THE CITY OF ABERNATHY TEXAS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN EXEMPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE AND THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND ESTABLISHING CERTAIN FEES; PROVIDING FOR SPECIFICATIONS, MATERIALS AND METHODS OF PLUMBING INSTALLATIONS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Abernathy:

**CHAPTER 1**

**TITLE CITED**

1. This ordinance shall be known as the Plumbing Ordinance of the City of Abernathy, and may be cited as such.

It shall be unlawful for any person, association of persons, co-partnership or corporation to engage in the business of plumbing, or do or perform any plumbing as defined in this ordinance, without first having procured the necessary licenses and permits as hereinafter provided for, and all plumbing, plumbing work and workmanship and materials shall meet the requirements of this ordinance and shall pass all inspections required in this ordinance in regard to the work done.

**2. PENALTIES**

Any person, either by himself or agent, and any firm, corporation or other entity who violates any of the provisions of this Code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction of any such violation, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00), and each day during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense. In any case of a violation of any of the terms of provisions of this ordinance by any corporation, the officers and agents actively in charge of the business of such corporation shall be subject to the penalty herein provided. Any offense defined herein which has been defined by laws of the State of Texas as an offense and for which penalty has been prescribed shall be punished as provided in said State Law, and nothing herein shall be held as fixing any penalty contrary to a penalty provided by the laws of the State of Texas.

**3. FORM OF COMPLAINTS**

In any prosecution hereunder, it shall not be necessary for the complaint to negative any exceptions contained in this Code concerning any prohibited act, but any such exception may be urged as a defense by any person charged by such complaint.

**4. RESPONSIBILITY FOR EFFECTS UNCHANGED**

This Code does not relieve from or lessen the responsibility or liability of any person owning, operating, controlling, or installing any plumbing, gas piping or gas-fired appliances, for damages to person or property caused by any defect therein, nor shall the City be regarded as assuming any such liability by reason of the inspection authorized herein or certificate of approval issued as herein provided.

**5. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE**

If any provision of this Code, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is held invalid, the remainder of the Code, and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected thereby.

**6. REPEALING CLAUSE**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

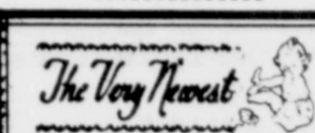

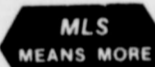
