1 This ordinance shall be known as the Plumbing Ordinance of the City of Abernathy, and may be cited as such.

It shall be unlawful for any person, association of persons, co-partnership or corporation to engage in the business of plumbing, or do r perform any plumbing as defined in this ordinance, without first having procured the necessary licenses and permits as hereinafter provided for, and all plumbing plumbing work and workmanship and materials shall meet the requirements of this ordinance and shall pass all inspections required in this ordinance in regard to

the work done.

Any person, either by himself or agent, and any firm, corporation or other entity who violates any of the provisions of this Code shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, conviction of any violation, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS and each day (\$100.00): during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense. In any case of a violation of any of the terms of provisions of this ordinance by any corporation, the officers and agents actively in charge of the business of such corpora-tion shall be subject to the penalty herein provided. Any ffense defined herein which has been defined by laws of the State of Texas as an offense and for which penalty has been prescribed shall be punished as provided in said State Law, and nothing herein shall be held as fixing any
